Last weekend was our biggest weekend for attendance thus far. We had 430 attending Mass, as well as hundreds viewing live stream. The Saturday Mass 111, 8 am Mass, 149 and the 10:30 Mass, 170. Of course, we are reminded that receiving the Eucharist is of fundamental importance.

Daily Mass is now offered two mornings per week on Monday and Wednesday at 8:30 AM. Masks must be worn.

The Church is open daily Monday – Thursday 8am-2pm. Office hours are Monday –Friday 9-4. There is also a safe and secure drop off box (brown) located on the outside of the office. You may use that to drop off any notes or your budget if you wish.

Our Masses are Saturday 4 pm and Sunday at 8am and 10:30am. Masks must be worn during Mass. Communion will be at the end of Mass. After you receive Communion, you should exit the church. Live streaming of Mass is on Sunday at 10:30 through our website at www.stgregorychurchri.com
