Pastor's Report

September 25, 2019

Collaboration:

- Alpha is set to begin the coming weeks. While enrollment is down, the groups will be meeting starting September 24th at QOA
- Both Al McCauley will be participating in an Alpha Conference scheduled for October 7 10.
 We are hoping to gain some insights on Alpha 2.0 and how we can keep the momentum going
- I received a phone call from Fr. Joe Jagodensky, the Temporary Administrator at QOA. We will be meeting on September 26th to discuss the current state of affairs at QOA and possible ways that we can re-ignite our collaborative efforts. Stay tuned...

Staffing:

- After 11 years of service as our IT person for both the school and parish, Susan Barnhart has
 retired from St. Anthony's. A luncheon was held in her honor where we presented her with a
 check and painting of St. Anthony from the parish. We also celebrated her birthday! While we
 will miss her, we wish Susan nothing but happiness and health in her retirement years!
- We continue to work closely with our new faculty and staff in their onboarding process. I have been meeting with Vince LaTona on a weekly basis. I couldn't be happier with this transition
- I continue to wrap up my performance reviews... 2 more to go!

Archdiocesan News:

- After reviewing the results of the Archdiocesan Feasibility Study and further consultation with
 his Councils and advisors, Archbishop Listecki has decided to move forward with his ambitious
 Capital Campaign of raising \$150,000,000 for the Archdiocese. His rationale/case is based
 upon the fact that he will be retiring in less than 5 years, and he would like to leave his
 successor with the needed financial resources to continue the mission and ministry of our
 Archdiocese
- He has also asked me to consider serving on the Priest Advisory Council for the campaign... I
 will have to pray about that for now
- We had our Annual Fall Clergy Day last Tuesday, September 17th. Brad Berghouse presented us
 with a summary of where things stand with Vision 2020. Dan Cellucci from the Catholic
 Leadership Institute spoke to us about a tool that will be used to assess both the priestly and
 parish needs in filling future clergy assignments. Their hoped-for outcomes include:
 - 1. Ongoing Archdiocesan clarity

- 2. Happier, holier priests
- 3. Thriving parishes

- Our parish trip to Scandinavia and Russia was a great success. 38 of us ventured into the land
 of Nordic sweaters, pickled herring, palaces, cathedrals and castles... it was a wonderful
 journey filled with beauty, history, and good memories! Next pilgrimage will take us back to
 the Holy Land and Egypt in June of 2021. Believe it or not, the planning has aleady begun!
- Catechetical Sunday kicked off the 25th year of the family program. This year's theme is:

 - 5. Explore options to increase parish revenues through consolidated fund-raising events
