

**St. Anthony on the Lake
Common Leadership Meeting Minutes
November 13, 2017**

The meeting began at 6:30 PM with Standing Committee and Pastoral Council Members in attendance.

Opening Prayer was led by the Prayer and Worship Committee.

Father Tony welcomed the group. He provided an update on the strategic planning process that has been undertaken by the Cabinet and Pastoral Council under Joe Schroeder's guidance. Father Tony described that St. Anthony's will have an expanded and updated mission statement, a concise new vision and five strategic objectives. Father Tony described that the next steps are parish listening sessions and there also will be an opportunity for feedback at the January Common Leadership gathering. Work continues on the development of our Covenant. The Covenant will be rolled out parish-wide and celebrated at our Jubilee.

Father Tony detailed and described upcoming Advent season happenings and events. The Midwinter Gala to support Lifelong Faith Formation programs will happen on 2/10/18 at Country Springs Hotel. He also reminded all to save the date for our Lenten Mission from 3/3-3/6 in 2018. Sunday, 3/4 Jeanne Cotter and Tony Alonso will perform a concert.

Father Tony wished all a Happy Thanksgiving and welcomed Ben Brzeski who gave an update on the Parish Directory. Parishioners can sign up on the St. Anthony's home page or in person. Ben also asked for Greeters to help with hospitality for the photo sessions.. Ben will be sending out an email invitation.

Terri Mahoney-Ogden made a brief appeal regarding available volunteer slots for Family Promise. We assist with hosting the week before Thanksgiving. Interested persons are asked to contact Terri for further information.

Joe Schroeder dismissed the group with a reminder about returning at 8:20 for Standing Committee summaries and Closing Prayer so that we might share meaningfully before we depart.

Minutes from October 2017 – Approved.

Report from Parish Strategic Planning Meeting - Laurie Polkus, Jeff Ellington and Joe Schroeder gave the group an overview of the strategic planning process.

Holy Day Mass Roles – Discussion of the need to recruit ministers for the Holy Days and special Masses coming up on November 22 and December 8. Special attention needed for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist. Lectors are selected and directly contacted.

Liturgy Evaluations for October and November – The Memorial Mass for the 57 listed who departed in the past year was held on November 2. Comments about this beautiful liturgy included the word amazing. New this year, cards made by first and second graders were given to the families when they came up to light a candle. Fr. Tony gave hugs at that time that made it so special. The Prayer Shawl Ministry ladies were on hand before and after the liturgy and distributed about 30 prayer shawls.

Year-End Report to Pastoral Council – Due February. Each ministry lead should prepare a paragraph to give to Brian Felsmann by the January 15, 2018 meeting.

Parish Mission – Theme is “All is Holy.” Jeanne Cotter will present March 3 – 6, 2018. She also will speak at all Masses. There will be a concert on Sunday evening with Jeanne Cotter and Tony Alonso. Monday night will be incorporated into the Family Program. Laurie is working on getting some time for the choir.

Ministry Reports

Art and Environment – For Advent, Jamee Stanley and Peggy Ziegler were inspired by a famous painting hung in St. Paul’s Cathedral called “Christ is the Light.” It’s in the development stage, and could include lanterns.

Eucharistic Adoration – There is a new painting in the Eucharistic chapel from our friends in Peru. It is of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. There is a need for someone to fill the noon slot on Thursdays. Perhaps the Alpha program may bring new recruits.

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharistic – The ministers met on October 18.

Lectors – A meeting for Lectors is scheduled for January 27, 2018.

Any Additional Business – Future dates of interest: An Evening for Cantors is November 15 in preparation for Advent and new Cycle B music. The Thanksgiving Mass is at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 22. Christ the King is November 25-26 and is the end of the liturgical year. December 1 “Messiah” concert. December 2-3 celebrates the First Week in Advent. There’ll be new books in the pews. December 10 “Lessons and Carols” at 4:00 p.m. Choir Cookie Sale December 16-17. There are changes to the Christmas schedule due to the Fourth Sunday of Advent falling on December 23-24. Masses will be December 23 at 5:00 p.m., December 24 at 9:00 a.m. for Advent. Then the rest of the schedule continues for Christmas Masses. A Rite of Welcome is planned for January 21, 2018 at the 10:45 a.m. Mass.

Ellen started the meeting by reading the school mission statement.

1-Principal Update- Ellen-

Ellen started by introducing Terri Hawkins, 2nd grade teacher present for meeting. Ellen also mentioned that we got our new Buddy Bench installed on the playground. The 3-8th graders are

going to see the movie Wonder (a book we read for summer reading a couple years ago) on Nov 30th.

We raised close to \$10,000 for Soles for Education- very good! New development in middle school math- We now have divided the kids into accelerated math & regular 8th gr math. Kids tested into a level & will be going thru material according to their results. Everyone will finish standard 8th grade math program.

2-Finance Update-Gary Oberfoell

Finance is starting to plan for next year's budget & also looking at what tuition will be for next year.

Terri mentioned that the Parish is still going thru strategic planning. Also, some parish council members went down to the Arch for a day of programs, she has some info to pass on to Ellen.

5-Volunteers-Flo Prospero

Flo reported that the Book Fair raised \$1600, which will go toward the current 5th gr Washington DC trip. It was difficult getting volunteers to work book fair, the books were not great- mostly toys,& for the amount of profit, it does not seem worth it. We decided to skip the book fair next year.

6-Marketing-Jen Packee

Jen reported that the Marketing Committee is currently focused on Open House, which will be held 1/17 8:45-10:30 am for the kindergarten classes and 1/28 from 10am-1pm for the older grades. Annie, Susan & Ellen met with a rep from the Arch to get new ideas & resources for open house. They are currently collecting data & will be getting mailings out.

7-Policy Update-Jackie Wendorf

Jackie is currently working on updating or admissions policy. She had a sample of St. Charles policy as a comparison & we decided we need to change up our wording a bit. We also need to come up with standards that are cohesive and represent the Parish goals. Jackie will write up a new policy & forward to committee for review. Ellen would like the new policy in place by Dec 15; so we have it for Open House material.

We will not meet in December, will resume in Jan 2018.

Reflection

Members shared their thoughts prompted by Kathie's reflection on how knowing Jesus doesn't promise a life of ease, but in seeking Jesus we are made great. Active Business

The committee reviewed the faith formation goals as presented to the parish council.

Long Range Strategic Planning

The staff and attending members of common leadership who attended reported the process has been positive and progressive. Planning is ongoing and will transition to the next phase with parish-wide listening sessions in January.

Begin Dialogue for Pastoral Council Report

Report to the Pastoral Council will be on April 23rd (confirmed). Traditionally the report has utilized methods to convey the life and work, progress, goals and challenges of lifelong faith formation in a way that tells a story beyond the statistics. The beginning of this discussion is to review areas in light of our faith formation and parish mission statements.

- *Membership expansion* was briefly discussed and deemed to have been successful in growing our committee.
- *Children's liturgy of the word* at the 9:00 mass has grown and become very popular. It was noted perhaps families with young children (approx. age 4-1st grade) who attended 10:45 mass may have shifted to 9:00 mass to take advantage of this enriching age-appropriate faith formation opportunity. The discussion of which mass and whether to add another CLOW on the weekend will continue to be evaluated. Inquiry was made whether mass attendance statistics regarding number of children of this age group at each mass could be gleaned. Consistent leadership to run a second CLOW is needed as well.
- The committee also pondered whether faith formation opportunities are reaching all populations of our church community (such as singles, millennials, those who don't have children, people who aren't "here" (i.e. those who aren't currently connected to St. Anthony parish or attend mass)). Alpha, as a vehicle for bridging people and genuinely welcoming all people at any stage of life, and means to explore and deepen their faith, was highlighted. The continued development of Alpha, possibly targeted to specific populations, along with concerted effort in growing and expanding it within and outside the parish consistently and over time was discussed.

Gala Fundraiser – February 10th, 2018 – Help is needed stuffing envelopes/invitations. Watch for Ann's email about a meeting time TBD after Thanksgiving.

Reports

Pastoral Council – The focus has been on the strategic planning process (ongoing). The parish's financial status and budget is being carefully reviewed.

FF PROGRAM REPORT for November 2017

EARLY CHILDHOOD:

Molly Ministry: Planning for O Come Little Children on Dec. 10 following the 9:00 Mass is underway. Lea Boyd will lead the sing-a-long and they decided on a craft. The Christmas Skit is still being discussed.

Open Gym: It was decided to go back to last year's start time of 10:00 to avoid conflicts when the school has indoor recess. There was a conflict last year with the school scheduling pre/k Open House the same day as open gym and it was too late to change it. Some of the moms were disappointed because they would have liked doing both. They are scheduled the same day in Jan. this year as well. It was decided to not reschedule open gym and try to encourage parents to check it out after going to open house. We discussed talking to the School Committee to work together in situations like this since they are reaching out to the same age group.

Guardians and Angels: Sessions are going well.

Field Trip Outings: The next trip is Nov. 16 to Betty Brinn Children's museum. Dec. 8 they will go to Mission Creek to make a craft, hand out candy canes, and visit the residents.

Mom's Night Out: Nov. 30, they will meet at Café Hollander in Brookfield with the option of shopping at The Corners before or after dinner.

Baptism Class: We have 6 families so far registered for the Nov. 14 class. We are really struggling with finding help for hospitality during the baptism celebrations. There have been several 12:30 (outside of Mass) baptisms we have not been able to find help for. We have had a hard time finding help during some of the Masses as well but we really can't be without someone there for those.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: during the 9:00 Mass is going well. We are seeing more parents volunteering as well as about 5 middle school students.

LaPetite Family Program: is going well. We had our first set of Learning Centers, which was well received. Next time we pack food boxes for the House of Peace for one of the Centers.

CHILDHOOD:

Classes: Are going well

First Reconciliation: Our first parent/child session went well. Fr. Tony spoke to the parents. There are 8 students who missed it. A makeup session has been scheduled.

MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Middle in the Middle: We had a great time in October going on a prayer 'walk.' It was such fun I posted about it on Facebook with the heading, "I love my job at St. Anthony on the Lake!" Here's what I said about that day: "I spent the evening with a delightful group of middle school youth. I had planned an outdoor prayer walk – but they had better ideas. We ran, rolled downhill, used the playground, sat and looked at the pond. And, we prayed, and talked, and laughed. (We also ate M&Ms.) Thanks Angie Flanagan and Jack Blankenheim for your ideas and support."

The lessons on Catholic Values and Morals continue in the Family Program Classes. This past week we learned a process called L.I.S.T.E.N., for making good decisions.

HIGH SCHOOL:

Confirmation Sessions: There has been a great response to the Alpha program. We have 14 small groups of 9th/10th grade and 2 adult leaders in each group.

SPARK (Eucharistic Adoration) was held on October 30 from 7-8pm. Next Spark will be on Monday November 27 from 7-8. Ben Wagner will be playing and singing for us again! This is a great opportunity for families, come join us and spend some time with Jesus, all are welcome.

NCYC: We will be leaving for the National Catholic Youth Conference(NCYC) to be held in Indianapolis this week November 16-19! Our fundraiser, "Subsidize a teen" was a big success! Thank you to everyone who supported our teens. We have been busy working on our trading items from Wisconsin.

College Care Packages: The 9th/10th Grade will be making care packages for our parish college students on Wednesday, December 6. Donations are welcome. Please turn in all names and addresses to Maureen Michaels at michaelsm@stanthony.cc by December 4.

MISSION TRIPS: We worked with the parish communications team to set up the online registration, appealing webpages, and a comprehensive communications plan for all the mission trips. The process was time-consuming, but we think the end result was worth it! Registrations have begun coming in and our first meeting will be on November 28.

FAMILY PROGRAM:

This continues to go well. Families are getting used to bringing their Bibles in with them. It is hard to believe we are 1/3 of the way through the year already! FAITHWORKS:

Making & Delivering Bag Lunches for The Gathering: We've done this twice now, on Oct. 7 and Nov. 4, and both times went well. We had about 25 parishioners, all families, make 150 bag lunches each time, and then a few of them (6-8) drove to The Gathering in Milwaukee and gave them out to the needy after they were served a hot lunch. Since this is a new activity for us, we had to adjust the times, but it's been a great experience. Ron Smyczek leads this activity.

Healing Hearts Meal: This is another new activity for us, and it took place on Mon., Oct. 23 in Waukesha. Seven families provided food for and eight parishioners (mothers and children) served dinner to grieving children and their families. It was very positive for our families, and they were greatly appreciative.

Fall Service Day: The event for freshmen and sophomores was cancelled due to weather this year. We are offering teens a chance to still help with a few seniors' yards next weekend.

Treat Bags for Seniors: This will take place Nov. 12 after the 9:00 Mass. We have 25 people signed up so far. Denise Burnett is helping with snacks and setup/cleanup.

Food Boxes for House of Peace: This is coming up on the weekend before Thanksgiving. We will pack 185 boxes this year through Family Program and school families.

ADULT FORMATION:

Bible Studies: There are over 75 signed up for the Mary's Bible Study combined for both the Wednesday evening and the Friday morning sessions.

Evening & Morning MOM's Groups: Both groups continue to go well. They are using the following resources: *Walking With Purpose*; *Seven Priorities That Make Life Work* by Lisa Brenninkmeyer; *Slow Down*; *Embracing the Everyday Moments of Motherhood* by Nichole Nordeman; and *The Catholic Mom's Prayer Companion*; *A Book of Daily Reflections* by Lisa M. Hendey and Sarah A. Reinhard.

ALPHA: sessions are going well. Nov. 11 is the retreat day for both groups together.

Alpha on Sunday Mornings: There are about 10 people in a small group, which is facilitated by Bob and Debbie Klimko.

MILLENNIAL OUTREACH:

Buckets and Beliefs is on hiatus because the grade school and high school basketball teams are using the gym so much.

Many young families took part in the Night of the Rosary and have been participating in FaithWorks activities.

- Received thank you letters from MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary & ERAs Network (previously known as Interfaith Senior Program).
- Will assess where to disperse money held in reserve in the Spring.
- Weekend of January 13th & 14th, St. Hyacinth's Food Pantry will be the Partner in Mercy that is highlighted.

Giving Tree

- Tree will be up the weekend of Dec. 2 to Dec. 3.
- Donations due Dec. 9 and Dec. 10; sorting of items & delivery to agencies on Mon. 12/11

St. Vincent de Paul

- Will hold coat drive for St. Dismas jail ministry the same weekend when donations for Giving Tree are due – Dec. 9 to Dec. 10.
- Need men and women's coats in size L / XL / XXL; also need hats and mittens

St. Hyacinth Food Pantry

- October – 139 new households; averaging over 200 families per week
- Seeing increased volume of clients due to closure of two food pantries

Earth Ministry

- Parishioner donated raspberry bushes, which are planted along one side of garden fence
- Will plant strawberries and rhubarb next year

- Need to educate parishioners donating their own produce to not wash / package in plastic; some produce spoiled before it could be delivered

Family Promise

- St. Anthony will support Gethsemane week of November 20th (week of Thanksgiving)
