Parish and Archdiocesan Updates

- Capital Campaign, etc.
 - Archbishop is reaching retirement within the next three years. His "Love One Another" campaign will roll out in 3 phases
 - Our parish will be in the first phase of the roll out which will begin in Spring of 2022.
 - A parish team is currently working to build a case of where our money will be spent since 60% will go to the archdiocese and 40% will go back to our parish.
 - The parish goal is \$2.3 million which \$1.4 million would come back to our parish
 - Currently the team is looking to allocate our funds to updating the worship space, to the music department, to building projects, and to technology advancement.
 - A Capitol Campaign Team will be formed and will include a representative from Stewardship. In October we will determine who will be a member on that committee which will be a short-term commitment of about 6 months.
- ChMs Update, CL Dates
 - Church Management Update
 - The current program used within the parish is being discontinued
 - Parish STAQ is the new program that will be utilized within the parish
 - Was first used within larger evangelical and protestant congregations and is now starting to grow within the Catholic community
 - Parish Staff is currently being trained on how to use the new program abd being accompanied by weekly coaching sessions over a 6 month period.
 - Goal is to eventually use this program for the Stewardship Renewal
 - It would allow parishioners to create a profile and be able to access all of their giving history
 - Would also allow the parish to manage lectors, servers, weddings, etc. so that everyone will utilize the same program
- Sustainability Committee
 - We want our priorities to align with the DMI who's 4 main priorities are:
 - Know
 - Grow
 - Feel
 - Align
 - The team has been working the past three months to educate key leaders in the parish. Now they are brainstorming on new workshops to expand this knowledge.
 - This will allow us to align our resources with the help of committees
 - Pastoral Counsel will be taking the DMI and applying the priorities to the standing committee goals
 - Question for the future: How do we educate the rest of the parish about the DMI?
 - Bulletin, one day workshop, seminar, etc.?

Stewardship Renewal Update and Discussion

- Review History
 - Used to start planning the renewal in September but that did not allow enough time for planning or committee involvement.
 - o Moved the timeline up to allow for more planning time before summer break.
 - o Renewal used to be all paper but switched to electronic last year (2020)
 - Used to only include monetary giving but now includes other aspects of stewardship which includes financial giving, time to the parish, and prayer.
- Introduce Creative
 - The theme, "One in Mission" is being woven throughout the music in mass, the school lessons, parish bulletin, and homilies, etc.
 - We now have a "language" that the parish can use to make sure our mission is being heard on a regular basis. (Refer to handout that begins with reading from Ephesians)
- Roll Out Plan
 - Refer to handout "Stewardship Renewal, 2021."
- Gather Input for Video
 - Listened to the phrases on the Handout and wrote down the images that first came to mind for us.
 - Email ideas to Ben so that they can start compiling potential images
- Scripted Statement Volunteers for 11/13 and 11/14
 - We will need volunteers to read a pre-written statement during masses to help send out our message to the rest of the parish.

Welcome and Prayer:

- The age ranges of the fewest respondents of the survey were from our parish were from the 18-25 age range and the 26-35 age range.
- There were 0% of the 18-25 age range that responded and 4% of the from the 26-35 age range from the total number of parishioners who answered the survey.
- Discussed how to get younger parishioners more involved in the parish.
 - Dave suggested to we look into hosting an Arise Milwaukee event. Dave has a connection and get information.
- To help parishioner to feel confident to share their faith story, we need more people give their faith testimonials and stories.
- Share more Bible stories and teachings to defend their faith.

Sub-Committee by-laws/adjustment of terms:

• Fr Tony's Update on Love One Another Campaign:

- The Campaign has a 5 year plan with a \$200 Million goal for the Milwaukee Diocese
- Our parish goal is 2.3 Million with 60% going to our parish and 40% going to the diocese.
- The bulk of the proceeds from the Campaign would go to the maintenance needs of the church such as:
 - Music Space in church
 - Piano needs to be replace since it was 16 years old when we got it and is now 20 yrs. older. It now has a cracked bridge cap, which is too costly to replace for the age of the piano. The new piano will be donated to the church.
 - New organ is priced at \$450,000 and we are looking for donors to offset the price.
 - New mixing board, new AV desk, technology and an information desk in the lobby of the church.

Highlights from plan are 1) Facility concerns – need for expanded site in the designated area of service 2) Operations Manager – need to hire for day to day operations so that Executive Director can be freed up to do grant writing, recruiting, fund raising, etc. 3) Grow and
