Weekly Reflection

Simply a Matter of Listening

Statistics show that most people don't listen very well, even in the best of circumstances. Even worse, we don't remember much of what we do hear even if we do listen. Studies also show that people remember stories best. Undoubtedly, that's why Jesus used so many parables. In today's Gospel Jesus tells the Parable of the Sower, a story about the power of God's Word for those who do more than hear the Gospel, but truly listen in a way that allows it to work in and through them.

According to Jesus, some are deaf to the Good News, they hear nothing. Others give their partial attention, and eventually fail, due to their commitment half-hearted. Some listen with true sincerity, but allow competing voices in the world to distract them until they waver, then wither. But there are those who listen intently and don't allow other messages to distract them – resulting in a new meaning and purpose for their lives.

It's easy to think Jesus is talking about others, after all each Sunday we come to Mass and listen to the readings. But in reality Jesus is challenging each of us personally. Why aren't we even more ardent in our commitment to him? What's holding us back? Why does the seed of the Gospel sometimes fall on infertile soil even in our own hearts? Why is our commitment sometimes less than whole-hearted? If we're truthful, it all comes down to how well we listen.

It's ironic, isn't it? We'll resolve to spend an hour each day exercising our bodies at the gym or doing something else we love or think is good for us, but won't consistently spend an hour each week spending time in God's presence. Our readings remind us – to hear God speaks to us requires two things: time and silence. Summer is the perfect time to make a resolution, to spend at least one hour a week with Jesus. Simply put, to make the commitment to read one of the Sundays readings each day, Monday through Saturday, then sit in silence for ten minutes each day – just listening.

What condition is the soil of our hearts? It's simply a matter of listening.



Reflexión semanal

Simplemente es un asunto de escuchar

Las estadísticas muestran que la mayoría de las personas no escuchan bien, incluso en las mejores circunstancias, y aún cuando escuchamos, no recordamos mucho. Los estudios también muestran que las personas recuerdan mejor las historias. Sin lugar a duda, por eso Jesús usó tantas parábolas. En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús cuenta la Parábola del Sembrador; una historia sobre el poder de la Palabra de Dios para aquellos que hacen más que oír el evangelio y que verdaderamente escuchan de una manera que le permite trabajar en ellos y a través de ellos.

Según Jesús, algunos son sordos a la Buena Nueva; no oyen nada. Otros medio ponen atención y finalmente fracasan por su falta de compromiso. Algunos escuchan con verdadera sinceridad, pero permiten que las voces que compiten en el mundo los distraigan hasta que flaquean y luego se marchitan. Sin embargo, hay quienes escuchan atentamente y no permiten que otros mensajes los distraigan - dando como resultado, un nuevo significado y propósito para sus vidas.

Es fácil pensar que Jesús está hablando de los demás, luego de que todos los domingos vamos a misa y escuchamos las lecturas, pero en realidad Jesús nos está desafiando a cada uno de nosotros personalmente. ¿Por qué no somos más fervorosos aún en nuestro compromiso con él? ¿Qué nos detiene? ¿Por qué la semilla del evangelio cae a veces en tierra no fértil incluso en nuestros propios corazones? ¿Por qué nuestro compromiso a veces es menos que sincero? Si somos sinceros, todo se reduce a nuestra capacidad de escuchar bien.

Es irónico, ¿no es cierto? Resolvemos ejercitar nuestros cuerpos en el gimnasio una hora al día o hacer algo más que amamos o pensamos que es bueno para nosotros, pero no siempre pasamos una hora cada semana ante la presencia de Dios. Las lecturas nos recuerdan que escuchar a Dios requiere dos cosas: tiempo y silencio. El verano es el momento perfecto para tener la resolución de pasar al menos una hora a la semana con Jesús. En pocas palabras, comprometerse a leer una de las lecturas del domingo por día, de lunes a sábado, y luego sentarse en silencio durante diez minutos cada día y sólo escuchar.

¿En qué condición está el suelo de nuestro corazón? Es simplemente un asunto de escuchar.

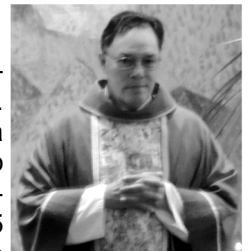

We are Disciples Making Disciples Wherever We Are, Wherever We Go.

What do disciples of Jesus Christ look like? This question was raised at a recent gathering of people interested in Christian Initiation entitled "Disciples Making Disciples". One of the highlights of this conference was the simple realization that the vitality of a parish community is reflected in the way members of the community first of all recognize their identity as disciples of the Lord and secondly how this identity permeates all that they do. A community of disciples lives the Catholic Faith by sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ and creating a home where this good news is lived and shared with others.



Our Lady of the Assumption Parish Community is that welcoming place where we are inspired and challenged to be good disciples. This is evident by the warmth and welcoming experience that greets us every Sunday at the beginning of mass. Many visitors have told me how they feel comfortable and part of our parish at prayer. We greet one another before mass and acknowledge that we are here to celebrate and grow in faith relationship with God. Our greeting one another opens hearts and sets a tone of hospitality that fosters our personal and communal investment into our prayer. By our actions we say to one another: "I am here for you!"
