Weekly Reflection

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In this Sunday's Gospel we again hear the story of Jesus's compassion for the leper who begs to be healed. It wasn't easy to be compassionate toward a leper. It was much easier to be disgusted and repulsed. Because of its ugliness, leprosy became for the Hebrews a symbol of everything that's ugly, frightening and evil. Human beings have always found a peculiar sort of satisfaction in lumping together all of their anxiety, fear and disgust – and destroying, banishing, or burying it.

Consider that this passage is much more than Jesus just healing a leper. In a very real sense, even before the leper was healed, Jesus had worked his miracle simply by touching the man. In place of disgust, Jesus showed compassion. The real manifestation of God's power in this is not that one sick person is made healthy, but rather that a person universally held to be repulsive, unlovable, even evil – is in fact the focus of God's mercy and compassion.

That is a miracle indeed – a miracle that heals not only one person's leprosy, but heals human fear, prejudice and paralysis to love where and when the need is greatest. Truth is, we can't really chase away the ugliness we see manifested before us because what we really fear in others is what we fear in ourselves – the ugliness, the weakness, the deformity that's in each of us. The message in today's Gospel is that Jesus wants to heal each of us in the way we most need to be healed, both as individuals and as a community.

Jesus shows us the way fear is overcome, and how our brokenness and weakness are made whole. The leper brought the dark and frightening side of his nature, and laid it before Jesus. In the same way we must be as confident as the leper in bringing our fears and failings to Him, with the same words, "If you will it, you can heal me." Jesus has already spoken the words, "Of course I will it, be healed!"



Reflexión semanal

6º domingo en tiempo ordinario

En el Evangelio de este domingo, escuchamos de nuevo la historia de compasión de Jesús por el leproso que pide ser sanado. No era fácil ser compasivo con un leproso; era mucho más fácil sentir disgusto y rechazo. Debido a su fealdad, la lepra se convirtió en un símbolo de todo lo que era feo, aterrador y malvado. El ser humano siempre ha encontrado una peculiar satisfacción en juntar toda la ansiedad, el miedo y el disgusto, para así destruirlo, desterrarlo o enterrarlo.

Este pasaje se trata de mucho más que la sanidad de un leproso. En un sentido muy real, incluso antes de que el leproso fuera sanado, Jesús había obrado su milagro simplemente tocando al hombre. En lugar de disgusto, Jesús mostró compasión. La verdadera manifestación del poder de Dios en esto, no es la sanidad de una persona enferma sino más bien, que una persona considerada universalmente como repulsiva, no digna de amor, incluso malvada, es de hecho el centro de la misericordia y compasión de Dios.

Este es el milagro: no solo curar la lepra de una persona, sino curar el miedo humano, los prejuicios y la parálisis para amar dónde y cuándo se necesite más. La verdad es que no podemos realmente deshacernos de la fealdad que vemos manifestada ante nosotros porque lo que realmente tememos de los demás, es lo que tememos de nosotros mismos: la fealdad, la debilidad, la deformidad que hay en cada uno de nosotros. El mensaje en el Evangelio de hoy es que Jesús quiere sanarnos a cada uno de la manera que necesitamos ser sanados; como individuos y como comunidad.

Jesús nos muestra la forma en que se supera el miedo y cómo nuestros quebrantamientos y debilidades se hacen uno. El leproso trajo consigo el lado oscuro y aterrador de su naturaleza y lo puso delante de Jesús. De la misma manera confiamos, como el leproso, al traer nuestros temores y fracasos delante de Él con las mismas palabras: "Si quieres, puedes sanarme" y Jesús ya ha dicho con sus propias palabras: "¡Sí quiero, sé sano!".

This past Saturday, the Thomas Fire Benefit attracted thousands of supporters of our Ventura neighbors who were affected by this disaster. Our city leaders, from council members to first responders shared their stories and reflected upon the days of the fire and the after affects. Solidarity and community outreach for everyone in this city was evident by the outpouring of love and concern. This is the grace that is born from the

ashes of fire and wind. This is the consequence of human kindness and the realization that those in need become our priority. As people of faith, our attention is drawn to those most in need of our love, our care, and our attention. Thousands of dollars were raised by this benefit and now is the time to reach out and offer this support to all in need. Together we are strong by our care.

In the early days after the fire, our parish began its own effort so the support this Ventura community. Our initial outreach for fire victims helped us to utilize the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity for about 30 families. A team of workers opened our garage area for the collection of food, clothing, and personal items for those with immediate needs. Since then,

we have collected funds for our continued support of anyone affected by the fire. Our January dinner was a huge success where those affected by the fire and a generous number of volunteers offered "street tacos" and a supportive atmosphere for the 80 plus folks who attended.



On February 24th, another dinner will be hosted for those who lost homes or were displaced so we can once again offer hospitality, support, and encouragement for those who attend. Together we are strong when we are Christ's Body, serving our brothers and sisters.

In our days ahead, the parish family will once again be asked to join with our Archdiocesan family for our annual Together in Mission. "TIM" celebrates its 25th Anniversary this year. Twenty-five years of financial, prayer, and moral support for all our brothers and sisters who struggle to live their faith and family life in the midst of poverty and socially difficult places. Our care for them is the same care and outreach we offer fire victims, the homeless of Ventura, and those who ask for a hand up in life. This is who we are because: Together we are Strong by through our commitment and compassion.

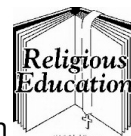

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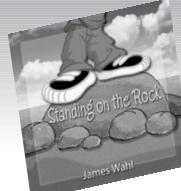



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
