From Our Pastor

Discovering Christ this Easter

What is the meaning of life when we enter into a season of grace and prayer like Easter. We see images of new life in our parish, in the church, and in our world. It makes us wonder how we can allow the purpose of God's saving act of love, through his passion, death, and resurrection breath new life in me, or for that matter, in all of us. The presence of a new cross in our church reminds us that the meaning of the cross is more than a reminder but a testimony of faith that "God so loved the world, that he sent his only begotten Son." (John 3:16)

This belief now calls forth from us as a community that we are bound together by a more powerful and awesome gift. It means we are on a mission to bring the Peace of Christ to all we meet. We are to be the Peace of Christ in all we do. This offers us a vision of "New Life" that is so much needed in our world today. But new life can only happen when we rediscover what that means for us as individual Catholic Christians. I believe that the work of the Risen Lord will capture us only when we begin to live lives of reflection and pay attention to the presence of the Lord in our midst. The early Christian community had an intense experience of Christ present among them. No wonder they could move from fear to mission. No wonder they could commit all their resources and their efforts to building up their life in Christ. No wonder they could endure the struggles and the questions that life threw at them. No wonder they could because they could see that work of God in their lives.

I see this most especially in the Thomas Fire Cross that now graces our church. It is not complete, it is in process of coming to be. Just like us. It has endured hardship and suffering. Much like us. It has found new purpose because it has been refashioned from being a tree to becoming a symbol of new life. During Lent we placed nice words on the cross every Sunday to help us understand what the cross means for us. Now we become what the cross signifies, a new creation. We now join in the wonder of becoming new creations as we become Christ-centered people. Only by this way of living will we have an experience of making the planet a better place to live. Only then will we desire to protect it and preserve it for future generations. Only then will we truly see the hand of God at work all around us.

Easter is a time to give the glory to our God who seeks to form us as His Priestly People.

Blessed Season of getting to know, love, and serve the Lord as his people.

Weekly Reflection

Persistently Faithful

At the point of this Sunday's Gospel passage the meeting with the Risen Christ is well along, a kind of ease in the presence of Christ has been reestablished, and an after-dinner conversation arises during which Jesus turns to Peter and asks, "Do you love me?" We can easily imagine Peter responding spontaneously, "Yes, you know that I do," to which Jesus says, "Feed my lambs," or take care of my people.

At that moment, to say "yes" must have been easy for Peter. With Jesus having overcome the worst that life and death could do to him, what further challenge could there possibly be? Faith must have been an easy thing immediately after the resurrection.

The exchange doesn't end there. Twice more Jesus repeats the question, and twice more – with what must have been a growing impatience – Peter answers, "Yes, you know that." Twice more Jesus emphasizes to take care of His people. We can feel the persistence of Jesus' questioning and the demands He makes of Peter: take care of my people no matter what it will cost you. And as it always does, it will cost you a great deal – for the enthusiasm of the moment is never enough.

For Peter, as for us, faith is easy when Jesus is obviously present. But as we know, this is not always so. If Peter was to carry out his mission successfully, he would need a patience far greater than that demanded by Jesus' prolonged questioning. He would need a patience great enough to enable him to persist in the face of dullness and disbelief, even the hostility of a world to whom the resurrection meant nothing at all.

Peter, the Church, all of us, are sent out to care for God's people. It really doesn't matter how successful we seem to be, how much sense it makes, or how much approval we win. All that matters is that we are persistently faithful to our Savior's command

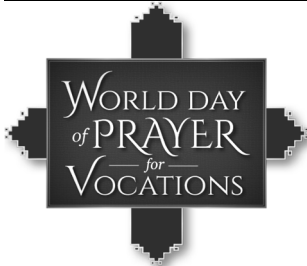

Reflexión Semanal

Persistentemente fieles

En el punto del pasaje del evangelio de este domingo, el encuentro con Cristo resucitado si bien nos lleva a la presencia restablecida de Cristo, surge de una conversación después de la cena durante la cual Jesús se dirige a Pedro y le pregunta: "Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas?". Podemos imaginar fácilmente a Pedro respondiendo espontáneamente: "Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te quiero", a lo que Jesús le responde: "Apacienta mis corderos"; es decir, cuida de mi gente.

En ese momento, decir "sí" debe haber sido fácil para Pedro. Si Jesús venció lo peor que la vida y la muerte podían hacerle, ¿qué otro desafío podría haber? La fe debe haber sido algo fácil inmediatamente después de la resurrección.

El intercambio no termina ahí. Dos veces más Jesús repite la pregunta y dos veces más, con lo que debe haber sido una creciente impaciencia, Pedro responde: "Sí, Señor, tú sabes que te quiero". Dos veces más Jesús enfatiza que cuida de su pueblo. Podemos sentir la persistencia del cuestionamiento de Jesús y las demandas que Él le hace a Pedro: cuida de mi gente sin importar lo que te cueste. Y como siempre pasa, le costaría mucho, ya que el entusiasmo del momento nunca sería suficiente.

Tanto para Pedro como para nosotros, la fe es fácil cuando Jesús está obviamente presente. Pero como sabemos, no siempre es así. Si Pedro cumplía con éxito su misión, necesitaría una paciencia mucho mayor que la exigida por el prolongado interrogatorio de Jesús. Necesitaría una paciencia lo suficientemente grande como para permitirle persistir ante la monotonía y la incredulidad, incluso la hostilidad de un mundo para el que la resurrección no significaba nada.

Todos; Pedro, la Iglesia y nosotros hemos sido enviados a cuidar del pueblo de Dios. Realmente no importa qué tan exitosos parezcamos, o cuánto sentido tenga, o cuánta aprobación ganemos. Lo único que importa es que seamos persistentemente fieles al mandato de nuestro Salvador.


