

## From the Pastor's Pen...



Dear James',

On September 18, 2019, our Pilla's--Frank our Candle-in-Chief and Claire Pilla, our Quilter Queen--celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. They have lived their sacrament of marriage two and a half times more than I have lived my sacrament of the Holy Orders the priesthood. The entry to both of our Sacraments is Baptism. This is the same baptism that unites St. Clement of Rome in the 90 AD and Pope Francis in 2019 AD; is the same baptism that the Egyptian-

Ethiopian Christian share with the Greek-Russian Orthodox churches! Baptism puts all on the same level. No pedestals. We all are children of the Father in Heaven. It is in this spirit we all come together and begin the celebration of our Eucharist! We celebrate our communion as children of the Father; we celebrate the life-giving sacrifice of Jesus, we rejoice, we revel!

Last weekend I began the reflection on the Eucharist with John 1:14 "And the Word (From the entrance until the prayer of the faithful at mass) became flesh (from "the Lord be with you" to "through him, with him, in him...) and made his dwelling among us (from the Our Father until the final hymn of the mass). It took John over sixty years to write this verse!

In Christian context (as opposed to other religions, especially Judaism the faith of Jesus) mystery, has an intrinsic revealed element to it. Often to keep the solemnity, retain power, keep order and to guard against heresy, the word mystery was used to imply that which is hidden from us humans. Consequently, among many other things, the Eucharist was so ritualized that even the Celebrant was turning away from the people in leading them to the mystery of God made Flesh and that too in a language that only a few could understand. This element of 'secrecy" had a role to play in the past because Christianity was still within the crucible of Judaism. For Judaism the mystery of God is still hidden (our Jewish friends would not even utter the Holy Name of YHWH). But for the followers of Jesus Christ, when He took the bread and wine and commanded us to do THIS in memory of him, the mystery unfolded. In this action on the bread and wine Jesus revealed the mystery of his humanity and divinity within our hearts. Yes Eucharist is NOT a hidden mystery. It is Him. The hidden mystery of ages past is now revealed in the human heart. This is the New Covenant. It took over sixty years for John the Evangelist to formulate the revelation in his heart which he put down as "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us!" It was a mystery revealed.

Furthermore, in the Eucharist we celebrate this mystery of God's presence revealed in each of us as the faithful, in the celebrant, in the Word proclaimed from the pulpit and profoundly in the Bread and Wine on the altar. The presence of God is not "locked" up in the tabernacle; it is unleashed all around us here when we gather to rejoice "In the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." It is with this baptismal formula we begin the Eucharist. This baptismal words of Jesus will be the focus of our reflection this weekend.

Finally, in celebrating the feast of St. Francis, we will have the blessing of the pets on October 4 at 6 PM on the front side lawn. Spread the word around. Remember our Parish Fall Festival is on September 27 from 6PM - 11PM and Parish breakfast on September 22 from 9 AM - Noon ....

Reprint from 9/15/19 -

Each week I have tried to keep the Parish updated on our progress with Mid-America. I think this is a good time to remind the entire Parish that no decisions have been made as of this time. We don't even have an official offer from Mid-America which we could evaluate. Up to this point all of our efforts have been supporting Mid-America's request in order that they may make us an offer in the next several months. As I have stated before, we will consider any legitimate offer for use of the School building. At this time, we have no other parties interested which we would like to consider.

If, at some point in the future, we receive an offer from Mid-America or any other offer, the evaluation team will review the different elements of the offer and assess the impact to the Parish. Prior to any decisions being made, a Parish Community Meeting will be held to communicate the offer, answer any questions, and solicit feedback from parishioners.
