Next week the students will enjoy a week of dress-up days for the upcoming Hallissey tournament, Ash Wednesday Mass, a school-wide Lenten retreat and a Hallissey assembly on Thursday afternoon. There will be no school on Friday for the students. Our teachers will enjoy an inservice day collaborating with area Treasure Valley Catholic School teachers.

Upcoming Lenten Activities -

Almsgiving -this year we will once again participate in the Knights of Columbus's 40 Cans for Lent Drive. If you would like to bring in canned food goods we will have collection boxes in each classroom. We will also be having a school-wide Penny War throughout Lent to collect money for an amazing organization called the Unstoppable Foundation. The Unstoppable Foundation is a non-profit humanitarian organization bringing sustainable education to children and communities in developing countries thereby creating a safer and more just world for everyone. Their Mission: To ensure EVERY child has access to the life-long gift of an education.

Prayer - We will start Lent with an Ash Wednesday (2/14) retreat that will lead the students through a hands-on Stations of the Cross experience. We will also participate in adoration in the auditorium at the end of the day. We will join the parish's call to pray a Divine Mercy Chaplet at the end of each school day. 





Vaccine/Immunization information updates on PERTUSSIS, INFLUENZA and SHINGLES

PERTUSSIS (Whopping Cough)

Both Canyon and Ada Counties are reporting an increased number of PERTUSSIS this year.

Why worry about pertussis if you or your children have been vaccinated?

Even though you or your child may have been vaccinated, protection from the vaccine weakens or disappears over a period of time. Very few pre-teens, adolescents or adults have any protection. Pertussis can be deadly to infants. The best way to protect yourself and others is by getting vaccinated.

What should you do?

Watch for signs of whooping cough and keep anyone at home who has symptoms until they have seen a healthcare provider or are not contagious. Symptoms include a cough that is persistent, comes in "fits," is so forceful it causes vomiting, or it may cause a noise as the person breathes in. Consult Consult your health care provider for specific recommendations.

Where can people get their Tdap vaccine?

CDHD offers vaccines to children through age 18. Call 208-327-7400 to make an appointment.

Call your child's or your health care provider to schedule a vaccine. Vaccines are available through most medical clinics, walk-in clinics and some pharmacies.

SHINGLES

1 in 3 people will get shingles in their lifetime, so it is recommended that anyone who is 50 and older receive a vaccination. The vaccine is especially important because as people age, their immune system weakens, leaving them more susceptible to shingles. Even healthy, active people can get shingles. A new and more effective herpes zoster (shingles) vaccine, is now available. . Shingrix® was recently approved by the FDA and released to the public as a more effective vaccine. Shingrix® is over 93% effective. Those ages 50 and up are asked to speak with their pharmacist or healthcare professional about this vaccine.

NOTES FROM THE COUNSELOR—Ideas For Connecting:

Every child and parent craves and responds to connection in different ways, so it's important to find what works for your family. Connection can look different for each child, and for each parent. It depends on the day, the time of day, and what else is going on around you. It can be scheduled or spontaneous. Maybe you surprise them with a trip to the park. Play an impromptu game of tag. Or simply sit silently together on the couch. Maybe you ask about something specific that happened that day — and actually <u>listen</u> to their response! Sometimes, connections happen through difficult, challenging situations: Making up after an argument, crying together after hearing about what the mean girls said at school, consoling them after a lastminute loss in the game. Here are a few more ideas on ways to connect:

- •Schedule a regular hang out time (play a game, read a book, go to the park, something you both enjoy)
- •Come up with a special goodbye ritual (handshake, song, certain words, etc.)
- •Offer a hug, high five, fist bump, something that requires touch!
- •Play in their world get down on their level, use their toys with them, be silly, use your imagination!
- •Share your favorite game, toy or movie from when you were a kid
- •Ask about their day and just listen
- •Recognize their feelings and just be with them while they are sad/ angry/scared/excited

There are many more ways to connect. Take a few moments to brainstorm and try something new this week with your kid(s).
