Dear Parents and Friends of St. Mark's,

Welcome to our new students and families, as well as to all our returning families!

How great to have our school bustling with so much activity, especially with all the renovations made possible by many hands and minds over the summer months. The Holy Spirit is certainly active in our parish school!

I would like to invite all of you, with our parish and school community, to join the bishops of the United States as they focus on the theme "Stay With Us" throughout this next academic year. In particular, the Scripture I'd like us to focus on is the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24.13.35).

As you have probably read or heard, out of those who consider themselves part of the nonaffiliated (NONES) religious, most made a choice to stop their belief by the time they reached the age of 13! Formation of our children in the divine truth of Jesus is crucially important for their future lives as adult Catholics!



Every person who volunteers in the school in any capacity must take a Safe Environment Workshop (SEW). The first time must be a live, face-to-face class, and each year thereafter is an online renewal process. THE LIVE CLASS OR THE ONLINE RENEWAL MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE YOU CAN VOLUNTEER IN ANY CAPACITY OR VISIT

THE SCHOOL. PLEASE GET THIS DONE EARLY SO YOU ARE READY TO VOLUNTEER WHEN SCHOOL STARTS. Follow the directions below to set up your account on CMG Connect. In order to register for the face-to-face class you must:

- ~ Go to boise.cmgconnect.org
- ~ Click "My Training" and read through the 7 documents on the left side of the page.
- ~ Click the "Live Events" tab to choose the live class to attend.

St. Mark's Catholic School will have SEW classes on August 27 @ 5:00 p.m., September 10 @ 1:30 and September 17 @ 6:00 p.m., all at the school. Sacred Heart School has a class on Wednesday, September 11 @ 6:00 p.m. You create an account at boise.cmgconnect.org and select the class you want to take.

PER DIOCESAN POLICY, BACKGROUND CHECKS are valid for five years. Once an account has been set up with CMG Connect, you will be able to see when your background check expires. Paperwork for background checks are available in the office.

The Volunteer Book has been updated for the 19-20 school year and is ready to log your summer volunteer hours. It is the blue binder outside the School Office.

Every Friday that school is in session is an 8:30 a.m. Late Start Friday. This does not affect Preschool as their every day start time is 8:30 a.m.

Student Body Mass—thank you students for remembering to be in Mass Dress this past Wednesday (refer to the 2019-20 Uniform Dress Code if you have questions). Boys please note that only SOLID NAVY, St. Mark's striped or St. Mark's plaid TIES can be worn to Mass. The School Office has SOLID NAVY ties for sale for \$10.



Students are required to be in uniform, except for special days on which non-uniform dress is permitted or on official meeting days for Scouts. One day each month is designated as a free Spirit Day and an optional \$1.00 Spirit Day will be held each month. On Spirit Day, students may wear jeans or solid colored shorts (seasonal) in good condition, a St. Mark's spirit T-shirt and a St. Mark's sweatshirt. Students must continue to follow Students' Overall Appearance Guidelines on Spirit Days. Spirit wear (sweatshirts and spirit shirts) must be purchased at Educational Outfitters at River Street and Americana Blvd. in Boise. Their website is

www.boise.educationalfitters.com where you can place your order. Each student may pay \$10 at the beginning of the year for a year's worth of \$1 Optional Spirit Days. Monies collected will be donated to charities on behalf of the school.

Hot Lunch, which includes milk, is \$3.00 each day. Milk with cold lunch is .20¢

and an extra slice of pizza on Pizza Friday is .75¢. Each of these fees will be deducted from a student's lunch account when their card is scanned. Please make sure that you keep a positive balance in your student's lunch account. Payments can be made online at www.ezschoollapps.com or payment can be made in the School Office via check or cash.

If you have an account from last year, your logon and password remain the same. Contact the School Office if you need help with your account.

If your student arrives to school @ 8:05 a.m. or later (or 8:35 or later on Fridays), they must check in at the School Office before heading to class. This is for ALL GRADE LEVELS. The Middle School gate will be locked promptly @ 8:05 a.m.

Bus information - St. Mark's will once again be offering bus transportation to students who live south and west of the school's location. The current route serves families/students in the area of Overland Road and Five Mile, and McMillan and Eagle Road (specific location to be determined). Pick up and drop off of students occurs at both locations.

There are seats for approximately 55 students on the bus. Priority is given to full time riders but students needing a ride only one way can also be accommodated.





Welcome back to school! We would like to take this opportunity to introduce ourselves and explain our role in the schools. The Saint Alphonsus School Health Program provides health services to 7 Catholic schools in the Treasure Valley. The nursing staff includes the following:

Our goal is to assist with achieving a healthy and safe learning environment. We provide the following:

- Basic first aid and triage
- Medication administration
- Health and Wellness screens-Immunization status, hearing, vision, speech, scoliosis, and Kindergarten screens
- Case management for special needs
- Flu vaccines and some immunizations
- Staff education, training and support
- Health Education-Basic CPR and First Aid, dental health, nutrition and physical activity, puberty, personal hygiene, safety, hand washing and infection control, environmental health, referrals as needed.

ILLNESS

Sometimes it can be hard to decide whether your child is too sick to attend school. Here are a few guidelines:

Fever: If your child has a fever of 100F or greater, or looks or acts sick, he/she should stay home. Call you doctor is your child has a fever with pain, rash, weakness, vomiting or diarrhea. *****May return to school after symptoms are gone for 24 hours and child is fever-free without the aid of fever reducing medications.**

Vomiting and/or Diarrhea: Vomiting or more than one event of watery diarrhea is a reason to keep you child at home *****May return to school after symptoms are gone for 24 hours without the aid of anti-emetic or anti-diarrheal medication.**

Contagious Diseases: You should keep your child at home if he/she might spread a contagious disease to other children (i.e. chicken pox, strep, measles) Please consult with your Health Care Provider.

Head Lice: Parent/Guardian may choose to pick child up from school. Confirmed cases of lice require treatment before returning to school. If treatment is started before the next day, the child may return to school. Most treatments are available over the counter. Families are encouraged to ask their child's health Care Provider for advice about which treatment to use. The school nurse will also provide education regarding treatment and control of head lice as needed.

Pinkeye/Conjunctivitis: Parent will be notified of suspected eye irritation/infection. Parent/Guardian will consult with the child's Health Care Provider about diagnosis and treatment. Child will not be excluded from the school setting unless meets other exclusion criteria, (young age, fever, severely ill) Antibiotics are NOT always required to return to the school setting, as determined by the child's Health Care Provider.

Sore Throat: If your child has a sore throat and fever, or a severe sore throat without/fever, he/she should stay home.

Cough: if your child's cough is worse than you would expect with a cold, keep him/her at home. If he/she has a difficult time breathing or has a fever, call Health Care Provider. Coughs can linger on for 2-3 weeks before resolving, but they should not interfere with most activities.

Stomachache: If your child complains of a stomachache, especially if he/she says it hurts to move and he/she does not want to eat, he/she should stay at home and you

should contact your Health Care Provider.

Notes from the Counselor

Welcome to new families and welcome back to returning families. We are here to help this year as the counseling staff at St. Mark's school. Ms. Jen Boehm and Dr. Joe Lipetzky are at the school each week. We help students and families be successful and solve problems in school and in the community. We will have parenting tips each week or tools to help your students be successful at school. You can contact the office and reach us if you have a concern. We will return your call as soon as we can. We are at school at different times. Ms. Jen is at school Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Dr. Joe is at school Monday and Friday. We are looking forward to another great year with the school and settling into our new space. The students are getting into their new classrooms and new teachers this fall too. It is normal for kids and families to take some time to adjust into the school routine. It helps kids adjust to school schedule faster if there is a predictable routine at home. Routines build calm safety for kids. Predictable chores, meal times and bed times are important. So are predictable morning routines getting ready for school and getting to school on time. Let routines be your style and the students will do better and have less problems too.
