Letter from our Pastor

Dear Parents and Friends of St. Mark's,

Catholic Schools Week kicks off this Sunday, at our 8:30 AM Mass, hosted by our young disciples! I hope to see you there. Thank you for choosing Catholic education and thank you for making St. Mark's your home. I am looking forward to the

special exuberance of this week's celebration.

Also, this Sunday at the 11:00 AM Mass we will be celebrating **"The Rite of Acceptance,"** for those who are discerning to become Catholic this year at the Easter Vigil. For those who don't already know, this is the first public rite that those who are looking to join the Catholic Church go through in order to come into full communion with the Church Christ founded. Here are some interesting facts and links to pique your interest about this age old tradition:

- *Catechumens* are those who are not yet baptized and will be seeking official entrance into both Christianity and the Catholic Church. *Candidates* are those who have already been validly baptized in other Christian traditions and are discerning to become Catholic. We will have people from both groups joining us.
- There will be a **loud knocking** at the door at the beginning of Mass. This symbolizes their first public entrance into the Church for all to witness. Although it is not the case anymore, those seeking to become Christian in the early Church were not allowed into many parts of the Mass (particularly the Eucharist) until they had been fully initiated through baptism and confirmation.
- **Please introduce yourself** and offer them a warm welcome! Breaking into a new group can be difficult, so we want to do everything we can to connect them to our community as organically as possible.

Hearing stories about those who have become Catholic can be very inspiring. In addition to asking the people at our parish about how they've ended up here, here are some videos with which you can edify yourself:

- A Protestant Evangelical minister <u>tells his story</u> of how he came to look into Catholicism (3 minutes)
- A woman <u>explains</u> how she overcame her misconceptions about Catholic Marian devotion (3.5 minutes)
- A religious sister **gives her story** from Catholic to Atheist back to Catholic again (9.5) minutes)

May the light of Christ continue to shine into the future through our children.

COVID News

St. Mark's Catholic School is working diligently to ensure the safety of all our students, by minimizing the opportunity for any potential spread of the COVID-19 virus within our school system. We are continuing to partner with the Central District Health to provide free COVID-19 testing for all of our students, faculty and staff.

- The COVID-19 test is comprised of a saliva-based PCR test supplied by VAULT.
- The testing will occur in the school's nurse's office by trained staff members.
- Tests will be administered to students who are believed to have had close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Once a test is administered, the student must be picked up from school and remain at home until test results are received.
- Tests will be administered no earlier than five days from a close contact with an infected person.
- Parents will be notified of the results through their child's school Gmail account within 72 hours of test completion. Parents are asked to report test results to the school at schooloffice@stmarksboise.org.
- Any positive results will follow state reporting procedures and be reported to Central District Health by Vault.
- Parent permission will be requested to administer the test.
- Testing is not mandatory.

Avoid social gatherings because, as you have undoubtedly read in the media, the coronavirus is very active and case counts are growing once again in Idaho and Ada County.

Please make sure that your student brings a couple of masks to school each day in case the elastic breaks or one gets dirty. The extra mask should be in a ziploc bag and placed in their backpack. Due to recent generous donations, we have a stock of masks in case students break a mask during the day.



If your child is wearing a fabric mask, please make sure that you are washing it at least a couple of times per week to kill bacteria and germs that may be present.

Quarantine Guidelines

With support from Father Ben and our School Board, we will continue to require a 14 day quarantine for students who have close contact (less than 6 feet apart for more than 15 minutes) with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19.

When the number of cases in Ada county begin to trend downward, we will revisit this decision to determine if we will adopt a shorter quarantine time.

Attached is the **newly released quarantine information from CDH**. The 14 day quarantine is still considered the best practice and remains the safest way to avoid spreading this virus.

February is Dental Health Month

The American Dental Association celebrates National Children's Dental Health Month in February. Oral health is

an integral part of the overall health of children. Dental caries (tooth decay) is the most common chronic disease of childhood with significant short and long-term consequences. Tooth decay is largely preventable with good oral hygiene:

- Brush all of your teeth (at least) twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste
- Clean between your teeth with floss
- Eat nutritious meals, limit snacking and sugary treats and drinks
- Visit your dentist regularly (twice a year)
- · Check with your dentist about supplemental fluoride and sealants

Young children need help with oral hygiene in order to properly clean every tooth and develop good dental habits. Older children undergoing orthodontic treatment may need reminders about the importance of taking care of their teeth, braces, and appliances. If cared for properly, our teeth can last a lifetime.

Notes from the Counselor

Tips for Dealing with an Angry Child

"Why does my child always have an attitude? She's often disruptive, disrespectful or picking on other children. She's always the one with a chip on her shoulder." This frustrated parent expresses the feelings of many–Why is my child angry and how do I deal with it?

A child who acts out may be expressing other emotions through anger. A youngster may be experiencing a loss, a divorce or a move. A child may be trying to let the world know that his/her life is not what it ought to be. Regardless of the reason, it looks the same. But how can we deal with this angry attitude without being a psychologist?

A Parent's Job is to Understand, Not to Fix Things

Listening for understanding is impossible when a child is "drunk" on anger. Never reason with an angry child. Instead say, "It sounds like you're really mad. I want to listen and understand. I will listen when you're voice is as calm as mine. Come back then." If you can't make the child leave, you leave. Be prepared to repeat your calm statement if the child is determined to yell out the anger without leaving. "Don't worry about it now. We'll talk when you're calm. "You may need to say this several times. Be prepared to play "broken record" with, "what did I say?" Use these phrases instead of reasoning. Reasoning will only fuel the anger.

"Thanks for Sharing That"

Once the child is able to discuss the anger, listen without reasoning. Try to avoid telling the child why he/she should not be angry. Avoid telling them that things will be okay and how to make it better. Your job is to prove that you understand – "It sounds like you get mad when I tell you it's time to do your chores. Thanks for sharing that with me. I'll give it some thought. If you think of a better way for me to remind you, let me know."

Parents Can Make It Worse

Parents who do not treat their children with respect send a message that says, "You're not worthy." These parents often communicate with a lot of yelling. This encourages the child to yell and scream back while the parents retaliate by getting madder. It's a vicious cycle that breeds chronic anger in the child.

In place of anger, parents should work on listening to their children in a non-threatening, honest and open manner. Most children will talk openly only after they truly believe their parents are interested in what they have to say and recognize their feelings.

When Anger Continues

If, despite your best attempts to understand your child's anger, there is no change in behavior after three months, parents should seek professional counseling for their child. In some instances, chronic anger is best helped by a professional.

Never reason with an angry child. Use empathy and understanding instead. "It sounds like you're really mad. I want to listen and understand. And I will listen when your voice is as calm as mine. Come back then."

Usually listening and understanding their point of view is enough for 80% of their mad moments and it stops being a problem. Catching they are upset and letting them know you "get it" is most of the medicine. Give it a try.
