

Thank you to the 98 families for taking the time to fill out the Parent Survey that was sent out last week. We are close to 50% participation and pray to be at 100% by November 30th. Students and staff will participate in a survey next week.

Last week, our visit from Officer Mika to review emergency procedures was postponed. We hope to reschedule him for next week. Once he reviews our procedures and makes recommendations, we will practice Shelter in Place and Lock Down drills with our staff and students. We are hoping to have this completed before December.



# Let's all continue to practice the 3 W's

wash your hands, watch your distance, and wear your mask



Please make sure that your student brings a couple of masks to school each day in case the elastic breaks or one gets dirty. The extra mask should be in a ziploc bag and placed in their backpack.

If your child is wearing a fabric mask, please make sure that you are washing it at least a couple of times per week to kill bacteria and germs that may be present.



We are partnering with the Central District Health to provide free COVID-19 testing for all of our students, faculty and staff. The COVID-19 test is comprised of a saliva based PCR test supplied by VAULT. If you have questions about this test, please contact the School Office @ 208-375-6654 or email schooloffice@stmarksschoolboise.com.

We have created a spreadsheet with weekly updates of COVID information for St. Mark's School, which will be updated automatically with new information. Click here to view the spreadsheet. It is also available for viewing on our website under the COVID Updates/Resources tab.

Please check your children for COVID symptoms before bringing them to school in the morning. Click here for Checklist.

Staying home when sick or awaiting COVID-19 test results - Please keep your child home should they exhibit any symptoms - cough, sore throat, fever, stuffiness, etc. Wait 24 hours to see if the symptoms persist and then have them tested for COVID-19 if your medical provider recommends it. We have convenient FREE Vault PCR Covid tests available to all who wish them in the School Office. Turn around time is 48-72 hours, shorter than many local testing sites today. If your child has been tested and is awaiting results, keep them home AND NOTIFY THE SCHOOL OFFICE THAT YOUR CHILD HAS BEEN TESTED.

# New Pick-Up/Drop-off Procedures Starting Monday

- Starting Monday, November 15<sup>th</sup> ALL students, preK 8<sup>th</sup> grades, will be picked up at the school.
- Please review the attached parking lot maps for more details on class pick-up

locations and on how to proceed through the pick-up areas.

- All middle school students with younger siblings will stand with their youngest sibling's class. Fifth grade will now stand on the island with 4<sup>th</sup> grade.
- It is important that you don't exit your vehicle when in the pick-up lanes. If you need to leave your vehicle please park in a parking spot to do so.
- Parents who choose to park and walk to pick up areas should be mindful not to stand on the sidewalk to allow students to get to their locations. Please wait in the grassy areas.
- Please review the morning drop-off map as more lanes will now be available. Again please don't leave your vehicle unattended.
- Cars will not be able to park in front of the school between 7:30 and 8:05 and 2:30 and 3:15.

Please be patient and expect the process to take 10 – 15 minutes until the new routine is established.

# **Notes from the Nurse**

It is so important to focus on hand washing, because we are now in the midst of cold and flu season. Did you know that handwashing is the number one way to stop the spread of germs? We encourage parents to watch their



children wash their hands in order to see if they are missing anything (Soap? Water? Rub those hands for at least twenty seconds!).

Some of our schools have had Speech and Hearing Screenings this fall. The Saint Alphonsus School Health Program organizes a free speech screening at each of our schools with a certified Speech and Language Pathologist to screen kindergarten students as well as any other students that teachers refer for screening. This is a basic screening that can help point parents to resources that will lead to speech success. Thank you to our Speech and Language Pathologists who volunteered their time for this service!

# **Notes from the Counselor**

How do you want to shift the holidays to a time of connection and peace? There are a few routines that help shift the family to a common orientation to caring for others. These involve noticing what is going well. There are several times a day when you complete a task. Take a few seconds to notice that job is done. Now part two is to attribute it to you as "care." For example, "I washed the dishes because I care about the family." Or "I put the clean laundry away because I care about me." Take the 6 seconds or more to say this to yourself. When you settle into that routine your general mood will calm down. It is easy to notice I care because I am inside me and obviously I am doing good and trying to help. Take a time each day to intentionally insert this into your routine. It will help you set the tone for your mood in a more positive place for the Holiday seasons. The third part of this exercise is to then start saying this out loud to your kids. They don't now what you are thinking if you don't say it to them so this helps them see you are calm and in a grateful mood. That will start calming your kids down too. When you are ready you add the fourth step of stating that about the kids motivation. "I saw you did the dishes for us because you are helping the family, Thank you." Things like catching the kids doing well or doing behaviors right is a good way to catch the virtue being lived. That builds strong disciples in a good way for your family.
