


Welcome to our 42 new families and 6 new staff members

The renewed face of our Middle School and Outdoor Plaza for student security were completed this summer.



FACTS - In order for the nurses and office staff to be able to treat your student(s) if sick or injured, parents must go into their FamilyPortal and update the Medical pages. Two additional pages need to be completed for us to be able to contact families in case of emergency and for someone other than parents to be

able to pick up student(s).

Steps to complete the medical, transportation and emergency contact forms:

- 1. Log into our family portal.
- 2. On the left menu bar, click the down arrow beside the "Apply/Enroll" link.
- 3. Click "enrollment/re-enrollment" and then the blue link.
- 4. As you fill out these forms, please update any other information that may have changed since initially completing the enrollment forms.

• In the River City Church parking lot across Northview.

Parking Lot Reminders

- Please do not exit your vehicle in the pick-up lines. Please find a parking spot if you need to chat with a teacher or staff member.
- Please pull as far forward as possible at drop-off and pick-up. It is not necessary to stop in front of where your child's class is standing. We will send them to you.
- Please don't let your pets out of your vehicle.
- Please be patient. The parking lot usually clears up by 3:10.

Are you keeping track of your Volunteer Hours? You can now keep track of your Volunteer Hours in your FamilyPortal. Remember that 24 hours of volunteer time are required during the school year, 6 of those dedicated to the Dinner Auction and 18 hours that directly benefit the school.

ALL VOLUNTEERS MUST HAVE COMPLETED THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT WORKSHOP (SEW) AND HAVE AN APPROVED BACKGROUND CHECK THROUGH THE DIOCESAN OFFICE.

The first SEW class (for St. Mark's families only) will be held on Wednesday, September 13 @ 6:30 p.m. at the School.

THE COST OF A DIOCESAN BACKGROUND CHECK ranges between \$13.00-\$85.00, depending on several factors including the number of states in which an applicant has lived. Notes from the Nurse

St. Mark's Catholic School Illness Procedure and Response Plan



Children learn best when they are healthy and well-rested. Please, for your child's health and safety, and for the health and safety of others, keep sick kids home. If your child is experiencing any of the symptoms below and these symptoms are not attributable to any other condition they may have, then your child should stay home.

· A temperature of 100.4 or higher without the use of fever reducing medication

- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of appetite
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing OR a change in their cough from baseline for those with allergies/asthma
- New congestion or runny nose OR a change in symptoms from baseline for those with allergies/asthma
- Severe sore throat
- New or unusual onset of severe headache, muscle, or body aches
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
- New or unusual rash
- Pink eye with discharge not associated with diagnosed allergies

A student may return to school when:

- They are asymptomatic or symptoms have significantly improved
- There has been no vomiting, diarrhea, or fever for 24 hours without the use of medication
- They have been evaluated by a healthcare provider and cleared to return to school with a note from the provider
- They have been taking a prescribed medication for impetigo, strep throat, pink eye, or any other communicable conditions for 24 hours or per their healthcare providers instructions/recommendations

Through the St. Alphonsus School Health Program, Mrs. Fuchs, RN, BSN, is at St. Mark's on Thursdays and Mrs. Placido, CNA, SASHP Assistant is here on Tuesdays.

Hello St. Mark's Families -

Welcome to the 2023 - 2024 school year!

I am very excited to be back as the School Counselor for St.Mark's and am excited to start this school year with all of the students! I am looking forward to working with you and your child(ren).

I began at St. Mark's last November and had previously been a teacher in the classroom for 11 years, having taught various grades. My husband and I have four daughters. Our oldest is a freshman at the University of Miami, our next two girls attend Bishop Kelly and our youngest is in 8th grade at St. Joe's.

My goal at St. Mark's is to help our students feel safe, welcome, connected and cared for while at school. I've found this is the best way to help students grow both academically and socially.

Our school counseling program provides services to help students learn and develop to their highest potential. Some of these services include:

- Classroom lessons to help students develop empathy, communication, problem solving and decision making skills. I will be using the Second Step curriculum and the Circle of Grace curriculum, as well as other Social Emotional Learning resources.
- Individual, short term counseling sessions to help students with academics, adjusting to school, social/emotional issues or dealing with specific problems they are experiencing.
- Advocating for student needs and teaching students how to advocate for themselves.
- Working collaboratively with teachers, parents and students to boost student success.
- Providing support to teachers and faculty.
- Providing community resources for children and families in need of support outside of the school.
