# **Letter from our Pastor**

## Dear Families and Friends of St. Mark's,

We are all God's children. But are we not sometimes like that child glued to the tasks of daily living and, more often than not, missing the subtle attempts that God makes to get through to us? We become preoccupied with activity, with consumption, with anxiety, even with our struggles or pains, and fail to hear the voice of the Lord calling us to a moment of peace, a period of rest, an opportunity for grace. That's precisely what the season of Advent offers us—sacred days marked out to draw our attention away from the things that drain our life's spiritual energies and towards the life-giving, grace-filled, divine presence that gives our existence lasting meaning.

Matthew's Gospel dramatically thunders out a call to pay attention to the plan of God through the rather radical character of John the Baptist. John emphatically warns of the dangers of inattention to the Divine through an over-preoccupation with the diversions of the worldly—it is a call to repentance. Repentance is itself a call to humility, an opportunity for spiritual transformation. During this Advent time, the excitement of the secular season is re-translated for us religiously by the scripture readings the Church provides for us. The words of the Prophet Isaiah throughout Advent spark an anticipation of great hope in the Messiah-Savior who is to come. St. Paul reinforces and extends Isaiah's Godly vision, calling for harmony among us in the community. Inherent in these divine messages is the mandate that as followers of Christ we are called to "welcome one another"—once again an invitation to humility over selfrighteousness. We must remind ourselves time and time again that this is God's work we are about, and God's work is always accompanied by His grace. It is grace that draws us and provides us the wisdom to pull ourselves away from the distractions of the world and towards God. It is grace that gifts us with selfknowledge and its concomitant companion humility. It is grace which allows us to recognize our own need for repentance, and it is grace which implants in us the hope for a world of justice and life without division. Ultimately, it is grace that implants in our hearts a longing for the coming (the Advent) of God's Kingdom at Christmas in its fullness at the end of time.


As we light the second candle of the Advent Wreath let us pray for the grace of the season to attract us to its flame, guiding us to pay closer attention to the call of the Lord and thus live with a deeper sense of meaning, a higher level of compassion, and a world-altering vision of hope. 

# **Notes from the Counselor**

#### Hi St. Mark's Parents,

Many parents are concerned about bullying, protecting their kids from it, and making sure their kids aren't engaging in it. But with so much talk about bullying, sometimes we call behavior "bullying" that is actually not. So how can you tell the difference?

I wanted to share the short 5 minute video, "what is bullying", as it can be difficult to define conflict, rude behaviors, mean behaviors and bullying behaviors.

# What is Bullying? - SEL Sketches

CONFLICT	RUDE	MEAN	BULLYING
Occasional	Occasional	Once or Twice	Is REPEATED

#### Rude

Rude is inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone else. In children, this takes the form of social errors like "burping in someone's face, jumping ahead in line, bragging about achieving the highest grade or even throwing a crushed up pile of leaves in someone's face." The critical factor? "Incidents of rudeness are usually spontaneous, unplanned inconsideration, based on thoughtlessness, poor manners or narcissism, but not meant to actually hurt someone."

#### Mean

Being mean involves "purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once (or maybe twice)." Unlike unthinking rudeness, "mean behavior very much aims to hurt or depreciate someone. Very often, mean behavior in kids is motivated by angry feelings and/or the misguided goal of propping themselves up in comparison to the person they are putting down." And while both rudeness and mean behavior require correction, they are "different from bullying in important ways that should be understood and differentiated when it comes to intervention."

### **Bullying**

Bullying is "intentionally aggressive behavior, repeated over time, that involves an imbalance of power. Kids who bully say or do something intentionally hurtful to others and they keep doing it, with no sense of regret or remorse — even when targets of bullying show or express their hurt or tell the aggressors to

stop." There are many kinds of bullying, including physical and verbal aggression, relational aggression (like social exclusion, hazing, or rumor spreading), and cyberbullying. The key aspect to all of them is the ongoing nature of the behavior, which leaves the victims feeling powerless and fearful.

By talking to your child about the differences, you can better identify the offending behavior and take appropriate action.

Our hope is that the more we educate ourselves as parents and our students on bullying behaviors, empowering tools, and how to report bullying to trusted adults, we can prevent bullying behaviors in our school. Please reach out if you have any questions.
