
St Mark's Catholic School is dedicated to educating student disciples in body, mind and spirit, through the collaboration of families, community and the Church.

Letter from our Pastor

Pope Francis' 2024 Lenten message: "Lent is a Season of Conversion, a Time of Freedom"



Pope Francis also underscored the centrality of the desert in the New Testament, observing that on the first Sunday of Lent, we are reminded that Jesus "was driven into the desert by the Spirit in order to be tempted in freedom." "The desert is the place where our freedom can mature in a personal decision not to fall back into slavery. In Lent, we find new criteria of justice and a community with which we can press forward on a road not yet taken," the pope added.

During Lent 2024, the pope has encouraged the faithful to undertake an interior examination by asking: "Do we hear that cry for freedom? Does it trouble us?" "Our Lenten journey will be concrete if, by listening once more to those two questions, we realize that even today we remain under the rule of Pharaoh..." "All too many things keep us apart from each other, denying the fraternity that, from the beginning, binds us to one another." The Lenten season, according to the pope, is a time that is


characterized by personal struggle as we suffer from myriad temptations, but it is the recognition of this that calls us to "pause in prayer, to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of a wounded brother or sister."

Highlighting the three pillars of Lent – prayer, almsgiving, and fasting – the pope noted that they are not disparate acts but form a symbiotic "movement of openness and self-emptying in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us." The pope closed his Lenten message by highlighting the communal aspect of the season, noting, "In the presence of God, we become brothers and sisters, more sensitive to one another: in place of threats and enemies, we discover companions and fellow travelers," he added. "I invite every Christian community to do just this: to offer its members moments set aside to rethink their lifestyles, times to examine their presence in society, and the contribution they make to its betterment."

Summer School Option at BK for graduating 8th graders who have registered at BK

This summer Bishop Kelly will pilot offering in-person, credit bearing classes. In previous years, we have seen many students take these classes online to free up their schedules. These in-person offerings will help students who want to get credit fast and who prefer in-person classes. These offerings will also free up some students to take *other* online classes as we limit students to 6 possible online classes.

Our summer school session will run from June 3-14 for 6.5 hours a day, Monday through Friday. In this 2-week window, registered students will be able to take Speech, Health, or US History 1A.

Classes will cost \$250 plus the payment portal fee, and will be taught by Bishop Kelly instructors. Currently we have Mrs. Stauffer teaching Health, Mrs. Sternling teaching Speech, and Mrs. Allen teaching US History. Registration opens Feb. 16 to all in-coming students. These classes will require a minimum of 12 to run. They will max out at 24 and we will maintain a waiting list. Watch for the link as we expect these to fill fast!


