Letter from our Pastor





Lent is an invitation for purification and renewal. It was the Council of Nicea in 325 AD that mentioned Lent for the first time. This Council is best known for the profession of faith we call the Nicean Creed which is recited at Mass after the homily. This Council

also issued some 20 Canons of a practical nature; the fifth canon speaks of Lent. In this canon Lent is called *tessarakonta* which means forty in Greek. Much earlier, Christians had begun celebrating Easter Sunday commemorating Jesus' resurrection. At that time there used to be some three or four days of preparation commemorating Jesus Passion and Death—the period we now call the Holy week. But the first mention of forty days preparation for Easter comes from the Council of Nicea. The forty days were in imitation of the forty days Jesus spent in the desert before beginning his public ministry. The English word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word meaning to 'lengthen,' for Lent comes at a time when, as spring approaches, daytime lengthens, or becomes longer. So Lent was seen as a time for us to "lengthen *spiritually*", to stretch out and grown in the spirit. Lent is a season for repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock. It is an occasion for us to examine the quality of our Christian life, of our adherence to Jesus and his teaching and of our concern for our needy sisters and brothers. Thus after living a proper Christian life, we contemplate and celebrate Christ as the Light at the Easter Vigil and we renew our baptismal vows. Hence this period leads truly to a renewal of life and commitment. As we are in the Holy Season may we discover the true meaning of LENT, by leaving behind all negative things of the past and striving for a future filled with Hope! A Different Approach to Fasting... Our fasts have a tendency to be oriented toward things like giving up food or television. But there are many other creative ways fasting can help us welcome Jesus' healing touch.

Here are seven suggestions you may want to consider:

1. Fast from anger and hatred. Give your family an extra dose of love each day.

2. Fast from judging others. Before making any judgments, recall how Jesus overlooks our faults.

3. Fast from discouragement. Hold on to Jesus' promise that He has a perfect plan for our life.

4. Fast from complaining. When you find yourself about to complain, close our eyes and recall some of the many little moments of joy Jesus has given you.

5. Fast from resentment or bitterness. Work on forgiving those who may have hurt you.

6. Fast from spending too much money. Try to reduce your spending by ten percent and give those savings to the poor.

7. Fast from Social Media. How much time we waste when we could be praying instead.

Wishing you all Peace this Lent!







Notes from the Counselor

Hello St. Mark's Families -

I recently visited middle school and asked the students three questions that they anonymously answered and recorded on a note card.

- What do you wish your parents really knew or understood about you or about being a middle schooler?
- What do you wish your teachers really knew or understood about you or being a middle schooler?

• What do you wish your fellow classmates really knew or understood about being you or being a middle schooler?

The conversations we had about the answers to all three of these questions were very spirited and open. Students heard common themes among each other and really connected with almost all of the answers their classmates gave.

I wanted to share some of the responses that the students gave about what they wish their parents knew or understood about being middle schoolers. I have an 8th grade daughter myself so some of these were very good for me to read and reflect upon.

"I wish my parents knew how hard friendships are."

"I wish my parents understood that we don't have to be mini thems."

"I wish my parents knew how much I love them."

"It's hard to hear when you compare me to other kids."

"I wish my parents knew how hard I work during the day and the anxiety it has on me."

"I'm trying."

"I wish they knew how hard everything is like sports and school and homework all together. And I wish they came into my room and asked if I needed help. And I wish they didn't think I am always on my phone."

"I wish they understood that just because I don't care as much as you when I lose doesn't mean I don't care about the sport at all."

"I wish my parents knew that sometimes I just want to be alone in my room." "I wish they knew how hard I work, how much I love them and how much I want to make them proud."

"I wish my parents understood that when I talk to them I want them to really listen and pay attention to what I am saying."

"I wish my parents understood that nothing gets better when they yell."

"I wish my parents understood that I am burnt out and I don't want to do all these sports and that I"M NOT PERFECT and I can't get straight A's."

"I wish they understood how important it is for me to be with my friends."

"It's too late to say 'You don't need to be perfect.' You raised me with high standards and weren't happy when I didn't meet them. Now I have high standards for <u>myself</u> and get upset <u>at myself</u> for not living up to them."

"I wish they understood that we love them a lot more than they know."
