
St Mark's Catholic School is dedicated to educating student disciples in body, mind and spirit, through the collaboration of families, community and the Church.

Letter from our Pastor

Dear Families and Friends of St. Mark's,





"Dust thou art and unto dust thou shalt return."

These words spoken for the 1st time by God to Adam after he sinned, are repeated today by the Church to every Christian, to remind us of 2 fundamental truths—our nothingness and the reality of death. The ashes remind us of our end. The priest places them on our foreheads in the sign of the Cross as an exterior sign of our interior desire for conversion. The 40 days of Lent remind us that we were drawn from nothing by God, by His infinite love which willed to communicate His life to us. But because of sin, we cannot be united to him without passing through the dark reality of death. Death is the consequence and punishment for sin. Bitter and painful as it is, Jesus who wanted to be like us in all things, in submitting to His sacrificial death on the Cross has given to Christians the strength to accept our crosses and even our death out of love. So, during Lent, it is a good thing to reflect upon our own mortality, not to distress us, but to arouse us to doing good. Death places before our eyes the vanity of life and the brevity of earthly things. All things are passing, God alone remains. Therefore we are urged to die to self before we die. To detach ourselves from everything, all earthly satisfactions and to seek God alone. Remembering that we have only one soul, one life to live, one death to die, and that we must, in the end, relinquish everything that has no eternal value. As St. John of the Cross wrote: "In the evening of our lives we will be judged by love". Lent is the opportunity God gives us, once again, to prove our sincerity of heart, that we truly love Him more than ourselves, and more than the things of this world.

So, Lent invites us to repent, to do penance, and to actively work for our own conversion, so we might atone for the many sins we have committed. The purpose of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, indeed, of any physical mortification is humility, recognition of our faults, compunction of heart, and the reform of our lives. So that we might, by God's mercy and grace, attain heaven and avoid hell. As in the Gospel, these must be accomplished sincerely and joyfully, recognizing that God is giving us a second chance, like Peter after denying Him thrice, like the thief asking to be with the Lord in paradise. Let us all resolve, here and now, to make this the best Lent of our lives.

Doors open at 5 pm

Boise Centre Downtown Room 400 in the East Wing

Guests will need to take the elevator to the 2nd level and then follow the escalators upstairs. This way they can register at Room 440 and then continue toward the ballroom for the event. Room 440 is also where guests will go at the end of the event for auction check out and to pick up their coats.

<u>Dress for the Night:</u> Many guests like to dress up for the evening, come in formal wear, a costume, or something related to the theme. Be fun and creative, but in good taste, please.

What should I expect while I am there? Registration begins at 5 pm, from 5 to 7 we will have the silent auction portion of the evening, guests will be able to wander around socialize, listen to live music, bid on items, enter raffles, play games, enjoy having their picture taken, sample wonderful foods and desserts (see below for more details). This year guests will be able to leave their mark on our St. Mark's live painting happening during the event and later auctioned off during the live portion of the event. Around 7 pm the silent auction portion of the evening will close, everyone will be called to their tables for welcoming, prayer by Father, and the dinner portion of the evening begins. There will be games and announcements before the 8 pm live auction and the paddles-up portion of the evening in which we will be raising funds towards a newer bus for the school. After the Live auction concludes we ask guests to make their way to the exits to check out and/or to head down the hall to ballroom 420 for the afterparty which includes dancing and the Queen of Hearts Tournament (see below for more details).

<u>Parking:</u> There are many parking centers in and near the Centre. Provide extra time to park and walk a short distance to the Centre. Please obey all parking laws and requirements. There are also Uber, Lyft, and other transportation companies that can take you to and from the Centre.

<u>To Bid Online:</u> What if I want to be able to bid on items but not attend the event? Go to our website https://stmarksschool.schoolauction.net/bloom and choose the option Signup rather than Tickets. This will allow you to create an account to bid. Please note that not all items are available online. One of the many perks of attending in person is the ability

to bid on all the items including class projects and baskets.

<u>Games and Raffles:</u> This year we will have our usual raffles, Best of Live, and A Years Tuition. Notes from the Nurse





The month of February is American Heart Month #HeartMonth. A time when we can all focus on our heart health, understanding our risk factors for heart disease and ways to live a heart-healthy lifestyle. Hypertension or high blood pressure is the leading risk factor for heart disease and stroke for both men and women. A CDC study from 2017 showed 1 in 25 individuals ages 12 to 19 years old already have hypertension, and 1 in 10 individuals have

prehypertension. So, living a heart-healthy lifestyle is important for all ages

^{*}Understand your risk factors - see your Dr for your annual visit, check your blood pressure and cholesterol

^{*}Eat well balanced meals that include fruits and vegetables and limit saturated fats and added

sugars

- *Engage in regular exercise approximately 30+minutes 5 x day of walking, running, biking, swimming, or time at the gym.
- *Reduce Stress meditation & prayer
- *Get good sleep- school age children (6-12) need 9-12 hours a night, while adults need 7-9 hours a night

Notes from the Counselor

Hello St. Mark's Families -

As we enter into the month of February, we look at ways of expressing and showing love to those around us. I thought it would also be a great time for us to reflect on how we best express and show our love to our children in ways they find most meaningful.

Many of you are probably familiar with Dr. Gary Chapman's book *The Five Love Languages*. Although originally designed for couples, Dr. Chapman has a theory about adults expressing and experiencing love in the same five ways but having one specific way that matters to them most.

This can also apply to children and teens. Because of this, Dr. Chapman later wrote *The Five Love Languages of Children*. He believes that we have to know how to communicate love to a child so that he/she genuinely feels loved. As I reflect on my own four daughters, I can easily depict which love language is the one that matters most to each of them.

Listed below are the five ways your child might show and receive love. I invite you to explore which love language more closely fits with your child.

Physical Touch

This may include hugging, kissing, holding hands, or having a secret handshake with your child. Snuggling on the couch, having your child sit on your lap, scratching their back or playing with their hair are also common ways that children enjoy connecting through physical touch.

Receiving Gifts

Some children truly feel loved when receiving gifts from their parents. These do not have to be expensive gifts but can be as simple as stickers or dollar store items. The children who truly value this love language may tend to care how a present is wrapped and often remembers who gave them what for a very long time after receiving a gift. Children may also have a hard time throwing things away or donating things that they have been given because those gifts mean so much to them, even if they haven't been looked at or played with in a long time.

Words of Affirmation

Loving words, little notes in their lunchboxes or sweet feedback/praise is how these children feel most loved. Hearing their parents publicly acknowledge or praise them in front of others is also another way they feel most connected and loved. For these children, it is very important to use the simple phrase "I love you" instead of "I love you, but...."

Acts of Service

While acts of service seem like a normal expression of love between adults and couples, it may sound strange for a child to have this be the one that they connect with most. Children appreciate a kind and special gesture like warming their towel in the dryer on an unusually cold morning/night or turning their morning pancakes into something cute and funny using strawberries and whipped cream.

Quality Time

Quality time can include anything from doing a puzzle, watching a weekly show, cooking in the kitchen, running errands, reading a book next to each other or just laying on the bed talking. The key is that you are

doing it together with your child. The children whose love language is quality time just want to be in your presence.
