## **Letter from our Pastor**

## Dear Families and Friends of St. Mark's,

As the Paschal Mystery is fast approaching, the Passion and Death of the Lord, I would like to offer you a reflection on the meaning of the Sign of the Cross.



The ancients said there were **four basic elements** comprising the world: earth, air, fire, and water. By far the most basic and abundant is water. Comparatively, there are many **spiritual elements** or gestures (kneeling symbolizing adoration, folded hands symbolizing prayer, bowing symbolizing reverence, etc.) but by far the most basic and frequent holy gesture we make is the Sign of the Cross. **Pope Benedict XVI wrote:** "The most basic Christian gesture in prayer is and always will be the Sign of the Cross." It is the most common prayer of Christians since the founding of the Church. It was their favorite devotion because it required no special knowledge or skill. You didn't have to be able to read or write to make it or understand it. **Martyrs** made it when taken to their death. It was both a public and a secret sign between Christians. Even the apostate emperor Julian used to sign it when feeling oppressed by demons.

Over the centuries the faithful have developed many ways of making the Sign of the Cross. It is a sort of mini-catechesis.


During this season of Lent and always, may the Sign consecrate your day, and let it sanctify the moment.





## **Notes from the Counselor**

**Next week is Spring Break.** Here are some tips you can use when your children are home on break from the Love and Logic Files:

## The parent's real job

I believe my job as a parent is to help a totally dependent little baby gradually develop into a totally independent adult. I'm usually given 18 years to get the job done. I am on target if I allow more and more independence so that the child makes most of his or her own decisions during the last three years in the home during high school.

The best way to do this is by running your home like the real world. You provide your child with opportunities to practice decision making and then live with the consequence of those decisions both good and bad. Wise parents start this process early by giving choices that have fairly minor consequences. They gradually move on to choices with more severe or complex consequences. These parents teach their children that they have personal power over their destiny.

This approach also builds strength by allowing the child to struggle. Research shows that children who are denied the right to struggle in the early years are at high risk for suicide or other self-destructive behaviors. Children who are allowed to struggle and overcome adversity learn that they are much more in control of the quality of their lives.

What would you like to pick as one thing to let your child struggle figuring out over spring break? Remember a small and consistent task is better to practice on.
