### Letter from our Pastor

Dear Families and Friends of St. Mark's,

Happy Easter to you all! Alleluia!



The wonder of this day is that it isn't *one* day at all—the celebration of Easter is prolonged throughout the Easter Season—the 50 days from today, from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. From now on, all Sundays are celebrated as one continuous feast day, *"the great Sunday."* For every Sunday commemorates this day of the Lord's Resurrection. *Mary Magdalen "saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb."* She, of course, is Mary of Magdala, who, along with the holy women had laid Jesus' lifeless body in the tomb. It was early morning, and she didn't expect the dawn of hope, but rather, the beginning of endless sorrow. Her *biggest worry*—indeed, the only thing her grief would allow her to concentrate on was—who would roll the stone away so she could anoint the body. **"And behold she saw the stone removed from the tomb."** That stone, situated at the entrance of Our Lord's tomb was a silent witness not only to the death of the Son of Man *but through endless ages—to the death of all men.* For it is behind *the stone,* in the tomb, that the process of death takes place—that is, of human beings being formed of dust returning to the dust. The stone testifies to this terrible reality but also to the truth that only God can remove it. It is a piece of hard evidence that can neither be ignored, nor explained away.

Mary runs to the disciples and says, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him..." Peter and John run to the tomb and see the linens without a body. They saw and realized that death itself had not been able to conquer Jesus, the Resurrection, and the Life. The builders of this world had conspired and killed Him—but "The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone." The stone of death has been removed. "This is the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes." The Church joyfully repeats today the words of the angels spoken on that bright new morning. He who died on the Cross is alive and now reveals the fullness of Life to us. As St. John Paul II said: "Christ rose again so that man could find the true meaning of existence, so that man could live his *own life fully, so that man, who comes from God, could live in God.*" Henceforth, let us all now live as new creations with Christ as the Cornerstone of our lives!

Alleluia! He is Risen!

### **Student Recognition Program**

#### **Cardinal Virtues**

As part of our accreditation action plan, we want to increase our understanding of Catholic virtues and recognize students who exemplify them. Our Lion P.R.I.D.E. emphasizes the virtues of perseverance, respect, integrity, discipleship, and excellence.

We are now introducing the cardinal virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude, and Temperance. At the end of each quarter, teachers select one of their students who exemplifies the cardinal virtue of the quarter. The student will be recognized at Mass with a certificate and announced in our Friday Facts.

While P.R.I.D.E. tickets are given immediately when staff witness a student showing a virtue in action, the recognition for students exemplifying a cardinal virtue, will be awarded to students who consistently practice it throughout the quarter.

During the third quarter, teachers looked for students who exemplified prudence. Prudence is the virtue by which we discern what would be the correct action in any given situation. To prevent an impulsive decision, a prudent person will take the time to consider all possible options and their outcomes.

Students who were selected during the third quarter will be announced after Mass on April 8th, and their pictures will be posted on Friday Facts.

During the fourth-quarter, teachers will be choosing students who show Fortitude.

### **Volunteer Opportunities**



### **Notes from the Counselor**

Today is Good Friday and we are in the Easter Triduum. This weekend is Easter, it is time to remember

all the things we can be thankful for. Did you know that research supports that Gratitude is as effective as Pharmaceuticals to treat depression? **Gratitude is a good heart and soul medication.** 

Here is an example of how the Saints treat depression. You start your day with a reflection on God creating the universe and wanting you to be here at this time in this family in this country. Then look at all the things that exist in the world. They are being held in existence by God for you to be able to have today. Now from this point of view you have God loving and wanting you here so that you can choose to go to heaven and be with him there forever. Today when you face choices and struggles during your day recall that God is right beside you watching and helping. Start talking to him as a good friend who is willing to go through everything by your side. It may help to ask yourself 3 questions: 1 Is God aware of everything that is going on in my life at this moment? 2 Is God able to have a plan for how to get through this moment safely? 3 Is God able to handle this problem in my life? The answer of course is" yes" to all three questions. Taking the time to reflect on those answers and the perspective of God being with you as a loving partner is a good way to reduce your worry, your depression, and your frustration. Take some time to ponder this over this Easter weekend and notice what a difference it makes in your life. As with all tools this takes practice and repetition. Happy Easter.
