


to help our neighbors in need!

Who is Eligible?


ALL Idaho students Kindergarten through grade 12 regardless of whether they attend a public school, private school, or are homeschooled.

Income eligibility is based on the parent or guardian's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for the prior year as verified by the Idaho Tax Commission.

Notes from the Nurse

November is National Diabetes Month. Whether or not you or one of your loved ones have diabetes, it probably affects someone you know. 1 in 10 people in America have Diabetes. A healthy diet and regular exercise is so important for those who have diabetes, but also is important in preventing Type 2



Diabetes. As it is getting colder, it is important to look at our exercise and eating goals, whether bundling up and walking along the Greenbelt, swimming at the YMCA, or joining an exercise class. We are already in the midst of the cold and flu season, and we are thankful for the flu shots given at each of our schools in October. If your child missed having a flu shot, it is not too

late to get one from your healthcare provider or pharmacy. Flu shots especially help to protect your child, the elderly, and the immunocompromised. Also, it is important to take care of immune systems by focusing on getting enough sleep, eating lots of fruits and vegetables, limiting sugar intake, and decreasing stress through exercise and fun activities.

Growing Up in the Digital Age

Are you watching kids scroll through life, with their rapid-fire thumbs and a six-second attention span? Physician and filmmaker Delaney Ruston saw that with her own kids and learned that the average kid spends 6.5 hours a day looking at screens. She wondered about the impact of all this time and about the friction occurring in homes and schools around negotiating screen time—friction she knew all too well.

In SCREENAGERS, as with her award-winning documentaries on mental health, Delaney takes a deeply personal approach as she probes into the vulnerable corners of family life, including her own, to explore struggles over social media, video games, academics and internet addiction. Through poignant, and unexpectedly funny stories, along with surprising insights from authors, psychologists, and brain scientists, SCREENAGERS reveals how tech time impacts kids' development and offers solutions on how adults can empower kids to best navigate the digital world and find balance.
