

Notes from the Nurse

<u>Vision and Screening</u> - A vision screening is scheduled at St. Marks School October 24, 2023. Your school nurse will screen Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th grades using the Plusoptix vision screener provided by Envision. This vision



screening will not provide a diagnosis, only a **Pass** or **Refer** result. Screenings help us to identify potential vision problems and are not intended to replace an evaluation by a primary care provider. Please reach out to your school nurse or front desk staff if you wish for your child not to be screened or have questions.

Hearing Screening - A hearing screening is scheduled for Kindergarten at St. Marks School on October 24, 2023. This screening doesn't provide a diagnosis, just a **Pass** or **Refer** result. Identifying hearing difficulties early on can assist in providing the best resources to ensure academic performance, speech, language, and social skills are not affected. This screening is not intended to replace and evaluation by a primary care giver. Please reach out to your school nurse or front desk staff if you wish for your child not to be screened or have questions.

Through the St. Alphonsus School Health Program, Mrs. Bostenero, RN, BSN, is at St. Mark's on Mondays and Wednesdays, Mrs. Fuchs, RN, BSN, is at St. Mark's on Thursdays and Mrs. Placido, CNA, SASHP Assistant is here on Tuesdays.

Notes from the Counselor

Hello St. Mark's Families -

As you know, parent teacher conferences are next week! It is such a great time to connect with your child's teacher(s). Below are a few tips to make the most of your time together.

Before the conference

- Look over schoolwork.
 - Take some time to look over the schoolwork your child has already brought home. How does it look like your child is doing? Is the homework too easy or too hard? Is there anything your child is struggling with from your standpoint?
- Talk with your child.
 - Get a sense from your child how the school year is going. Who are the kids your child talks about the most at home? Is there anything he/she would like you to talk to the teacher about?
- Make a list of questions.
 - Thinking about the first quarter of school, are there things you still need clarification on? Are there specific things that helped your child thrive in school in the past?
 - Put your questions or concerns in order of importance so that you can cover the biggest things first.

At the conference

- Be on time.
 - Conferences run on such a tight schedule. You don't want to miss any time with your child's teacher.
- Stay calm.
 - It's important to keep your emotions in check during the conference, even if your child is struggling with something or you disagree with the teacher.
- Figure out the next steps.
 - Save a few minutes at the end of the conference for next steps. How and when can you keep communicating with the teacher about certain issues that were discussed at the conference?

After the conference

- Update your child.
 - Talk to your child about the conference. It is important to share anything positive that you and the teacher discussed. It is also important not to shy away from discussing problems or challenges. If there are next steps, be sure to let your child know what they entail.
- Follow up.
 - If you and the teacher agreed on next steps, follow up in the next week or so to see how things are working out.

Our St. Mark's teachers are so caring, loving and dedicated to all of our students! Enjoy your conference time.
