Hello St. Mark's Parents and Students,

I am excited to announce that we are offering informational talks beginning Monday night, September 11th at 6:30 pm in Donoghue Hall which will dive deeper into different aspects of the Eucharist.



Join us for any or all of these topics to learn more about our faith. No need to RSVP, Just add them to your calendar and show up to the ones that interest you!

The schedule is as follows:

- September 11th- Deacon Chris Privon will present "The Jewish Roots of the Eucharist."
- September 18th- He will follow up with " **The Eucharist in the New Testament**". If you have ever heard him preach or participated in his bible classes, you know he is excellent, thorough, and engaging.
- September 25th- Fr. Paul will delve into the "**Theology of the Eucharist**," that is the dogmas or what the Church has officially taught from the earliest times. For example, the real presence and transubstantiation will be examined among other important points.
- October 2nd- Hitting a very practical note, Fr. Paul will do his best to lead us on " A Walk
 Through the Mass" in the church sanctuary itself. This is something that could be very helpful for
 all of us!
- October 9th- By Fr. Johannes of Verbum Spei's exposition on the practice of " **Adoration: How to Make a Holy Hour**" (to be held in the church as well.) As you may or may not know, his religious community could be considered "expert" in this area.
- October 16th- We will examine some amazing "Eucharistic Miracles—Past & Present". In

- preparation for this talk, Salt & Light Radio's banners on the subject will grace our narthex.
- October 23rd- As a faithful son of Poland, Fr. Adrian, will speak on " **St John Paul II's Teaching on the Eucharist**", a subject near and dear to his heart.
- October 30th- Juliet Jones, along with some parishioners will convey their RCIA experience as a "Journey to the Eucharist." Their testimonies are indeed powerful.
- November 6th- Ginger, Angela, and Rose from our Faith Formation Program will give us a wonderful perspective (especially important to parents!) entitled, "Let the Little Children Come Unto Me." In other words, how to present the Eucharist to children and youth, from the first years to teenagerdom. I am especially looking forward to this one.
- November 13th- Deacon Ed Herrera, our newly ordained permanent deacon, will present " The Eucharist: Service and Evangelization." After all, we are meant to leave Mass, ready to share the Good News, in service of one another.
- November 20th- Deacon Pete Lauder and his wife Jan will be presenting their well-researched and fascinating talk on "**The Shroud of Turin**" and how it relates specifically to the Eucharist.



We still have almost 50% of our parents who haven't logged into their FamilyPortal and completed their Medical Forms. WE CANNOT TREAT YOUR CHILD, whether sick or injured, if you have not completed this information.

Steps to complete the medical, transportation and emergency contact forms:

- 1. Log into our family portal.
- 2. Scroll down on the left menu bar to "Apply/Enroll", click the down arrow beside the "Apply/Enroll" link.
- 3. Click "enrollment/re-enrollment" and then the blue link "Click here to Open Enrollment".
- 4. As you fill out these forms, please update any other information that may have changed since initially completing the enrollment forms. Make sure to go through all the navy tabs on the left side of the screen and finish with the tab "Electronic Signature Page".
- 5. To review your Packet, click on the last tab "Electronic Packet Review".

Parents can download the FACTS Family app from the apple store or google play and pay \$4.99/year for this access or you can just use Facts Family Portal in a browser on a mobile device.

Volunteer Hour Log in FamilyPortal

- Log into your account
- On the left side of page, click on Family
- Click on Family Home
- On the right side of page, is a box entitled Service Hours
- Click on Add+ in the top right of box. Add date of service, time spent, an explanation of the volunteer activity and any additional information you can provide.

To update your information in your FamilyPortal account, such as address, phone numbers, Emergency Contacts, Medical and Transportation, log into your FamilyPortal account. On the left side of the page, click on "Web Forms" then in the middle of the page click on "Family Demographic Form". From there you will see the tabs to click to update your information. Thank you for keeping this information up to date.

At Drop Off before 7:45 a.m., students are to report to the gym without parents entering the building. After 7:45 a.m., students are to go through the wrought iron Middle School gate directly to playground.



If parents arrive at school at 3:15 or later to pick up your student in K-8, you will pick them up from Homework Club. Go to the west end of the building and ring the doorbell.



One live Safe Environment Workshop has been completed in person, then an annual online renewal each year after that is required by the Diocese of Boise.
