

<u>Medical/Dental Appointments</u> -Medical/dental appointments should, whenever possible, be made outside the school day. When an appointment can be made at no other time, requests for school absences will be honored. Please provide advanced notice of the appointment to the school office either by telephone call, e-mail, or written note. The student will be released from class only after the parent/ guardian arrives at St. Mark's Catholic School or you may call the school office 10 minutes before you arrive and the student will be called to the office. A doctor's note is required upon the student's return to school. Tardiness - Punctual arrival at school is important. Students shall be considered tardy if they are not in their classroom prior to the starting time. If a child will be late, please contact the office via telephone or email. Students who are tardy are expected to sign in at the office prior to heading to their classroom. Failure to check in at the office will be marked absent for the day.

Tardies are tracked on a quarterly basis. Students will serve a lunch detention / or pay a \$10 fine after accumulating 3 unexcused tardies within a guarter. Repeated unexcused tardies in all grades will result in appropriate action by the administration.

Notes from the Nurse

Medicine

For students requiring prescription medication at school, a parent/guardian must bring the original prescription bottle (with prescription attached) to the school office and sign a medication authorization form which will be placed on file.



If a student is to receive an over-the-counter medication (i.e. Tylenol, Advil, cough drops) at school, a parent/guardian must complete medication pages in their FamilyPortal account to allow the office staff or school nurses to administer the medication.

Through the St. Alphonsus School Health Program, **Mrs. Bostenero**, RN, BSN, is at St. Mark's on Mondays and Wednesdays, **Mrs. Fuchs**, RN, BSN, is at St. Mark's on Thursdays and **Mrs. Placido**, CNA, SASHP Assistant is here on Tuesdays.

Notes from the Counselor

Did you know there are 5 levels of behavior contracting with your children. Here is the template:

Level 1: Is it a problem? Level 2: Do you want to do something about it? Level 3: Are you willing to do the easy things to solve it? Level 4: Are you willing to do the hard work to solve it? Level 5: Are you willing to do the hard work someone else's way?

Using this template, you can check where your child is in their follow through. When you get to level 5 you will have success. If the child is at level 1 or 2 they don't want to do anything about it, they are just noisy and letting you know there is something bothering them. At this point you can listen and agree it is painful or difficult. You are matching their emotion with empathy to understand they are having a hard time. This is heart language for "I care." Now, the good news is that just giving that I care message takes care of 80% of the kids level 1 and 2 problems. So you don't have to solve that issue any longer.

If they agree it is a problem and they are at level 3, you can inquire about what they want to do about it. Then again empathize and have them let you know want to know how that works out for them. Again this lets you give a "I care" message with less solving on your part. If they come back with level 4 problems, you can again ask them what they want to do about it and how that will work out. This is because they are starting to think and having them visualize the consequences is a useful tool to decide before I do it if that solution is worth it.

When they get to level 5 they are at a point when they tried all the things they could think of and still have the problem. It is good to ask them what they tried so far and how it worked out. Then you are not stuck with telling them something they already did. Now you can pull on your wisdom or the wisdom of other friends, family, or professionals if needed to come up with a plan that has more chance of success. The advantage is that you have more experience than your child at life and can do the research if needed to solve the problem. The idea with this template is that you don't have to solve the problem until the child knows they can not solve it and they are asking for help. This means they will not fight you to solve the problem anymore. Good luck in guiding your child to solve the problems more of the time. That is training them to be big (ready for adult life) and they want that and so do you.
