Our Lady of Fatima showed the three little shepherd children a vision of people falling into hell, mostly because of the sin of impurity. If this was the case in 1917, we can only imagine how it is nowadays! The modern world seems to be drowning in a tsunami of impurity, especially through the different forms of electronic media.

Notes from the Counselor

Riding the "Struggle Bus" is a phrase that was used in our house as part of the love and logic parenting with our children. One of the principles of Love and Logic parenting is that I am training myself to parent in a new way as much as I am training the children to act in a new way. I found this out back when I was a young parent trying to do things differently than when I was raised. My parents used yelling to get things done and I did not like that mode. So, when I learned about Love and Logic, I was so excited that I took it home and tried it all right away. Then when it did not work, I was frustrated. I then had to try again but this time I just put one thing into practice until I got how to use it.

The way to raise success in your parenting is to pick one thing that is consistently happening at your house like doing the dishes in the evening. We focused on that as our "training time." We set up a plan to make it a struggle for the kids not for us. We picked a date to do the training. We had the daycare mom not give them as much of a snack so the kids were hungry for dinner. We went to KFC and ordered dinner. Then we took the meal home with mom holding the food. The kids were saying they were so hungry they could really eat a lot. Then we walked into the kitchen and acted shocked that the dishes were not done from the previous night. Then stated that our child had to finish his chore from last night before he got dinner. He did not have to worry we would save the food for him. Then there was a 15 minute meltdown. We held on to the plan and ate in the dining room away from the kitchen table. Then we heard the cleaning of dishes and them being put into the dishwasher. Then he asked us to come check the kitchen was clean. We did and then he got his dinner. He ate his entire dinner that night. He had successfully ridden the "Struggle bus" and learned that it was more fun for him if he did his chores when he was asked instead of having to wait to get his dinner. This was a relief for us as parents that our child could learn in one or two tries most of the things we taught him about life.

Then we could shift to the next topic to train with the "Struggle bus." Pretty soon we learned the new way of parenting without yelling and he learned to do things when he was asked instead of avoiding or fighting with us. Give it a try yourself. The steps are simple:

Give your child a task to do that they can handle. (Put the dishes in the dishwasher) Expect they will have a "Struggle". (Meltdown, negotiate, promise to do it later, etc.) Then let their Struggle and your empathy do the teaching. (You can say, "Take your time and we will have your food for you as soon as you finish.") Finally, give the same task again. (He gets to do the dishes again another night).

The training in self-discipline takes time but it puts the fun back in parenting again.
