Dear St. Mark's Lions

Last Friday as we gathered for our first School Mass of the 2025-2026 Academic Year, we celebrated the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. This Friday, one week later, we celebrate the Queenship of Mary. This beautiful liturgical day was formally established by Pope Plus the XII in 1954 through his encyclical *Ad Caeli Reginam*. These two consecutive feast days are also recognized as the 4th and 5th decades of the Glorious Mysteries when we pray the Rosary.



Jesus gave us his mother as our own mother as he hung upon the cross (John 19.26). We look to Mary as the model of the perfect human life. This week's highlight: Hair Policy ➤

We know summer is a fun time to try out new looks, but as we return to school, we ask families to help students follow our guidelines so everyone comes to class ready to learn:






The time spent qualifies as parish ministry hours toward Active Parishioner status. Time can also be claimed as volunteer hours.







**Notes from the Nurse** 



The Saint Alphonsus School Health program will offer Vision Screenings the week of August 25th for **kindergarten**, **1st**, **3rd**, **5th**, **and 7th grade students**.

This screening is performed by the school nurse with a Plusoptix Vision Screener from Envision. Your child will simply stand still and focus on the happy face printed on the front of the machine while it performs the reading.


IMPORTANT: The vision screening will **not** provide a diagnosis. The screening will provide a PASS or REFER result. You will receive a paper referral if your child received a REFER result.

Screenings are designed to determine if irregularities exist or are detected in the participants vision that should be referred for professional evaluation and further diagnostic consideration.

#### Screening Measurements:

#### Vision:

- Sphere- checking the participant for Hyperopia (farsighted), Myopia (nearsighted).
- Cylinder- checking the participant for astigmatism (corneal irregularity).
- Corneal reflex- checking the participant for symmetric reflexes (do the eyes work together).
- Pupil diameter- when the pupil in the right and left eye differ (inherited or symptom of eye disease may be present).

I began at St. Mark's three years ago and had previously been a teacher in the classroom for 11 years, having taught various grades. My husband and I have four daughters. - Classroom lessons to help students develop empathy, communication, problem solving and decision making skills
  - I will be using the Second Step curriculum and the Circle of Grace curriculum, as well as other Social Emotional Learning resources.
- Individual, short term counseling sessions to help students with academics, adjusting to school, social/emotional issues or dealing with specific problems they are experiencing
- Advocating for student needs and teaching students how to advocate for themselves
- Working collaboratively with teachers, parents and students to boost student success
- Providing support to teachers and faculty
- Providing community resources for children and families in need of support outside of our school
