State of Idaho Policy Highlight

The State of Idaho recently enacted the **Idaho Parental Choice Tax Credit Program** (House Bill 93), which provides financial support for families seeking educational services that best meet their children's needs. The refundable tax credit offers nearly \$50 million in state funds to help full-time Idaho residents pay for eligible nonpublic school expenses.

The program is available for:

• K-12 students (ages 5-18): up to \$5,000 per eligible student

• Students with qualifying disabilities (ages 5–21): up to \$7,500 per eligible student

If you are interested in applying, you must create a TAP (Taxpayer Access Point) account by December 1, 2025 to be eligible for the program.
