
St. Mark's Catholic School is a ministry of St. Mark's Catholic Community that fosters academic excellence, rooted in the Catholic faith, and Christian values.

Dear families of St. Mark's

This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross.

This feast day celebrates three key history dates:



**320 A.D** The discovery of the cross upon which Jesus was crucified. It was found by Helena, the mother of emperor Constantine.

**335 A.D.** The dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (Jesus tomb).

**628 A.D.** The recovery of the true cross that had been taken by invading Persian armies.

For Christians, the Roman cross (invented as an implement of capital punishment and extreme shame) is instead a symbol of salvation and joy. Jesus rose from the dead, and because of his work on the cross, those who acknowledge him as Lord and Savior, those who submit their lives to following his teaching, are promised eternal life with him. Jesus overcame the world, and all the disorder of the world. He defeated death itself.

We embrace the cross. We pick up our individual "crosses" each day, bearing hardship, seeking to assist others, and working to boldly proclaim the truth of Christ crucified and risen to a confused and doubting world

#### **Notes from the Counselor**

#### Gain control by giving some up.

Many adults spend considerable energy trying to control their children. This is only natural. When we see our children out of control, it makes us feel like bad parents.

In fact, there are few things more pathetic than a child out of control. This scares parents and children alike. A child who knows that he is out of control feels insecure. He puts on a tough exterior. But his actions are easy to misread because they appear to say that he cannot and will not be controlled. He needs limits, but, at the same time, fights them.

In these situations, parents can gain control by giving away some control. A small miracle takes place when children are given alternatives rather than orders.

This technique reduces stress in families while preparing children to make decisions that affect their lives. It provides them with wonderful preparation for the adult world in which they will have to live.

Consider the following example of a parent, who, in giving some control to his child, gains more control for himself:

The youngster is making too much noise in the family room. The typical parental response might be, "Quit making so much noise! You're making me mad!" This response is usually not effective since it gives the child the wrong kind of control. He feels that he now has the power to make his parent mad.

This parent, however, gives the child some positive control over his life by offering him alternatives: "You can either stay here with us and be quiet or go somewhere else and make noise." A determined youngster may fight this by saying, "I'm staying here! I have just as many rights as the rest of the family!" The parents calm reply is simply, "That's not one of the options. But feel welcome to come back when you stop making noise."

Providing alternatives is based on the concept that people cannot make decisions about themselves and fight with others at the same time. Parents can easily set the limits children need by taking good care of

themselves at the same time they offer alternatives.

For example, notice that the parent in this example sets limits on the child's behavior without putting him down. The youngsters dignity was maintained as he was left with the decision to make about his behavior. The parents dignity was maintained because he handled the situation in a calm, controlled manner.

Dealing with alternatives and being held accountable for decisions is wonderful practice for youngsters. It prepares them for lifetime of decision making that is required of all responsible people.

Effective parents offer alternatives only if they are willing to make sure the child lives with his decisions. These parents know that children who make mistakes learn and grow. Mistakes are often better teachers than complaining parents.
