The paper itself should be two paragraphs at minimum: the first one should cover the basic biographical details of the saint's life: where they were born, their faith life, what they are known for, etc. The second should talk about why you have chosen this saint: how did you first hear about this saint, what about them is something you want to emulate, why do you want to bear their name and foster a relationship with them?
