# January 9, 2025:

Roll Call of Officers – All present Grand Knight's Report

- New State Program Director James Burkhart. New General Agent for Southern WI Ken Basel. No contact info at this time but should be coming out soon. (see GA message)
- GK will be unable to make next meeting. Will need DGK to cover.
- Brother Knights that have passed Dave Poisl and Don Burant
- State Convention is 16-18 of May in Green Bay. Need to consider two delegates (GK and PGK) and two alternates (open). Delegates Bill Frayer and Harold Von De Bur. Alternates Tim Bartlett, Jacob Clearfield.
- Church Drive at Sacred Heart Jan. 18-19 and 25-26 with meet and greet on 1/30/25 (Wednesday). February possibly another meet and greet. In March, a drive at St. Ed's and St. Richard's. In April, a possible Taste and See event. In May, possibly a drive at St. Joseph and St. John's. If we get some new members, Bill will need help with the Exemp.
- Safe Haven Baby box has been completed and dedicated, and Fr. Juan blessed it. There was a good turnout and a picture in the paper. All expenses were already paid so we don't need to donate at this time, but there is talk of possibly putting one on the north side.
- ID Drive coming up in April. We will need to order more. We will be sending out letters to the stores soon for the stores and churches.
- Treasurer's Report: Noted Christmas party, 50 people. Reminder that our new lease goes into effect next month rent up to \$400/mo.)
- FS Report: Cards and Survey going out, return ASAP. Problem with the cards, so new ones had to be ordered, should be here soon. The P.O. Box does work and is active, but you must have the "0" (zero) at the front of the number (081453).

Charity Committee – Will be making a donation to the Kiwanis Concert group that played at the Christmas Party.

Golf – Reminders for dates, looking for golfers, donations, and sponsors. Spectrum will be coming back at a lower cost and adding a cellular forwarding service that will send voice messages to an individual TBD. New cost will be \$79.98. (Less than what we were paying. This would allow a contact means for other events besides the golf outing.

**Round Tables** – St. Rita's Festival is on and looking for volunteers.

**Corporate Communion** – 30 March, more info to come

Family - Memorial Mass – possibly end of May.

**Community** – Only took in about \$250 on KCIC. Possibly reaching saturation point? Maybe a different sign? Tim B. reported that some signs were being destroyed. We need to find a place to store the Christmas trailer so that we can do some renovation work on it over the summer. The location needs to be able to hold a 40-foot trailer and a door height of at least 12 feet high.

Christmas posters went well, coming in and winners were forwarded to State. Food for Families is coming up. 4831 Valentine's Dinner is Feb. 9.

**Church** – Consecration to the Holy Family program went well with several churches participating. Bill took about 1,000 cards in Spanish over to St. Patrick's.

New Business: Motion made and seconded that for the convention delegates the Council pay for the hotel rooms as well as \$50 food stipend for each delegate. Motion passed.

#### February 697 Notes

Due to weather and members conflicts there was no quorum present, so only an informal meeting of the Council took place. Among items discussed were putting an Ad in the State Convention Book (consensus was for a ½ page ad, cost \$50.)

Communications were received. The charity Committee's list of 21 possible organizations to donate to in 2025 was received. There was also discussion regarding use of yard signs to promote the Golf Outing, possibly outside Churches, McGivney Hall, etc.

Other Agenda items tabled until March meeting include Audit (done and sent in) and also the History Book, Membership Initiatives, Food for Families, Corporate Communion (March 30), Holy Hill Ushering (July 6), Men of Christ (March 29), Informal Social change of days, ID Drive (April) [Tootsie Rolls were ordered], Child Safety Training and new Initiative from Siena Schools, Memorial Mass, Programs at Family of 8 & Family of 4 Parishes.



Roll Call showed Trustee Witt was excused, but all others present.

Communications: Thank you's from Christmas Coalition and the Kiwanis Youth Symphony, letter requesting ushers from Holy Hill for July 6, invite from Council 4831 to their annual Valentine's Ladies Appreciation Dinner, and two notices from Supreme, 1) to support the victims of the fires in LA, and 2) that there will be many changes to the upcoming Exemp with still more to come in the future.

FComp Frayer stated that the annual Fraternity Activities Survey is now in.

FN Sisak appointed SK Jim Corona as Commander of the Honor Guard. SK Corona then gave a plea to all to join the Guard and what a great honor it is to represent the Knights at various events.

SK Lasken will be emailing a list, on request, of activities at the Vet Center looking for volunteers to help.

Next meeting night is Feb.24; At 6:00 we will have "Info Night" for 4<sup>th</sup> Degree hopefuls followed by the regular meeting at 7:00. Old Business: discussion on a drop box for flags to be retired, with a suggestion from SK Bordak to maybe have one in each of the Churches. SK Thad Barr gave a nice report on the March for Life in Washington, D. C. which he attended.

#### February 24, 2025

The evening started at 6:15 with an "Info Night" for new candidates of which 2 were present; Dylan Scharding and James Casey. After pizza and beverages were served, SK Frayer gave a short history of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree. At 6:55 we all went up to the chamber for the regular monthly meeting. There was a good turnout.
