

Window #7 - RECONCILIATION / ANOINTING OF THE SICK



Left Side:

Reconciliation - This Sacrament forgives sins that a person commits after Baptism.

Scourge and Fish - represents the sufferings of Christ for the sins of mankind.

The Three Flames - are symbols of the Holy Trinity.


The Stole and Key - symbols of the power to bind and loose sin given to Peter and all priests.

Right Side:

Anointing of the Sick - Oil Vase - symbolizes the anointing of the sick.

Lighted Candle - symbol of the presence of God in the Church.

Palm - Suggests triumphal joy into eternal life.

 - One of the most commonly used monograms of Christ, the Chi Rho. This symbol is derived from the first two letters of the Greek word XPICTOC (pronounced Christos). This is an abbreviation of the name of Christ.

Two Candles with Hour Glass - Two lighted candles represent the presence of Christ in His human and divine natures.

The Hour Glass - signifies the passage of precious time.
