FAITH FORMATION/YOUTH MINISTRY PLAN 2020/2021

For Grades 1-6, we will be using the *Alive in Christ* curriculum that we would use in our classroom setting. We will be providing those materials to you in physical form and as an online resource to present to your children in your homes. We do not have an option for in-person faith formation at this time.

Each week, your child will be asked to complete a predetermined portion of that curriculum. We ask that you turn in each completed assignment to the parish office so that we can properly track participation. Regular weekly participation is requested so as to keep our children in the rhythm of Faith Formation in advance of us being able to once again meet in person.

Experienced Catechists will be available to you to assist you should you have difficulties with any of the topics that are presented.

Jill Austin, our parish Music Director, will also be providing music that you can share with your children based on the readings of the week as an optional supplement to the curriculum.

Sylvia Valdivia will be providing an artistic activity based on the curriculum and/or the readings of the weekend as an additional optional supplement to the curriculum.

For Grades 7-8, We will meet every other Sunday afternoon for 2 hours using the Zoom video conferencing platform. These virtual meetings will be a mix of catechesis and youth ministry. We do not have an option for in-person middle school ministry at this time.

For Grades 9-12, We will meet every other Sunday afternoon, alternating with grades 7-8, for 2 hours using the Zoom video conferencing platform. These virtual meetings will be formatted to be strictly youth ministry. We do not have an option for in-person high school ministry at this time.

First Eucharist / First Reconciliation Preparation, Children in at least the 2nd grade wishing to receive the Sacrament of Eucharist and Reconciliation this Spring will be asked to fully participate in their respective grade level curriculum. In the new year, we will be offering a series of family catechesis events to more formally prepare for the reception of the Sacraments. Whether those events will occur online or in person has yet to be determined.

Confirmation Preparation, Youth in at least the 9th grade wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this Spring will be asked to participate in a series of 4 one-day retreats spread out over both the Fall and Spring. The retreats for the Fall will be offered via Zoom with the Spring events still to be determined. Specific information related to this process will be following shortly.

An email was sent Monday, August 24th with instructions on how to register your children.

Our target start date for faith formation is Sunday, September 27th.

It is our hope that by that date our families will be adjusted into their various routines of online school and "work from home". If you have any questions / concerns / suggestions regarding this, please contact Michael Smith at your convenience.

FAITH FORMATION— (Children) Parents must be registered, supporting members of the parish. Celebration of Sacraments (1st Communion & Confirmation) requires two consecutive years of Faith Formation & completion of Sacramental Preparation Program.

Daily with DeSales

September 14

All that you do for love is love. Fatigue and even death itself accepted for motives of love is nothing else but love! Today is the feast of the Holy Cross. How beautiful and worthy of our love! It was hard work setting up the wood and erecting it on Calvary, but how happy are those who love the cross and carry it generously. It will appear in all its glory in the heavens when Christ Our Lord will come to judge the living and the dead. Heaven is the altar for all who are crucified; therefore, let us love the crosses that we meet as we go through life. (Letters 713; O. XV, pp. 101-102)

September 15

It is not tranquility that bring our hearts close to God, but the fidelity of our love for Him; it is not the felt experience of His sweetness, but the consent of our wills to follow His holy will. In fact, it is more desirable that this holy will be fulfilled in us than that we follow our will in God. (Letters 698; O. XV, p. 53)

September 16

Uneasiness arises from an inordinate desire to be freed of some evil or from the suffering we are undergoing; or it results from the desire for some benefit we want too eagerly. In either case, anxiety only aggravates the situation. So when you are seized by some desire to be freed from an evil or to acquire something you think is good, in the very first place put yourself in a calm and tranquil mood; tone down your judgment and your will, and then with gentleness quietly await the outcome of your desires. (INT. Part I, Ch. 11; O. III, pp. 311-312)

September 17

It is not possible to gain control over your soul all at once and have it immediately in your power. Be satisfied, therefore, with gaining control of it little by little, and so learn how to conquer your dominant passion. If you have to put up with others, begin by putting up with yourself. Be patient at finding that you are not perfect. Do you want to enjoy interior peace without having to suffer the day-to-day contradictions and setbacks? Every morning prepare your soul to face the day without getting upset, and throughout the day be careful to return to this resolution. (Letters 444; O. XIV, p. 2)

When something happens and we cannot understand the reason for it, we are inclined to think that there is no reason behind the events of this world. However, it is a matter of faith that since God is the Creator and Master of everything, He guides everything carefully by His Providence; He directs and embraces all creation. Especially as regards ourselves, God often allows our lives to be turned upside down by many setbacks. He desires us to walk by faith and not by sight, so that we might seek peace in Him alone! Truly we have to admit that heavenly Providence would be of very low quality if our poor intellect could fully understand it! In the same way, events would be far less marvelous in their grandeur if they corresponded to our human reasoning.

September 19

You will find no vocation, no state in life, where there are no bitter experiences, no annoyances, no hard times. Everyone, except those who are fully resigned to the will of God, would like to change places with someone else. This general uneasiness of souls proceeds from the distaste they find when things do not go their way, and a certain influence of the evil spirit who presents the state of others as better than their own.
