I was walking through one of the local nursing homes the other day and a kindly old gentleman, who always greets me with a smile and a wave, stopped me in the hallway...reached inside the little compartment under the seat of his walker and pulled out a piece of paper, and said, "Here Father, is some good 'Food for Thought', maybe you can use it sometime". The handwritten message was done with the most beautiful penmanship. He said the original information had been passed on to him, and he was unsure of the source or the accuracy, but, never-the-less he wanted to keep the message close at hand.

If you have never experienced the fear of battle, the loneliness of imprisonment, the agony of torture, or the pangs of starvation, you are ahead of about 700 million people in the world."*

There's a cheerful old guy, walking around a nursing home, who has given up most of what he ever possessed in life...but... because he lives with an attitude of abundance, he has more than most of us.

Abundance. Its not a word I use often...at least not often enough... I have been blessed abundantly...beyond measure...beyond what I deserve.

You'll notice in this booklet, many opportunities to serve Christ and His Church, but the starting point...before you sign up for even one thing...is an attitude of abundance. May you rediscover abundance.

*The Pastoral Council is a consultative body to the Pastor. With the Pastor, the Council sets the mission and direction of the parish. Their meetings are marked by prayer, as they train their minds and hearts to discern God's will and God's spirit at work in our communities. Each year, they study and evaluate areas of parish life and pastoral ministry such as; Liturgy, Youth and Adult Faith Formation, Fellowship, Parish Facilities, Parish Unity, Healing Ministries, Social Outreach, & Administration and Stewardship. This study and evaluation leads them to make recommendations to the pastor and the Pastoral Staff, in order to help our parish celebrate the good news of Jesus Christ. Members represent each parish, yet serve the common good. Members are elected/appointed to a three-year term and are able to serve one additional consecutive term. The council meets monthly, typically on Tuesday evenings.*



### Finance Council

*Every Catholic Parish must have a Finance Council which serves as an advisory body to the Pastor. Members of the Finance Council are appointed by the Pastor. The council meets approximately five times a year. The responsibilities of the council include: aid the pastor in the administration of the parish temporal goods; review the total financial situation of the parish; assist in projecting parish budgets; review the current budget at least quarterly; review proposed extraordinary expenses related to parish needs or projects and develop appropriate recommendations; study and propose ways of providing funding for the parish; assure that all parish expenditures reflect justice and good stewardship.*
