- ❖ **# 1 Life and dignity of the human person** –Human life is sacred. God commands us to treat all people, of every age, stage and ability, with dignity and respect.

- ❖ **Call to family, community and participation** -People are sacred and *social*. We live in community with our family, our church, our school, our country and our world. It is our responsibility to participate and act for the good of all these communities.

- ❖ **Basic Human Rights and Responsibilities** - Included are the right to worship, the right to raise a family, the right to immigrate, the right to live without discrimination, the right to adequate education, employment, a safe environment, food, shelter, and clothing. We are to work actively to secure these rights for all and live for the common good.

- ❖ **Option for the poor and vulnerable** -The Church calls all of us to defend and promote the dignity of those with the greatest needs. We fulfill this obligation only by practicing *both* acts of charity (direct service) *and* acts of social justice (advocating for others).

- ❖ **The dignity of work and the rights of workers** -Every person has the right to work as a way of contributing with dignity to God's creation. Workers should be treated with respect, receive fair wages and have a chance for advancement. The economy exists to serve people, not the other way around.

- ❖ **Solidarity** -We are one human family regardless of race, nationality, or religion and what happens to others concerns us, too. We are obligated to work for peace and justice globally, as well as locally.

- ❖ **Care for God's Creation** -We are the stewards of God's creation: called to respect and take care of our earth and its resources, including preserving the earth for the future.
