OVERVIEW for help paying medical bills or free health care -- Get information on assistance programs that can help with medical bills. In addition, find how to get free or affordable medical or dental care as well as prescription medications. Low income families, seniors and people who either lack health insurance or who are underinsured can explore these various financial assistance programs.

Eagle's Wing Free Clinic – This is a nonprofit organization in Mukwonago that provides medical services for uninsured and underinsured individuals. These services include non-emergent medical services, health education and screening, community resources, and referrals.

Lake Area Free Clinic – LAFC, based in Oconomowoc, has been serving residents of Waukesha County who lack health insurance or the ability to pay for health care. LAFC patients receive the medical attention, medication and practical information they need to maintain their health. The Clinic also serves as a valuable resource in helping to locate follow-up services and offers help in determining eligibility for insurance through the Affordable Care Act Health Care Insurance Marketplace or BadgerCare.

Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers (Waukesha Location) -- High quality healthcare for the whole family. We accept all people – whether you have insurance or not. the mission lies in addressing the roots of poverty beyond the exam room to improve the health of our patients any way we can: medical and behavioral health care, involvement in the community, and collaboration and coordination with partners.

ForwardHealth Portal -- serves as the interface to ForwardHealth interChange, the new **Medicaid** Management Information System for the state of Wisconsin. Through this portal, providers, managed care organizations, partners, and trading partners can electronically and securely submit, manage, and maintain health records for members under their care. This Portal also provides users with access to the current health care information available.

Oconomowoc Lions Club – The club is dedicated to providing help to the needy and community service to the entire community. We provide eye glasses, hearing aids and eye exams for anyone that needs help free. We also provide camping for the visually impaired, hearing impaired and other physical disabilities free of charge. **CLICK**

Lake Area Free Clinic Dental Services – LAFC, based in Oconomowoc, has a core purpose to "meet the widest range of health care needs of the economically challenged that it is able to support." The Clinic has added adult dental services in 2017 because: The link between oral health and physical health is crucial in managing overall patient health, and because existing Clinic patients and an estimated 35,000+ Waukesha County low income adults were without private dental insurance and had very limited access to preventive and basic dental care and education.

Jefferson County Dental Clinic -- Dental assistance is provided to residents in the Jefferson County area. Individual and families who are eligible for dental care through the Forward Health or individuals without dental insurance should call to discuss dental needs and to be prescreened.

EYE CARE HELP

EyeCare America – This is one of the country's leading public service programs provides eye care through a pool of more than 5,500 volunteer ophthalmologists. We offer two programs: *The Seniors Program* connects eligible seniors 65 and older with local volunteer ophthalmologists who provide a medical eye exam often at no out-of-pocket cost, and up to one year of follow-up care for any condition diagnosed during the initial exam, for the physician services. *The Glaucoma Program* provides a glaucoma eye exam at no cost to those who are eligible and uninsured.

PRESCRIPTION HELP

SeniorCare -- This is a prescription drug assistance program for Wisconsin residents who are 65 years of age or older and meet the enrollment requirements. The program is designed to help seniors with their prescription drug costs. To enroll in SeniorCare you must: Be a Wisconsin resident. Be a U.S. citizen or have qualifying immigrant status. Be 65 years of age or older. Every senior enrolling in SeniorCare must pay an annual \$30 fee. An application can be filled out from this site.

FoodShare Wisconsin -- was created to help stop hunger and to improve nutrition and health. FoodShare helps people with limited money buy the food they need for good health. Each month, people across Wisconsin get help from FoodShare. They are people of all ages who have a job but have low incomes, are living on small or fixed income, have lost their job, and are retired or disabled and not able to work.

We then follow up with these families to help them keep their homes and flourish.

Free Government Cell Phones -- Free cell phones with unlimited talk & text from U.S. government-backed program. The government's Lifeline Assistance Program gives out cell phones and monthly service — at no charge — to Americans in need of financial help. But there is help. Did you know that the government has authorized phone companies to provide a free cell phone and service to millions Americans at no charge? Yes, it's true.

Focus On Energy Free Products You must be a customer of a participating Wisconsin utility company (such as WE Energies or Oconomowoc Utilities) and have not participated in the last three years. Pick one pack per household from a variety of energy-saving choices (such as light bulbs and shower heads). Residence can be owner or renter occupied. Renters must obtain permission from their landlord. The product is mailed to you. Rebates on other energy-saving items are available on limited bases.



The Salvation Army of Waukesha County -- While men are staying with us in Waukesha County's largest men's emergency shelter, we typically conduct over a thousand helpful case management sessions per year. We also distribute thousands of personal hygiene kits. Our goals include helping our men find and keep a job, then helping them find and move into their own affordable, sustainable housing.

The Women's Center - The mission is to provide safety, shelter, and support to empower all impacted by domestic abuse, sexual violence, child abuse, and trafficking. It is our vision to create an engaged community that does not tolerate or accept interpersonal violence and provide abundant resources to ensure futures free from violence. All of our services are offered confidentially and at no cost to survivors from all socio-economic levels.

OTHER SERVICES

Workforce Development Center -- The purpose is to advance the economic well-being of the region by developing and maintaining a quality workforce and by serving as the focal point for local and regional workforce development initiatives. This is to be achieved through the co-location and integration of employment, training, education and economic development services for job seekers, workers and employers. **CLICK**

VITA Tax Assistance -- Tax Preparation Services offered through La Casa de Esperanza.
