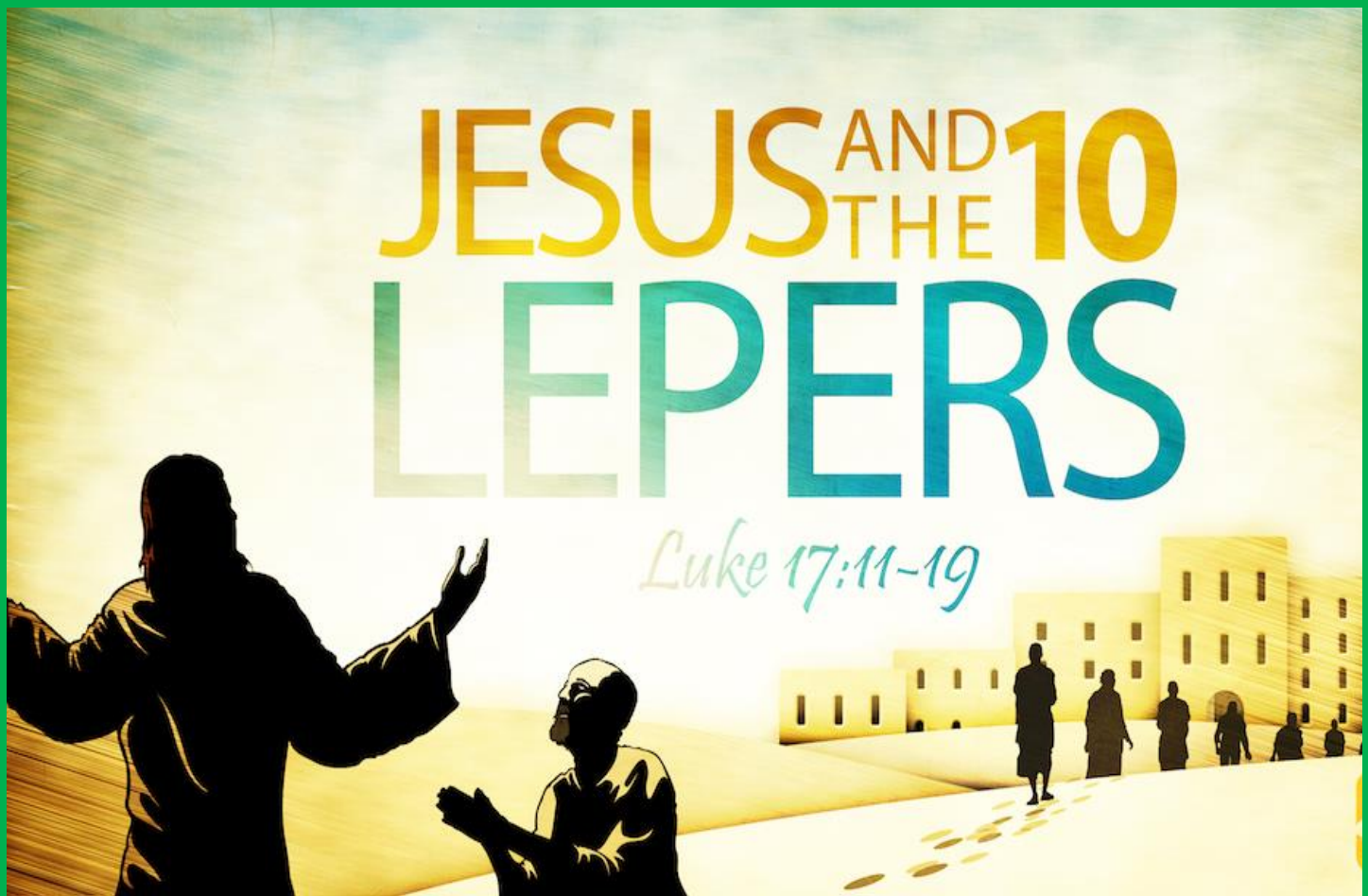

Here is another excerpt from an article titled: ***“Why is October the Month of the Rosary,”*** by Bishop Daniel Mueggenborg, dated 25 September 2018, on the *Northwest Catholic* website:



In 1571, the rosary was still a relatively new prayer form for the universal church. Pope Pius V had issued a decree formally establishing devotion to the rosary in the papal bull *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices* just two years before the Battle of Lepanto. The Holy Father’s universal promulgation recognized the growing devotion to the Blessed Mother throughout Europe, as well as the increased prayer of the rosary in various locations. Devotion to the rosary was especially promoted in the 13th century by St. Dominic and in the 16th century by St. Peter Canisius (who, according to tradition, added the final verse to the Hail Mary, in which we pray, “Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death” — printed officially in the Catechism of the Council of Trent in 1566; the first two verses of the Hail Mary are adapted from Luke 1:28 and 1:42).

The origins of the rosary are complex. The use of knotted ropes to count prayers or scriptural verses (including the Lord’s Prayer and the Jesus Prayer) is an ancient practice and is even found in non-Christian cultures. Most probably, the Christian recitation of 150 such prayers was intended to mirror the monastic prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours in which monks prayed all 150 psalms each day.

The structure of the rosary as we know it today developed significantly from the 12th to the 14th centuries as the larger collection of 150 prayers was further divided into groups of 50 and separated by biblical verses or themes (now referred to as mysteries). It is these mysteries, like a grouping of common roses in a garden, that gave the name *rosary* to this prayer form.

The rosary is a living prayer form and continues to develop even in recent times. An invocation known as the Fatima Prayer was commonly added in the early 20th century. In 2002 Pope John Paul II added a new set of five reflections called the Luminous Mysteries which encourage additional meditations on the life of Jesus.

The rosary is an invitation to experience the grace of Mary’s spiritual motherhood as she leads us to her Son, Jesus. For this reason, it has been an invaluable source of countless spiritual graces for the saints. Remember, every time you pray the rosary you are given the privilege and honor of pronouncing the holy name of Jesus more than 50 times.

The wealth of spiritual graces offered through the rosary comes not from the multiplication of prayers (see Matthew 6:7) but from the imitation of Christ through obedience to the Father’s will, according to the example of the Blessed Mother.

Maybe October would be a good month to turn off the radio or podcast as you commute to work or school and pray the rosary instead. See what graces the Lord wants to pour into your life from the rose garden of this daily meditation.

Aquí hay otro extracto de un artículo titulado: "*¿Por qué es Octubre el Mes del Rosario*", por el obispo Daniel Mueggenborg, fechado el 25 de septiembre de 2018, en el sitio web de la *Católica Noroeste*:



En 1571, el rosario todavía era una forma relativamente nueva de orar en la iglesia universal. El Papa Pío V había emitido un decreto estableciendo formalmente la devoción al rosario en la bula papal *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices* tan solo dos años antes de la Batalla de Lepanto. La promulgación universal del Santo Padre reconocía la creciente devoción a nuestra Madre Santísima a través de Europa, al igual que el incremento de la oración del Rosario en varios sitios. La devoción al Rosario fue promovida en especial en el siglo XIII por Sto. Domingo y en el siglo XVI por Sn. Pedro Canisio (quien, según la tradición, agregó el último verso al Ave María en que decimos, "Santa María, Madre de Dios, ruega por nosotros los pecadores ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte", impresa oficialmente en el Catecismo del Concilio de Trento en 1566. Los primeros dos versos del Ave María son adaptaciones de Lucas 1,28 y 1,42).

El origen del rosario es complejo. El uso de cuerdas anudadas para contar oraciones o versos de la Escritura (incluyendo el Padrenuestro y la Oración del Corazón) es una práctica antigua encontrada incluso en culturas no cristianas. Más probablemente, la recitación cristiana de 150 de esas plegarias tenía el propósito de imitar la práctica monástica de la Liturgia de las Horas en que los monjes rezaban los 150 salmos cada día.

La estructura del Rosario como la conocemos hoy se desarrolló de forma importante entre los siglos XII y XIV mientras la gran colección de 150 oraciones era dividida en grupos de 50 separados por versículos o temas bíblicos (hoy llamados misterios). Son estos misterios, agrupados como un ramo de rosas en el jardín, lo que dio lugar al nombre de Rosario a esta forma de oración.

El Rosario es una forma viva de oración y sigue en desarrollo aun en tiempos recientes. Una invocación conocida como la Oración de Fátima fue añadida a inicios del siglo XX. En 2002, el Papa Juan Pablo II añadió un nuevo conjunto de cinco reflexiones llamadas Misterios Luminosos que motivan a tener meditaciones adicionales sobre la vida de Jesús.

El Rosario es una invitación a la experiencia de gracia de la maternidad espiritual de María mientras nos conduce a su Hijo, Jesús. Por esta razón, ha sido una fuente incalculable de gracias espirituales para los santos. Recuerda, cada vez que rezas el rosario recibes el privilegio y honor de pronunciar el santo nombre de Jesús más de 50 veces.

El cúmulo de gracias espirituales ofrecidas a través del Rosario vienen no de la multiplicación de plegarias (Cf Mateo 6,7) sino de la imitación de Cristo en la obediencia a la voluntad del Padre, según el ejemplo de nuestra Madre Santísima.

Tal vez octubre sea un buen mes para apagar la radio o los podcasts durante el traslado al trabajo o a la escuela para rezar el Rosario en cambio. Mira las gracia que el Señor quiere derramar en tu vida desde el jardín de rosas de esta meditación diaria.
