Bow Hunting for God Retreat

The fall hunting season is fast approaching and we have set our dates for the 2019 Bow Hunting for God Retreats in central Wisconsin. The retreats will take place in the Hancock/Wautoma area. One of the retreats will be held on **October 25th - 27th** and one on **November 1 - 3**.

The retreats are held on private properties in central Wisconsin. Hunters are allowed to use either a traditional compound bow or crossbow. The retreats begin on Friday evening at 5 pm with a Wisconsin fish fry. Participants then take time to reflect on a retreat book, which encompasses on how to see God in our hunting and other outdoor recreation activities. Most of the retreat books that are used are based on real life hunting experiences. The retreatants spend time on Saturday bow hunting while reflecting on our faith talks and hopefully having a chance to harvest a deer. We have an outdoor Mass on Saturday evening, followed by more time in faith experience conversations. On Sunday morning, we hunt in the morning and then come back to camp and enjoy brunch before departing for home.

The cost for the retreat, which includes a retreat book, food and lodging, is \$85 for 1 person or \$140 for a father/son/grandson. These retreats are already starting to fill up and there is only a limited amount of space available. Here is an excerpt from an article titled: ***"Why is October the Month of the Rosary,"*** by Bishop Daniel Mueggenborg, dated 25 September 2018, on the *Northwest Catholic* website:



Q: Why is October referred to as the Month of the Rosary?

A: The answer to your question is relatively simple but needs a historical context in order to be fully appreciated. The short answer is this: October is dedicated as the Month of the Rosary because we celebrate the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary each year on October 7.

To understand this feast, we need to go back in time. In the 16th century, the Islamic Ottoman Empire presented a serious military threat to western Europe and sent a fleet of ships to attack Christian defenses in southern Europe. Pope Pius V recognized the grave danger and organized a fleet called the Holy League to confront the navy of the Ottoman Turks.

On October 7, 1571, the two navies engaged in a pivotal battle that would determine who controlled maritime traffic in the Mediterranean, Adriatic and Aegean seas. The fate of western Europe depended upon the success of Christians in this navy battle, which involved more than 400 warships (it was the largest naval battle in Western history for centuries).

Pius V knew he needed more than just military strength to defend Christian Europe, so he asked that all the faithful pray the rosary, requesting the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the end of the Battle of Lepanto, the Holy League was victorious and the maritime expansion of the Ottoman Empire was permanently prevented.

The next year, Pius V established a feast on October 7 in honor of the Blessed Mother, originally called Our Lady of Victory. After a few centuries, the name was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary to more clearly recognize that prayer was the greatest power at work that day on the seas.

Retiro de Caza de Arcos para Dios

La temporada de caza de otoño se acerca rápidamente y hemos establecido nuestras fechas para los retiros de 2019 Retiro de Caza de Arcos para Dios en el centro de Wisconsin. Los retiros tendrán lugar en el área de Hancock/Wautoma. Uno de los retiros se llevará a cabo del 25 al 27 de octubre y otro del 1 al 3 de noviembre.

Los retiros se llevan a cabo en propiedades privadas en el centro de Wisconsin. Los cazadores pueden usar un arco compuesto tradicional o una ballesta. Los retiros comienzan el viernes por la noche a las 5 pm con un alevín de pescado de Wisconsin. Los participantes se toman tiempo para reflexionar sobre un libro de retiro, que abarca cómo ver a Dios en nuestra caza y otras actividades recreativas al aire libre. La mayoría de los libros de retiro que se utilizan se basan en experiencias de caza de la vida real. Los retirados pasan tiempo en la caza de arcos del sábado mientras reflexionan sobre nuestras conversaciones de fe y, con suerte, tienen la oportunidad de cosechar un ciervo. Tenemos una misa al aire libre el sábado por la noche, seguida de más tiempo en conversaciones de experiencia de fe. El domingo por la mañana, cazamos por la mañana y luego volvemos al campamento y disfrutamos del brunch antes de partir a casa.

El costo del retiro, que incluye un libro de retiro, comida y alojamiento, es de \$85 para 1 persona o \$140 para un padre/hijo/nieto. Estos retiros ya están empezando a llenarse y sólo hay una cantidad limitada de espacio disponible. Aquí hay un extracto de un artículo titulado: "*¿Por qué es Octubre el Mes del Rosario*", por el obispo Daniel Mueggenborg, fechado el 25 de septiembre de 2018, en el sitio web de la *Católica Noroeste*:



P: ¿Por qué se conoce a Octubre como el Mes del Rosario?

R: La respuesta a su pregunta es relativamente simple, pero necesita un contexto histórico para ser plenamente apreciado. La respuesta corta es la siguiente: Octubre se dedica como mes del Rosario porque celebramos el memorial de Nuestra Señora del Rosario cada año el 7 de octubre.

Para entender esta fiesta, tenemos que retroceder en el tiempo. En el siglo XVI, el Imperio Otomano Islámico presentó una seria amenaza militar a Europa occidental y envió una flota de barcos para atacar las defensas cristianas en el sur de Europa. El Papa Pío V reconoció el grave peligro y organizó una flota llamada La Santa Liga para enfrentarse a la marina de los turcos otomanos.

El 7 de octubre de 1571, las dos marinas participaron en una batalla fundamental que determinaría quién controlaba el tráfico marítimo en los mares Mediterráneo, Adriático y Egeo. El destino de Europa occidental dependía del éxito de los cristianos en esta batalla naval, que involucró a más de 400 buques de guerra (fue la batalla naval más grande en la historia occidental durante siglos).

Pío V sabía que necesitaba algo más que fuerza militar para defender la Europa cristiana, por lo que pidió a todos los fieles que rezaran el rosario, solicitando la intercesión de la Santísima Madre. Al final de la Batalla de Lepanto, la Santa Liga fue victoriosa y la expansión marítima del Imperio Otomano se impidió permanentemente.

Al año siguiente, Pío V estableció una fiesta el 7 de octubre en honor a la Santísima Madre, originalmente llamada Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. Después de unos siglos, el nombre fue cambiado a La Virgen del Rosario para reconocer más claramente que la oración era el mayor poder en el trabajo ese día en los mares.
