

"Our fiscal year ended on 9/30/19. The Pantry served 8,487 households an distributed over 2.3 million pounds of food. This is 1 million more pounds than 2017. We served a total of 24,391 people. It is important to remember that less than 5% of the food distributed is from the federal commodities program and only 15 hours of paid staff time are in the budget. Everything else is donated, or purchased with donations. Our volunteers also bring a variety of skills and experiences. They play an important part in helping our Pantry run smooth." 

The Ministry of Altar Servers

Here at St. Joseph Parish we are making a concerted effort to attract more young people, particularly boys and teens, to the ministry of Altar Serving. We hope we can be successful in doing so because it is such an important ministry. One of the ways we will do this is by running articles in the bulletin regarding Altar Serving. This first one is taken from bulletin announcements from St. Teresa of Avila Church in Grovetown, GA, and St. Cecelia Church in Beaverton, OR.



The Altar Server Ministry is a very special group of young people in our parish who have answered God's call to ministry. As an Altar Server, you are one of the liturgical ministers with an important role during the Mass or other liturgical services. It is a privilege to minister as an Altar Server at Mass. Servers assist the priest at the altar and help the church community worship in the best possible way. We invite you to share this special privilege of becoming an active altar server in our parish. Altar Serving isn't a volunteer role. You are responding to the call of God in your heart to serve the community as ministers.

Altar Servers must have a strong desire to serve at the Altar of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. You must have made your First Eucharist and be a member of St. Joseph Parish. You must know how to genuflect, make the sign of the cross, be willing to pray aloud, and know the appropriate responses during Mass. It is most important as a server to be attentive, sit quietly during Mass, and show reverence at the Altar of the Lord. You must be willing to attend Mass regularly and serve on Saturdays and Sundays.

To serve at the altar and to offer oneself to Our Lord, is a great privilege given by the Catholic Church. Willingly you have come forward to take up this exalted office, to enjoy the privilege which Holy Mother Church grants you of performing duties in the Sanctuary. You are often going to be in a holy place, performing sacred duties and you will appear very publicly in the sight of all the congregation. To fulfill such an office worthily you will need to be holy in your life, and edifying always in the sight of other people. Your great help will be Prayer, Holy Mass and the Sacraments. It is possible for Altar Servers to trace their lineage to a young boy who also offered himself to Our Lord. The Gospel, according to Saint John, reports the story of this young boy:

When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?"...Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. (John 6:5, 8-9, 11)Sacred Scripture does not reveal the name of the boy with the barley loaves and fish. Yet, it is known that his service was offered to and accepted by Our Lord. Similarly, Altar Servers offer to the High Priest, Jesus Christ, their service at the Altar. They assist him through his ordained ministers: Bishops, Priests and Deacons. As a result, Servers are witnesses to the miracle of bread and wine becoming the **Body and Blood of Jesus Christ**. Thus, they have the privilege of being close to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and providing a service to him.

Altar Servers must remember that everything that they do is for the Glory of God. They do it out of love for His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. St. Ignatius of Loyola called this attitude "AD MAJOREM DEI GLORIAM". This means "All for the Honor and Glory of God". It is the motto of a heart of service. God bless you and Mary keep you!

Te invitamos a compartir este privilegio especial de convertirte en un servidor activo de altares en nuestra parroquia. El ministerio de Monaguillos no es un rol voluntario. Están respondiendo a la llamada de Dios en su corazón para servir a la comunidad como ministros.

Los Monaguillos deben tener un fuerte deseo de servir en el Altar de Nuestro Señor y Salvador, Jesucristo. Debiste haber hecho tu Primera Eucaristía y ser miembro de la Parroquia de San José. Debes saber genuflexionar, hacer el signo de la cruz, estar dispuesto a orar en voz alta y conocer las respuestas apropiadas durante la Misa. Es más importante como Monaguillo estar atento, sentarse en silencio durante la Misa y mostrar reverencia en el Altar del Señor. Debe estar dispuesto a asistir a misa regularmente y servir los sábados y domingos.

Entonces Jesús tomó los panes, dio gracias y los distribuyó a los que estaban reclinados, y también a la mayor cantidad de peces que quisieran. (Juan 6:5, 8-9, 11)

La Sagrada Escritura no revela el nombre del niño con los panes de cebada y los peces. Sin embargo, se sabe que nuestro Señor ofreció y aceptó su servicio. Del mismo modo, los Monaguillos ofrecen al Sumo Sacerdote, Jesucristo, su servicio en el Altar. Le ayudan a través de sus ministros ordenados: Obispos, Sacerdotes y Diáconos. Como resultado, los Monaguillos son testigos del milagro de que el pan y el vino se conviertan en el **Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesucristo**. Así, tienen el privilegio de estar cerca de Nuestro Señor en la Santa Eucaristía y de servirle.

Los Monaguillos debe recordar que todo lo que hacen es para la Gloria de Dios. Lo hacen por amor a Su Hijo, nuestro Señor Jesucristo.
