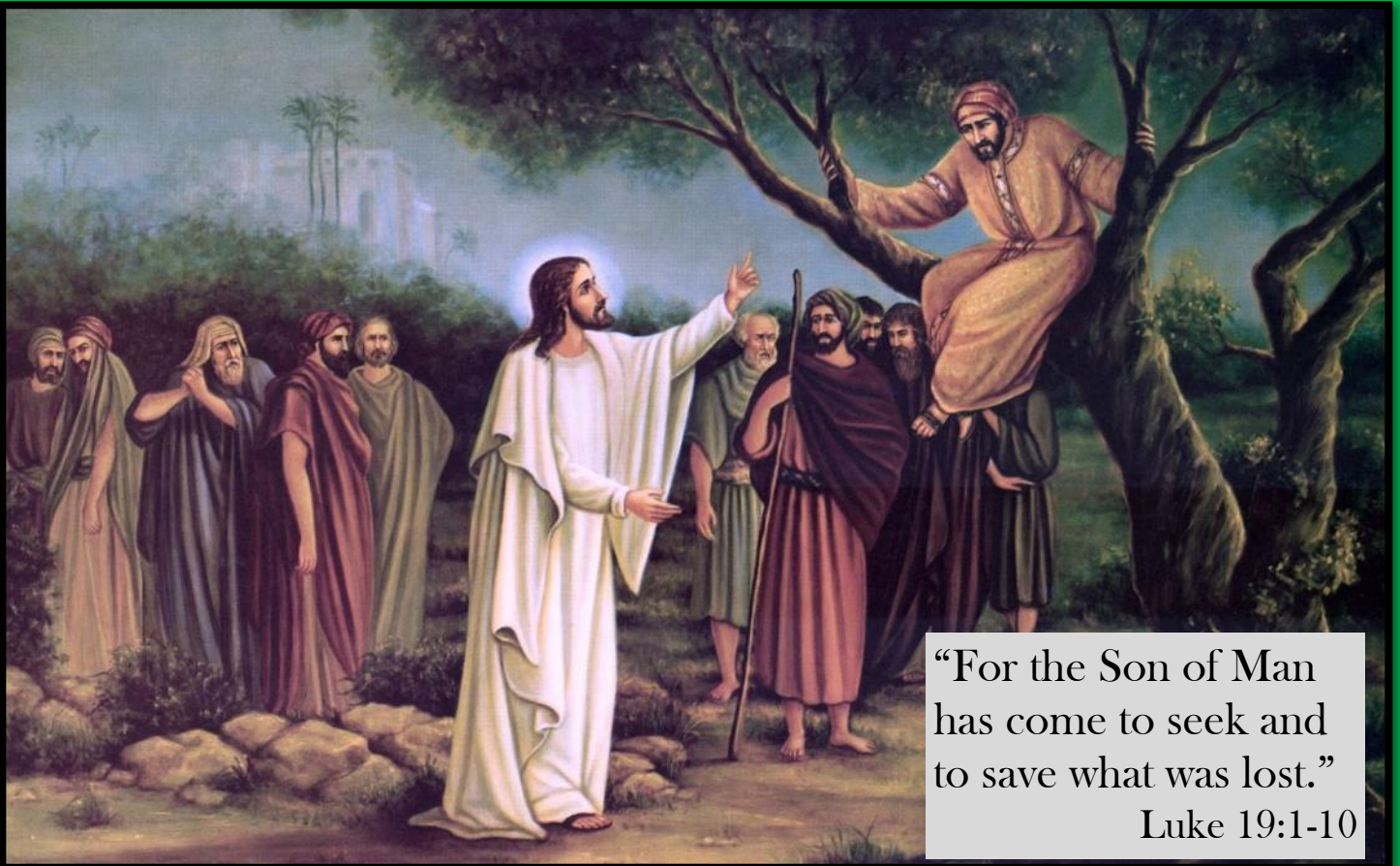

Taking Communion to the Sick and Shut-Ins

We are very happy and blessed to have people in our parish take Holy Communion to those who are sick or shut-ins. This is a beautiful and holy ministry. The Sacred Hosts that we carry are the physical presence of Jesus, so we would like to review again some important aspects of how we should handle the Sacred Hosts that we take to people.



- **EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY**—If someone has brought a pyx with them to Mass, we ask that they please come to the sanctuary area after Mass and receive the Sacred Host **from the priest or deacon**. We will no longer place the Sacred Host in a pyx that someone is carrying with them during the distribution of Holy Communion.

- If you receive a Sacred Host after Mass, or if you take one from the tabernacle during the day and place it in a pyx, please be sure to go immediately to the person or people you are seeing and give them the Sacred Host upon arrival. Please do not do any visiting in the Gathering Space, or running errands, i.e. shopping, going to the bank, Post Office, etc., while you have the Sacred Host in your possession before going to the person. Also, please do not simply put the pyx in your pocket or purse for several hours before giving the person Holy Communion.

- Please take only the number of Sacred Hosts that you need for your visit. In no way should anyone ever take extra Sacred Hosts and keep them overnight or for several days in their home to be given out later on. The **ONLY** place the Sacred Host is to be kept overnight is in the tabernacle of the church.

- If you have extra Sacred Hosts left over from visiting someone in a home, a prison, a nursing home, etc., please return them immediately to the tabernacle in the church; and again, we should not do any errands on the way back.

- If you have a pyx of your own, when you return home after giving Holy Communion to someone, please rinse it out with water into a cup or drinking glass, drink the water and wipe out the pyx.

Again we are very grateful to the people who help take Holy Communion to people who cannot be at Holy Mass. It is a beautiful ministry and we hope these directions again clarify how the Sacred Host is to be handled, because in the Holy Eucharist our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is really, truly and substantially present—body, blood soul and divinity. The love and reverence that we show in how we handle the Sacred Host is an expression of our belief in that reality. God bless you all.



Leaving Early During Holy Mass

Please remember that the Holy Mass is not finished until **AFTER** the Final Blessing and Dismissal. It is not proper or reverent to leave after receiving Holy Communion. Let us please give God all of the worship that is due to him.

National Vocation Awareness Week

November 3-9 is National Vocation Awareness Week. It is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to ordained ministry and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. Here at St. Joseph Parish one of the ways that we are going to try to promote vocations is to really encourage young people, especially boys, teens and young men to be Altar Servers and assist at the Holy Mass. Many priests first sensed their call to priesthood while being Altar Servers. We will have more information on this important ministry this month. Stay tuned.

Llevar la Comunión a los Enfermos y Encerrados



Estamos muy felices y bendecidos de que la gente en nuestra parroquia lleve la Santa Comunión a los enfermos o encerrados. Este es un hermoso y santo ministerio. Las Hostias Sagradas que llevamos son la presencia física de Jesús, por lo que nos gustaría repasar de nuevo algunos aspectos importantes de cómo debemos manejar las Hostias Sagradas que llevamos a las personas.

- **EFFECTIVO INMEDIATAMENTE**—Si alguien ha llevado un pyx con ellos a la Misa, le pedimos que por favor venga a la zona del santuario después de la Misa y reciba la Hostia Sagrada **del sacerdote o diácono**. Ya no colocaremos a la Hostia Sagrada en un pyx que alguien lleva consigo durante la distribución de la Santa Comunión.

- Si recibes una Hostia Sagrada después de la Misa, o si tomas una del tabernáculo durante el día y la colocas en un pyx, por favor asegúrate de ir inmediatamente a la persona o personas que estás viendo y darles la Hostia Sagrada a su llegada. Por favor, no haga ninguna visita en el Espacio de Reunión, o hacer mandados, es decir, ir al banco, Correos, etc., mientras usted tiene el Anfitrión Sagrado en su posesión antes de ir a la persona. Además, por favor no se limite a poner el pyx en su bolsillo o bolso durante varias horas antes de dar a la persona la Santa Comunión.

- Por favor, tome sólo el número de Anfitriones Sagrados que necesita para su visita. De ninguna manera alguien debe tomar Hostias Sagradas adicionales y mantenerlas durante la noche o durante varios días en su casa para ser repartidas más tarde. El ÚNICO lugar donde la Hostia Sagrada debe guardarse durante la noche es en el tabernáculo de la iglesia.

- Si tiene Anfitriones Sagrados adicionales sobrante de visitar a alguien en un hogar, una prisión, un asilo de ancianos, etc., por favor devuélvalos inmediatamente al tabernáculo de la iglesia; y de nuevo, no debemos hacer ningún mandado en el camino de regreso.

- Si usted tiene un pyx de su propia, cuando regrese a casa después de dar la Santa Comunión a alguien, por favor enjuáguelo con agua en una taza o vaso de beber, beba el agua y limpie el pyx.

Una vez más estamos muy agradecidos a las personas que ayudan a llevar la Santa Comunión a las personas que no pueden estar en la Santa Misa. Es un hermoso ministerio y esperamos que estas instrucciones aclaren de nuevo cómo se debe manejar la Hostia Sagrada, porque en la Santa Eucaristía nuestro Señor y Salvador Jesucristo está realmente, verdadera mente y sustancialmente presente: cuerpo, alma de sangre y divinidad. El amor y la reverencia que mostramos en cómo manejamos la Hostia Sagrada es una expresión de nuestra creencia en esa realidad. Dios los bendiga a todos.

Salir Temprano Durante la Santa Misa

Recuerden que la Santa Misa no ha terminado hasta después de la bendición y el despido final. No es apropiado ni reverente salir después de recibir la Santa Comunión. Démosle a Dios toda la adoración que se le debe.

Semana Nacional de Concienciación sobre la Vocación

Del 3 al 9 de noviembre es la Semana Nacional de Concienciación Vocacional. Es una celebración anual de una semana de duración de la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos dedicada a promover las vocaciones al ministerio ordenado y a la vida consagrada a través de la oración y la educación, y a renovar nuestras oraciones y apoyo para aquellos que están considerando una de estas vocaciones particulares. Aquí, en la Parroquia de San José, una de las formas en que vamos a tratar de promover las vocaciones es realmente alentar a los jóvenes, especialmente a los niños, especialmente a los niños, adolescentes y jóvenes a ser Monaguillos y ayudar en la Santa Misa.
