

Thoughts on the New Year

The following is an excerpt from an article titled: "8 (Spiritual) New Year's Resolutions for Catholics," by Gretchen Filz, dated 31 December 2017 on the Catholic Company getfed website:

January is here again, and it's time to make the annual New Year's resolutions. Every Catholic should add to their list a few spiritual resolutions designed to help them walk higher up that mountain of faith... Here are some ideas.

1. Increase Your Marian Devotion

...the last century has seen a widespread loss of Christian faith, breakdowns in marriages and families, and a rejection of basic morality. This affects all of us, and, as a result, anxiety and depression have risen to epidemic levels. The way to turn back to God is the same way that God came to us—through the Blessed Mother. ... commit yourself to increasing your Marian devotion so that she may lead you to deeper conversion, to follow God's will for your life more perfectly, and to increase your faith and trust in Jesus Christ.

2. Make more time for spiritual reading

Your best bet is to stick to the classics written by Catholic saints known for their practical spiritual wisdom—such as Teresa of Avila, Francis de Sales, Therese of Lisieux, and John of the Cross. There are also audio books available for many classic Catholic titles...make a list of books that you'd like to complete...and pray that God will show you how you can find the time to read them...The time you spend feeding your soul is time better spent.

3. Make good stewardship a lifestyle

Pope Francis has often spoken of the dangers of materialism...This boils down to one key concept in the life of the Christian: practicing good stewardship over the gifts God has given us. This means good management of our "time, talent, and treasure" for the greater glory of God ...Prayerfully evaluate how you will spend your time, your talents, and your income...to see what lifestyle changes you can make that will positively impact your spiritual life.

4. Share your Catholic faith with others

Modern Catholics aren't usually great about sharing their faith with others, but this is something that can change with practice. You don't have to be obnoxious or overbearing about your faith, just focus on doing simple things like being joyful in your walk with Christ or inviting people to come to Mass with you. Another good idea is to buy some sacramentals in bulk, get them blessed, and hand them out to people as the Holy Spirit leads. If someone you know is going through a difficult time and you hand them a Miraculous Medal or a prayer card out of a stash you always keep handy, it might be for them the touch of God in that moment.

5. Bring back regular penances

...While the Church law against eating meat on the Fridays outside of Lent was lifted by the U.S. bishops, it is meant to be substituted with some other form of penance...What penitential practice can you do each Friday...? Maybe it is tried-and-true abstinence from meat, or perhaps another penitential practice such as praying the Stations of the Cross, or even acts of service for the less fortunate. Be creative. Remember that penances aren't meant to be pleasant at first, but the graces that come from them grow sweeter with time.

6. Go an extra day to Mass

...think of ways you can arrange your schedule and activities so that you can make it to Mass either an extra day each week, or a few extra days a month...and remember that daily Masses are usually only 30 minutes long. If (that is) still impossible...try to add time for Adoration outside of Mass, even if just for 15 minutes.

7. Pray the rosary

No Catholic list of New Year's resolutions would be complete without a daily rosary added in. If you already pray the rosary daily, that is fantastic...the rosary is a spiritual weapon that will help (us) fight all (our) personal battles.

8. Pick a new saint buddy

Why not begin the tradition of walking along your pilgrimage of faith with a different Catholic saint each year? There are so many of them with unique graces to bestow. Pray about your New Year and the goals...Then choose a patron saint whose virtues you would like to emulate in New Year, and entrust your year to their special intercession...Ask this saint to be your guide for (2020).

Pensamientos sobre el Año Nuevo

1. Aumentar su Devoción a María

... el siglo pasado ha visto una pérdida generalizada de la fe cristiana, rupturas en los matrimonios y las familias, y un rechazo de la moral básica. Esto nos afecta a todos y, como resultado, la ansiedad y la depresión han alcanzado niveles epidémicos. El camino para volvera a Dios es la misma manera en que Dios vino a nosotros, por medio de la Santísima Madre. ... comprométete a aumentar tu devoción mariana para que ella te guíe a una conversión más profunda, a seguir la voluntad de Dios para tu vida más perfectamente, y a aumentar tu fe y confianza en Jesucristo.

2. Hacer más tiempo para la lectura espiritual

Su mejor apuesta es apegarse a los clásicos escritos por santos católicos conocidos por su sabiduría espiritual práctica, como Teresa de Avila, Francisco de Sales, Teresa de Lisieux y Juan de la Cruz. También hay audiolibros disponibles para muchos títulos católicos clásicos... hacer una lista de libros que le gustaría completar... y oren para que Dios les muestre cómo pueden encontrar el tiempo para leerlos... El tiempo que pasas alimentando tu alma es tiempo mejor pasado.

3. Hacer de la buena administración un estilo de vida

El Papa Francisco ha hablado a menudo de los peligros del materialismo... Esto se reduce a un concepto clave en la vida del cristiano: practicar la buena mayordomía sobre los dones que Dios nos ha dado. Esto significa una buena gestión de nuestro "tiempo, talento y tesoro" para la mayor gloria de Dios... Evalúe con oración cómo gastará su tiempo, sus talentos y sus ingresos... para ver qué cambios en el estilo de vida puedes hacer que impactarán positivamente tu vida espiritual.

4. Comparte tu fe católica con los demás

Los católicos modernos no suelen ser buenos para compartir su fe con los demás, pero esto es algo que puede cambiar con la práctica. No tienes que ser odioso o prepotente con tu fe, solo concéntrate en hacer cosas sencillas como ser gozoso en tu caminar con Cristo o invitar a la gente a venir a misa contigo. Otra buena idea es comprar algunos sacramentales a granel, bendecirlos y entregarlos a la gente como el Espíritu Santo lo guíe. Si alguien que conoces está pasando por un momento difícil y le das una Medalla Milagrosa o una tarjeta de oración de un alijo que siempre tienes a mano, podría ser para ellos el toque de Dios en ese momento.

5. Traiga de vuelta las penitencias regulares

... Si bien la ley de la Iglesia contra comer carne los viernes fuera de la Cuaresma fue levantada por los obispos de los Estados Unidos, está destinada a ser sustituida por alguna otra forma de penitencia... ¿Qué práctica penitencial puedes hacer cada viernes...? Tal vez sea una abstinencia probada de la carne, o tal vez otra práctica penitencial como rezar las Estaciones de la Cruz, o incluso actos de servicio para los menos afortunados. Sé creativo. Recuerda que las penitencias no están destinadas a ser agradables al principio, pero las gracias que provienen de ellas se vuelven más dulces con el tiempo.

6. Ir un día extra a la Misa

... piense en maneras en que puede organizar su horario y actividades para que pueda llegar a misa ya sea un día extra cada semana, o unos días adicionales al mes ... y recuerde que las misas diarias suelen ser de sólo 30 minutos de duración. Si (es) todavía imposible... tratar de añadir tiempo para la Adoración fuera de la Misa, incluso si sólo durante 15 minutos.

7. Orar el rosario

Ninguna lista católica de resoluciones de Año Nuevo estaría completa sin un rosario diario añadido. Si ya rezas el rosario todos los días, eso es fantástico... el rosario es un arma espiritual que nos ayudará a luchar todas (nuestras) batallas personales.

8. Elige un nuevo santo amigo

¿Por qué no empezar la tradición de caminar por vuestra peregrinación de fe con un santo católico diferente cada año? Hay tantos de ellos con gracias únicas que otorgar. Ora sobre tu Año Nuevo y los objetivos... Entonces elige a un santo patrón cuyas virtudes te gustaría emular en Año Nuevo, y confía tu año a su intercesión especial... Pida a este santo que sea su guía para (2020).
