





Thoughts on Trinity Sunday

Here is an excerpt from an article titled: **"Trinity Sunday: A Reflection"**, by Fr. Thomas Kocik, dated 30 May 2015, on *1P5—One Peter 5* website:

The sacred liturgy begins and ends with the sign of the cross made in the name of the Father,

Son, and Holy Spirit. But how often do we think of ourselves as deeply and intimately related to each of the divine Persons, as adopted children of the Father precisely by reason of our union with the Son by the gift of the Spirit?

THE TRINITY

...The Christian life is essentially a trinitarian life. In baptism, that sacrament of faith which incorporates us into the mystical body of Christ and so into the new relationships to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit... The Christian is privileged to know God as He is in Himself because the Word was made flesh. Christ is above all the revelation of the Father. The Father has predestined us from eternity to sonship (and daughtership) in His only Son, a vocation given in virtue of Christ's life, death, resurrection and ascension. Through the power of the Holy Spirit—the Spirit of Christ sent by Christ and the Father—man is adopted as son; his new life of grace will be a journey to the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit...

Having been made sharers of the divine nature through baptism, we now partake of God's Life through faith and charity. The Father has first given the Son all that He (the Father) is, retaining only His relation of fatherhood as His personal distinction. The Son loves the Father perfectly, and this mutual love is personal: the Holy Spirit who proceeds from both Father and Son as from one source, by means of love. The Spirit is the bond of the mutual knowledge and self-giving of Father and Son.

All this is a communion of love. We are taken up into this Life through the Church's liturgy, beginning with baptism. We are called to return to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. As you listen to precise language of the Preface this Sunday, bear in mind that, at bottom, it's all about Love—the Love who created us, who destroyed death's power over us, and who calls us to an eternity of love with Himself.

Thoughts on Father's Day

Here is an excerpt from an article titled: "This Father's Day: Vow to be a Committed Catholic Father", by Matthew James Christoff, dated 17 June 2018, on *The Catholic World Report* website:

For Catholic men, rather than just a day of only happy moments, Father's Day should include a sober reflection on each man's commitment to Catholic fatherhood. The sad fact is large numbers of men are failing at their duties as Catholic fathers. Christ expects Catholic fathers to seek holiness and perfection as each Catholic man will ultimately face the King and give an accounting for how he shepherded his children. This is a call for Catholic men to prayerfully assess their effectiveness as fathers for Christ on Father's Day and yow to become *Committed Catholic Fathers*.

...The *Committed Catholic Father* is the model of Catholic fatherhood, attempting to fully live out the truth and mercy of Christ in a balanced way. He not only is highly devout in his commitment to know Jesus Christ, but he enthusiastically leads (with his wife) the family in prayer, scripture, the sacraments, catechesis of the faith and in acts of mercy to serve those in need. He has a rich Catholic faith life and has built strong bonds of brotherhood with other Catholic fathers in his parish, men of faith who help build his faith...

The Committed Catholic Father ensures that his children know the fullness of the truth of the Catholic faith, ensuring that his children come to have a deep knowledge, love and a personal relationship with Jesus Christ who is Truth itself. He personally engages in the catechesis of his children at home and may help mentor and teach the Catholic faith to other young people in the parish. The Committed Catholic Father seeks to demonstrate Christ's mercy in overt ways to his children by actively loving their mother and each of them.

Most importantly, the *Committed Catholic Father* relies on the supernatural power from the graces of the Sacraments and his own diligent efforts in the never-ending ascent towards living the perfect balance of Christ's truth and mercy in all his dealings with his family.

Pensamientos sobre la Santísima Trinidad

Aquí hay un extracto de un artículo titulado: **"Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad: Una Reflexión**," por el Padre Thomas Kocik, de fecha 30 de mayo de 2015, en 1P5 — un de Peter 5 sitio web:

... La vida cristiana es esencialmente una vida trinitaria. En el bautismo, ese sacramento de fe que nos incorpora al cuerpo místico de Cristo y así a las nuevas relaciones con Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo... El cristiano tiene el privilegio de conocer a Dios como él está en sí mismo, porque la palabra se

hizo carne. Cristo es sobre todo la revelación del Padre. El Padre nos ha predestinado desde la eternidad a la filiación (y a la hija) en su único hijo, una vocación dada en virtud de la vida, muerte, resurrección y ascensión de Cristo. Por el poder del Espíritu Santo — el Espíritu de Cristo enviado por Cristo y el Padre — el hombre es adoptado como hijo; su nueva vida de gracia será un viaje al Padre, por medio del Hijo, en el Espíritu Santo...

Habiendo sido hechos partícipes de la naturaleza divina a través del bautismo, ahora participamos de la vida de Dios por medio de la fe y la caridad. El Padre ha dado primero al Hijo todo lo que él (el Padre) es, conservando sólo su relación de paternidad como su distinción personal. El Hijo ama al padre a la perfección, y este amor mutuo es personal: el Espíritu Santo que procede del Padre y del Hijo como de una fuente, por medio del amor. El Espíritu es el vínculo del conocimiento mutuo y el don de sí de Padre e Hijo.

Todo esto es una comunión de amor. Somos llevados a esta vida a través de la liturgia de la iglesia, comenzando con el bautismo. Estamos llamados a regresar al Padre por medio del Hijo en el Espíritu Santo. Al escuchar el lenguaje preciso del prefacio este domingo, ten en cuenta que, en la parte inferior, todo se trata del amor — el amor que nos creó, que destruyó el poder de la muerte sobre nosotros, y que nos llama a una eternidad de amor consigo mismo.




