

Since the readings for this weekend talk about wealth, here is an excerpt from an article titled: **"10 Reasons The Catholic Church Should NOT Sell Her "Riches" And Give Money To The Poor,"** by Marcel, dated 17 September 2014 on the *aggiecatholicblog* website:

- 1. The Catholic Church is not as "rich" as some might think. Most of her "riches" are tied up in assets that were given as gifts. More on this below.
- 2. What happens after all the money is gone? Then where does that get us? The poor are still poor and now the Church's art, buildings, etc. are in the hands of those that might not appreciate them or steward them as well as the Church.
- 3. The "Church" isn't just the hierarchy, it is all of us. The art, buildings, and even money is controlled by certain people, but belongs to all of us. The Pope and/or Bishops can't just sell everything off because they think it is a good idea.
- 4. The People of God have provided the Church with the riches she has. Therefore the people have a right to be able to have the intent of their donations honored. If I gave the Vatican a priceless work of art to preserve and they sold it to the highest bidder, I would be royally miffed.
- 5. Has anyone asked the poor if they want cash for Church assets? If I were poor and gave my widow's mite to build a church and then you went and sold it without asking me I might just go apoplectic. Ask a poor & pious Catholic the next time you get the chance.
- 6. The Catholic Church does more to aid the poor than any other private organization already. This points to an inconvenient fact. Many who make this argument aren't arguing for the poor, but against the Catholic Church. Remember that many religious brothers, sisters, and priests take a vow of poverty and renounce everything for God.
- 7. The issue of poverty isn't about an amount of money (there is plenty to go around), but about personal greed, corruption, injustice, governmental problems, economic systems, etc.
- 8. The greatest need is spiritual poverty not material poverty. Thus, the Church should use the gifts she has been given to erase this poverty first.
- 9. Worship of God is the first justice issue. We owe God our worship before we owe any other human anything. Thus, if art, buildings, gold vessels, etc. can aid us to worship God, then we are fulfilling the requirements of justice.
- 10. The total Vatican budget is less than \$400 million. Most large universities have this budget several times over. The Church's wealth wouldn't do much more for the poor.

As you can probably see, the argument is quite simply answered by the following quote from Jesus: "The poor you will always have with you, but you will not always have me." - Matt 26:11

The purpose of serving the poor is to show your love of both God and man. What better way of showing love to both God and man, but by loving both in the person of Jesus Christ?

Dado que las lecturas de este fin de semana hablan de riqueza, aquí hay un extracto de un artículo titulado: "10 Razones Por Las Que La Iglesia Católica NO Debe Vender Sus "Riquezas" Y Dar Dinero A Los Pobres", de Marcel, fechada el 17 de septiembre de 2014 en el sitio web de aggiecatholicblog:

- 1. La Iglesia Católica no es tan "rica" como algunos podrían pensar. La mayoría de sus "riquezas" están atadas en activos que fueron dados como regalos. Más sobre esto a continuación.
- 2. ¿Qué sucede después de que todo el dinero se ha ido? Entonces, ¿adónde nos lleva eso? Los pobres siguen siendo pobres y ahora el arte, los edificios, etc. de la Iglesia están en manos de aquellos que tal vez no los aprecien o los administren, así como la Iglesia.
- 3. La "Iglesia" no es sólo la jerarquía, somos todos nosotros. El arte, los edificios e incluso el dinero están controlados por ciertas personas, pero nos pertenece a todos. El Papa y/o los obispos no pueden venderlo todo porque creen que es una buena idea.
- 4. El Pueblo de Dios ha proporcionado a la Iglesia las riquezas que tiene. Por lo tanto, el pueblo tiene derecho a poder tener la intención de honrar sus donaciones. Si le diera al Vaticano una obra de arte invaluable para preservarla y la vendieran al mejor postor, me estaría realmente confundido.
- 5. ¿Alguien ha preguntado a los pobres si quieren dinero en efectivo para los bienes de la Iglesia? Si yo fuera pobre y le diera el ácaro de mi viuda para construir una iglesia y luego fueras y la vendieras sin preguntarme que podría ir apoplejía. Pregúntale a un católico pobre y piadoso la próxima vez que tengas la oportunidad.
- 6. La Iglesia Católica hace más para ayudar a los pobres que cualquier otra organización privada. Esto apunta a un hecho inconveniente. Muchos de los que hacen este argumento no están argumentando por los pobres, sino contra la Iglesia Católica. Recuerden que muchos hermanos, hermanas y sacerdotes religiosos hacen un voto de pobreza y renuncian a todo por Dios.
- 7. El tema de la pobreza no se trata de una cantidad de dinero (hay mucho que recorrer), sino de codicia personal, corrupción, injusticia, problemas gubernamentales, sistemas económicos, etc.
- 8. La mayor necesidad es la pobreza espiritual, no la pobreza material. Por lo tanto, la Iglesia debe utilizar primero los dones que se le han dado para borrar esta pobreza.
- 9. La adoración a Dios es la primera cuestión de justicia. Le debemos a Dios nuestra adoración antes de que le debamos cualquier otra cosa humana. Por lo tanto, si el arte, los edificios, los vasos de oro, etc. pueden ayudarnos a adorar a Dios, entonces estamos cumpliendo con los requisitos de la justicia.
- 10. El presupuesto total del Vaticano es inferior a 400 millones de dólares. La mayoría de las universidades grandes tienen este presupuesto varias veces. La riqueza de la Iglesia no haría mucho más por los pobres.

Como probablemente se puede ver, el argumento es simplemente respondido por la siguiente cita de Jesús: "Los pobres que siempre tendrán con ustedes, pero no siempre me tendrán." -Mateo 26:11

El propósito de servir a los pobres es mostrar tu amor tanto por Dios como por el hombre. ¿Qué mejor manera de mostrar amor tanto a Dios como al hombre, sino amando a ambos en la persona de Jesucristo?


