

Year of St. Joseph

Pope Francis announced a
"Year of St. Joseph"
on Tuesday, December 8, 2020
– the Solemnity of the
Immaculate Conception – in
honor of the 150th anniversary
of Pope Pius IX's proclamation
in 1870 of St. Joseph as "Patron
of the Universal Church"
(Quemadmodum Deus). The
"Year of St. Joseph" began on
December 8, 2020, and will
conclude on December 8, 2021,
according to the Decree
authorized by the Pope.

The Decree states that Pope Francis established a "Year of St. Joseph" so that "every member of the faithful, following his example, may strengthen their life of faith daily in the complete fulfillment of God's will." The Decree adds that the Pope has granted special Indulgences to mark the year. The December 8, 2020 Decree was issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary, which is the dicastery of the Roman Curia that oversees the practice of Indulgences.

Feast of St Joseph Society



Every year a group of parishioners would make an annual pilgrimage to San Pedro, California to attend the St. Joseph feast day and table. After many years of this annual pilgrimage, Father Vincent Posilico, associate pastor at the time, posed the question, "Why don't we bring the St Joseph Feast and Table to Our Lady of the Rosary.

On March 19, 1988, the St. Joseph Society was formally established at Our Lady of the Rosary. The annual St. Joseph Feast Day Celebration and Table have become woven in the fabric of the Italian traditions celebrated yearly at Our Lady of the Rosary. The St. Joseph Society's celebration coincide with the feast day of its name sake; St. Joseph. Every year on the Sunday around March 19, one will see a flurry of woman bring food and decorations to prepare for the celebration at Our Lady of the Rosary.

From the humble beginnings of a small handful of members; today, the society has grown to include more than a 165 members. Several times a year the members get together to host events and activities; all to raise money for the poor. The society's crown jewel of events is the very event that formed the group; the St. Joseph's Feast Day and Table. The focal point of the celebration is the table to honor St. Joseph. The lavish table is adorned with fresh vegetables, fruits, and Italian bread freshly baked into many shapes and sizes. (Pictured above)



In addition to the table; the members come together to make delicious traditional Italian and Sicilian foods to sell. These delectable spreads include sfinge, pasta a sarde, sfinciuni, arrancini, panelli, pasta fagiolli, sausage sandwiches, and no event at OLR is complete without the famous Italian Cookies and Pastries.





Over the thirty three years of St. Joseph day celebrations and table the society has raisedOver thirty three years of celebrations, the St. Joseph society has raised thousands of dollars to assist the poor in the community. The money raised has helped support individuals or families with a variety of financial needs; such as rent, medicines, utilities, and groceries.

Last year was no exception for this society. Despite the challenges in acquiring food and being on the heels of a complete lock down due to a global pandemic; St. Joseph Feast Day Celebration and Table still raised several thousand to assist the needy in 2020.



The History of the St Joseph's Table

St. Joseph is one of the most venerated saints in Christianity: He is the patron saint of immigrants, workers, unborn children, refugees, fathers, and craftspeople, among others. According to tradition, the practice of creating large food altars, called "Tavola di San Giuseppe" or St. Joseph's Tables, dates to the Middle Ages, when there was a severe drought and famine in Sicily. The peasants prayed to St. Joseph, and when the rains arrived, they organized a celebration in his honor. March 19th is, in Italy, also Father's Day, as St. Joseph was, of course, the foster father of Jesus. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" and a renewal of the Sicilian people's devotion to Saint Joseph.



Coming to America

Sicilian immigrants brought this practice with them to the United States. The table altars, long orchestrated by women, are erected as an expression of gratitude or in fulfillment of a vow made to St. Joseph. They were originally constructed in private homes before expanding into churches and community centers. Because the tables are blessed, they are considered an intersection between the sacred and the profane. St. Joseph feast day celebrations typically include a large community meal at which all are welcomed, and charity is extended to those Mary and Joseph Borgia next to the St. in need.







