Inside the Cathedral of the Diocese of Issele-Uku

The Diocese of Issele-Uku was created on the 5th of July, 1973. Located in Delta State, Nigeria, it covers a total area of about 3011 square kilometers (1871 square miles). By God's grace, missionary work through grassroots evangelization continues to bear abundant fruit. Currently, the diocese has a total population of 2,805,300 people, of which Catholic population is 850,000. We have 94 parishes, 235 diocesan priests, 107 women religious from different congregations and 60 Major Seminarians. Our present Bishop is Most Reverend Dr. Michael Odogwu Elue.

Meeting the Challenge

The situation of widespread poverty, hunger, and desolation in Nigeria and Africa is an open secret. Unemployment is an extraordinary challenge both in the public and private sector. Before the advent of COVID 19 pandemic, unemployment rate for youths alone is 38 percent; general unemployment is over 50 percent. If you advertise for one job position, you'll have thousands of people outside vying for the job. COVID pandemic only made matters worse. The regular lifestyle before COVID was that most of our people survive on petty trading and subsistence farming, yet remain very resilient and contribute generously, especially in time and talent: most of our churches are built mainly through direct labor – no construction zones – parishioners carry pans and buckets supplying water, gravel and sand to help reduce the cost of construction.

"They gave according to their means... and beyond their means, of their own free will, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints"

(2Cor 8:3-4).

Our Needs and Missionary Co-Op Priority



New evangelization outreach

Our needs in terms of the material resources and necessary infrastructure for the work of evangelization are enormous. We're making a steady progress toward proper rehabilitation of the Catholic Schools returned to the Diocese by the Delta State Government in October 2011, after thirty years of structural neglects and moral decadence in schools. But we still have a long way to go regarding reconstruction and rehabilitation.

The Diocesan Orphanages/Homes of the aged and the Diocesan mini-Health Facilities and clinics continue to pose a great challenge. However, because of the limited scope of income generated from Missionary Cooperation, our priority for the Appeal is the Training of Seminarians (future priests); the cost of training continues to rise. Besides, the seminarians themselves engage in manual work such as farming in the seminary, using cutlasses, shovels and hoes in order to subsidize their entire cost of training.

FEAST OF FAITH - The Preface Dialogue

"Lift up your hearts." "We lift them up to the Lord." "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God." "It is right to give him thanks and praise." With this ancient dialogue we enter the Eucharistic Prayer, the heart of the Mass. These venerable words have been part of the Christian liturgy almost from the beginning—by the time of Hippolytus of Rome (c. 215) they were already fixed in the liturgy.

Several times during the Mass the priest has invited us to pray. There is something different here. We are invited to be "lifted up," to ascend, to climb the Lord's mountain, as it were, to go to a new place for this most solemn part of the Mass. And we are invited to a new frame of mind, a sense of joy, of focused dedication: our hearts must not be cast down, but lifted up, and lifted to the Lord. Why? Because we are going to give thanks—we are going to "eucharist!" It is right and just that we do this.

MANY GRAINS, ONE LOAF

Over the next few weeks the Gospels will contain stories about bread.

Today we hear about Jesus feeding a large crowd with a few loaves of bread and some fish.

In later weeks, Jesus calls himself our "living bread."

Did you ever wonder why Jesus used bread as the sign to remind us of his presence among us? Think about how bread is made. Most of our bread is made from wheat. When the wheat is ripe it is gathered and the grains ground into flour. The flour is then mixed with other ingredients and baked in an oven. Only then can the loaf of bread be shared and eaten. The many individual grains of wheat become one loaf of bread that we share.

Put the pictures in these squares in order by numbering them from $1\ \mbox{to}\ 4.$


The bread we share at Eucharist might look like one of these pictures.

Each time we receive Jesus in the form of bread, we say we believe that we are united with all those around the world who also receive Jesus.



A hymn often sung at Communion time reminds us that, just as the bread is one loaf made from many grains, so are we, many people throughout the world, united as one body in Christ.
