

Signs and Wonders

Today's Gospel continues into a second day the narrative that had begun the day before when, after crossing the lake to look for Jesus, a large crowd are fed with five barley loaves and two fish. The following day (today's reading), after more lake crossings, the people who had been miraculously fed are again searching for

Jesus. However, they do so (as Jesus puts it) "not because you saw signs, but because you ate the loaves and were filled" (John 6:6).

In John's Gospel, the word "sign" has a distinct meaning. At the wedding at Cana, after telling how Jesus turned water into wine, the Evangelist notes "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs" that "revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him" (John 2:11). For John, signs are not just wonders to behold; they are about the revelation of God and a response of faith in Jesus.



Inside the Cathedral of the Diocese of Issele-Uku

The Diocese of Issele-Uku was created on the 5th of July, 1973. Located in Delta State, Nigeria, it covers a total area of about 3011 square kilometers (1871 square miles). By God's grace, missionary work through grassroots evangelization continues to bear abundant fruit. Currently, the diocese has a total population of 2,805,300 people, of which Catholic population is 850,000. We have 94 parishes, 235 diocesan priests, 107 women religious from different congregations and 60 Major Seminarians. Our present Bishop is Most Reverend Dr. Michael Odogwu Elue.

Meeting the Challenge

The situation of widespread poverty, hunger, and desolation in Nigeria and Africa is an open secret. Unemployment is an extraordinary challenge both in the public and private sector. Before the advent of COVID 19 pandemic, unemployment rate for youths alone is 38 percent; general unemployment is over 50 percent. If you advertise for one job position, you'll have thousands of people outside vying for the job. COVID pandemic only made matters worse. The regular lifestyle before COVID was that most of our people survive on petty trading and subsistence farming, yet remain very resilient and contribute generously, especially in time and talent: most of our churches are built mainly through direct labor – no construction zones – parishioners carry pans and buckets supplying water, gravel and sand to help reduce the cost of construction.

"They gave according to their means... and beyond their means, of their own free will, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints"

(2Cor 8:3-4).

Our Needs and Missionary Co-Op Priority



New evangelization outreach

Our needs in terms of the material resources and necessary infrastructure for the work of evangelization are enormous. We're making a steady progress toward proper rehabilitation of the Catholic Schools returned to the Diocese by the Delta State Government in October 2011, after thirty years of structural neglects and moral decadence in schools. But we still have a long way to go regarding reconstruction and rehabilitation.

The Diocesan Orphanages/Homes of the aged and the Diocesan mini-Health Facilities and clinics continue to pose a great challenge. However, because of the limited scope of income generated from Missionary Cooperation, our priority for the Appeal is the Training of Seminarians (future priests); the cost of training continues to rise. Besides, the seminarians themselves engage in manual work such as farming in the seminary, using cutlasses, shovels and hoes in order to subsidize their entire cost of training.

FEAST OF FAITH - The Preface Thanksgiving

The preface of the Mass has been called "a poem, the cry of joy and recognition, the song of the world discovering its salvation . . . the certitude of faith making hope spring forth" (Philippe Béguerie, quoted in The Mass, Lucien Deiss, The Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, 1992, p. 70). The preface takes up the last words of the dialogue, and expresses briefly and simply why we are grateful, why it is right and just to give thanks and praise to God. On feast days, the preface sings of the specific mystery or saint we celebrate; in Ordinary Time, the Sunday and weekday prefaces express our gratitude for God's gift of the Son, Jesus Christ, in whom we have redemption and newness of life. The prefaces offer a succinct account of what God has done for us in Christ; they express the mystery of faith, always relating it to us, to our lives. "By his birth we are reborn," we hear in Preface IV for Sundays in Ordinary Time. "By his suffering we are freed from sin. By his rising from the dead we rise to everlasting life." I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

Jesus speaks about bread again today, teaching the people that God has given them "the true bread from heaven" that "gives life to the world"—Jesus himself. "I am the bread of life," he tells them. People who heard this found it hard to understand and believe.

It is hard for us to understand, too, but we do believe.

Right before Communion time at Mass the priest raises the bread and cup, the Body and Blood of Jesus, and says:

"Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."

We look at Jesus, present in the bread and wine, and pray:

"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."

This Mass prayer only lasts a moment, but a devotion called Eucharistic Adoration allows us to gaze in prayer at Jesus, the Bread of Life, for a longer period of time, usually an hour, called a Holy Hour. We spend this time praying quietly in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. We can think about how Jesus' presence in us should make a difference in how we act and speak.

The consecrated bread is placed in a monstrance, a vessel usually made of gold and beautifully decorated, often with jewels. After prayers and song, the Holy Hour ends with a special blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.

If your parish has a Holy Hour you might consider attending with someone from your family. If not, see if you can take a few minutes sometime during the week to make a visit to church and pray quietly before the tabernacle. These words are part of the Divine Praises, one of the prayers said during Eucharistic Adoration. You can pray them by yourself when you visit.

Blessed be God.
Blessed be his holy name.
Blessed be the name of Jesus.
Blessed be Jesus in the most holy sacrament of the altar.
