Looking Back on the Restoration



Above: Elizabeth, the art restorer is seen cleaning "The Assumption of Mary." The area from her hand to the left has been cleaned. The right has not been cleaned.



"The Assumption of Mary" was one of the paintings requiring to be re-adhered to the ceiling. In the photo above a portion of the canvas is draped over placement rods. The rods are keeping the rest of the image secure to the ceiling. A layer of adhesive is applied to the ceiling, it has to cure before the canvas could be re-adhered.

Three days after her death, Mary's soul was reunited with her body and both were assumed into heaven. In Fausto Tasca's depiction of "The Assumption of Mary," he illustrates Mary standing on a cloud being raised into heaven escorted by angels. The Apostles look upward from the earth, witnessing her body, now reunited with her soul, be carried into heaven.

How do we know that those are the Apostles?

Fausto Tasca was deliberate in each art piece he created for the church. The Assumption of Mary images depicts some of the apostles in the church and a few over the altar. Fausto Tasca painted each saint with one color for the garment and another for the sash. No two images are painted with the same color combinations.

Fausto Tasca's careful attention to detail is realized in this painting. One is able to determine which saint is seen watching Our Blessed Mother being lifted to the heavens.


This detail in different color combinations aids the viewer as to which Saint is depicted in the different scenes throughout the church.

FEAST OF FAITH - The Shape of the Eucharistic Prayer

Our Eucharistic Prayers originated in the traditional Jewish meal prayers known as berakah, which were prayers of thanksgiving used at meals. Over the centuries, the Christian thanksgiving, or Eucharist, gradually took shape. While in the East the Eucharistic Prayers (called anaphora) took many forms, in the Roman Church there was for many centuries just one Eucharistic Prayer, called the Roman Canon (now known as Eucharistic Prayer I). Almost all Eucharistic Prayers include the same basic elements. They begin with thanksgiving and acclamation. Then there is an epiclesis, as the priest calls down the Holy Spirit upon the gifts. Then follows the institution narrative and consecration, as the words that Jesus spoke at the Last Supper are repeated. After the consecration, we remember in an explicit way all that Christ has done for us—this is the anamnesis, or remembering. The prayer concludes with the offering, the intercessions—prayers for the Church, our leaders, ourselves—and a final doxology of praise.

The reforms of the Second Vatican Council enriched our liturgy with additional Eucharistic Prayers, including both ancient texts (Eucharistic Prayer II is based on the most ancient of all existing Eucharistic Prayers) and new compositions.

THE SEVEN JOYS OF MARY

We observe the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on August 15. This feast celebrates our belief that Mary was taken ("assumed"), body and soul, into heaven. Mary is the first person to share fully in Christ's promise of the Resurrection. The Assumption is one of the most important feasts of Mary celebrated during the church year.

The Assumption is one of the Seven Joys of Mary, seven events in her life that filled her with joy. They continue to bring joy to all those who honor Mary and love her Son, Jesus.
