



The Actual shrine of the Madonna Paradiso was designed by Bishop De La Torre and was inaugurated on November 8, 1808. The Shrine was constructed upon a small church dedicated in the 1500's to Our Lady of the Rosary. The painted image of the Madonna is a life size bust whose artisan was Sabastian Conca. The painting is encased in a marble-like frame balanced with 2 angels on each side. (pictured above)



In Mazara, a liturgy and mass is celebrated on November 4 of each year. On the second Sunday of each July there is a procession followed by thousands of people as the Madonna's image is taken from church to church.



## The Miraculous Madonna del Paradiso



There has been a following for the Madonna del Paradiso in Mazara since the beginning of the 18th century. The Ligurian priests were asked to follow a spiritual study that was two-months long and was led by Monsignor Orazio De La Torre. De La Torre, originally from Palermo, was assigned to the Diosese of Mazara del Vallo for 19 years. In the second half of the spiritual exercise, the participants were praying within the chapel of the holy temple where the painted image of the Madonna del Paradiso was kept. At approximately 9 pm on November 3,

1797, the eyes on the painting, which were painted skyward, miraculously moved and focused on the participants in the chapel. The eye movements repeated several times during the evening, astonishing the people who were present.

Later, the painting of the Madonna was moved to the Cathedral in Mazara. This move was accompanied by thousands of Mazaresi processing and praying. During the vigil that followed and throughout the next day, the people were astonished—the eyes of the painted image continued to move! This miraculous experience was repeated on the paintings at the monasteries of St. Catherine, St. Veneranda and St. Michael's.

From December 10, 1797, through the month of June 1798, the Bishop ordered an investigation to prove the validity of the unimaginable reports. When the Bishop himself witnessed the miracle, he applied to the Vatican for the coronation of the Madonna. On April 10, 1803, the image was decreed and coronated by the Vatican.

The eye movements reoccurred on October 20, 1807, as testified by Don Giuseppe Marie Tomasi of the royal family of Lampedusa. More reports of the miracle are recorded for the years 1810, 1811, 1866, and at various other times. The last recorded movement was observed in the Cathedral in 1981.

Locally, we tailor this tradition by having our beautiful image of the Madonna taken to individual homes for 9 days in the first half of November. Families and friends gather and pray the rosary each day at a different home. Members of the society volunteer to host the event which is often celebrated by a meal or dessert at the end of the evening. This is a wonderful opportunity to share our tradition and exchange stories about our faith. It is also customary to pin monetary donations on the blue ribbon attached to the image during the visitations and festa celebration.

Now, the beautiful the image in the church is encased in a custom made Vara that was designed by Leonardo Ingrande. The original founder of The Society del Paradiso was Jerry Ingrande. He asked the priest to allow the image that was brought to America in the early 1900's to be displayed in the church. Sara Asaro Terramagra donated the portrait to the church and it has been safely preserved by relatives in the Zottolo Frontiero family. It is important to note that it was a collaborative effort among many people especially with the assistance of a devoted parish member known as La Contessa (Josie Sciuto) who played a key role in convincing Monsignor Trevasani to agree to place the image in the church. We will always be grateful for those before us who made it possible to carry on the meaningful devotional tradition as it is done in Mazara. We continue to embrace it today with the significant contributions and unending support of our Society members.

# Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

## **Gospel Summary**

It is clear from this passage in Luke's Gospel that when the world ends, some terrifying events will occur. The clear message, however, is that we should not face these events with apprehension, but rather with trust — trust that God wants us to have everlasting life with him. Instead of being afraid, we are called to find strength and courage in God's love and persevere in our faith.

## **Reflection for Families**

Today's Gospel makes it clear that we should persevere in our faith and be faithful disciples. We are most responsible for evangelizing our own children. There is an expression, "Faith is caught, not taught." How do our children see us live out our faith? How do we witness the greatness of God's love and our personal response to that love? Share with your child(ren) what it means for you to walk with Jesus.


## Bringing the Gospel Into Your Family

## The End of Days

As we prepare for next Sunday's feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we hear descriptions of dire and catastrophic events. Sometimes it seems as though we ourselves are living in the end times, when life as we currently know it will cease for everyone. In answer to what must have been a fearful question, Jesus does not sugarcoat his foretelling of future days. Nor does the Old Testament prophet Malachi flinch from his pronouncements upon an evil world. Saint Paul, still writing to the Thessalonians, warns them prophetically against succumbing to "The End Is Near" syndrome—indolence in the face of the final days. However, both Jesus and Malachi speak of the recompense for living a just life—healing and vindication. Our Psalm 98, typically associated with Christmastime, helps us to rejoice for the King who is coming to rule with justice.


# PRAYING TWICE

The Academy of Music (Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia) was founded in Rome by Pope Sixtus V in 1585. Named for St. Cecilia, it was established under the invocation of the Blessed Virgin; Pope St. Gregory I, credited as the author of Gregorian chant; and St. Cecilia, the patron saint of music and musicians. The Academy's first location was the Church of Santa Maria ad Martyres, also known as the Pantheon. You can see pictures of its beautiful auditorium online.

On November 22 we remember St. Cecilia. Many choirs and music societies are named in honor of St. Cecilia and look to her as their patron. Is there a window or picture or statue of St. Cecilia in your church? Does your parish have a choir? Do you know how many members it has? What instruments help make music at your church? What is your favorite hymn to sing with the choir?

St. Augustine said, "The one who sings prays twice." What do you think he meant?

You might hear some of these instruments in a church. Color the ones that you have heard in your parish. Choose one to draw on the front of a card. Inside, write a note to the director of your choir describing how much you appreciate the music they provide. You can present your card to the choir directly after Mass one day or send it to your parish office. Remember, you are a member of the Church and so are responsible—with the choir or cantor—for much of the sung prayer at Mass.
