

Looking Back on Restoration



Feast of the Assumption of Mary August 15

Three days after her death, Mary's soul was reunited with her body and both were assumed into heaven. In Fausto Tasca's



depiction of "The Assumption of Mary," he illustrates Mary standing on a cloud being raised into heaven escorted by angels. The Apostles look up from the earth to witness her body, now reunited with her soul, to rise to heaven.

How do we know that those are the Apostles?

Fausto Tasca was deliberate in each art piece he created for the church. The apostles images that line the interior of the church are painted with a one color for the garment and another for the sash. No two apostles are painted with the same color combinations. This detail in different color combinations aids the viewer as to which Apostle is depicted in the different scenes throughout the church. In this scene Fausto Tasca also included the four Gospels from the painting over the altar.

"The Assumption of Mary" was one of the canvas paintings that needed to be readhered to the ceiling. In the photo below there is a portion of the image that is draped over placement rods. The rod are keeping the rest of the image secure to the ceiling. After the adhesive has been applied to the ceiling, it has to cure before the canvas can be re-adhered.

Gospel Summary

As Jesus announced his mission, he made it clear that there would be no compromising. Called to repentance and challenged to be ready, discipleship would most likely divide households and communities. He knew already that there were divisions among the Jewish leaders. He warned his followers that they, too, might face divisions among their own families. While these repercussions would cause pain, it would also mark the coming of God's Kingdom.

Reflection for Families

Sometimes we have to take an unpopular stand against the ideas of others. When we say "no" to someone who wants to hear "yes," division is created. Parents make decisions that serve a purpose and guide the formation of their children. Friends may say "no" to each other creating division. Of course, healing and reconciliation are vital to the growth of all relationships; and this is basically the same concept as today's Gospel. There will be hard and unpopular acts associated with following Jesus. As a loving parent, God won't compromise the plan. As loving family members, we also understand God's motive!

Bringing the Gospel Into Your Family

Find a family movie that illustrates this Gospel message: Doing something that's right even though it's difficult and sometimes unpopular. One possibility is from Lion King when Simba decides to return home. Share your ideas about what was hard for Simba in his decision. Who helped him? Who suffered because of his decision? Who benefited? What divisions were evident and what reconciliations took place? Think about ways our own lives are like this and share your ideas with one another.

Spirit Fire in the Summer

A generation or two ago, these Summer Sundays in Ordinary Time would have been known as Sundays "of Pentecost." That naming convention helped recall that the Spirit's Pentecost fire was carrying us through all the Sundays until the end of the liturgical year. Though we may no longer use that name for these Sundays, the underlying reality is the same. The fire that Jesus speaks about today is the blaze of the Spirit. The fire he spoke about when he told his followers they were light for the world was the flame of the Spirit lighting the lamp of discipleship. It takes courageous disciples to allow the blazing fire of which Jesus speaks into their lives, to allow its light, warmth, and even cleansing to work in them and through them. Though we may not want to think about the heat of the Spirit's fire on a summer Sunday, that Spirit is always with us, burning within.








THE CARDINAL VIRTUES

Do you have the supplies you need to prepare for the beginning of the school year—folders, notebooks, colored pencils? A new school year is a chance for a new start.

It is also important to prepare yourself for the school year. These preparations are not supplies you can buy; they are qualities you have to work at developing. These qualities are called the cardinal virtues. The word "cardinal" comes from the Latin *cardo*, which means "hinge." This word is a reminder that your behavior and the qualities that make you a good person hinge on or depend upon practicing these virtues every day. The cardinal virtues are prudence, justice, temperance, and fortitude.

- If you are *prudent*, you will think about what might be the right thing to do before you do something.
- If you practice *justice* you will be sure to treat each person fairly and not put yourself above anyone else.
- Temperance helps you keep everything in balance and not overdo any activities, even study, reading, play, and exercise
- You will need fortitude, which means strength and courage, if you have to face difficult decisions or actions.


