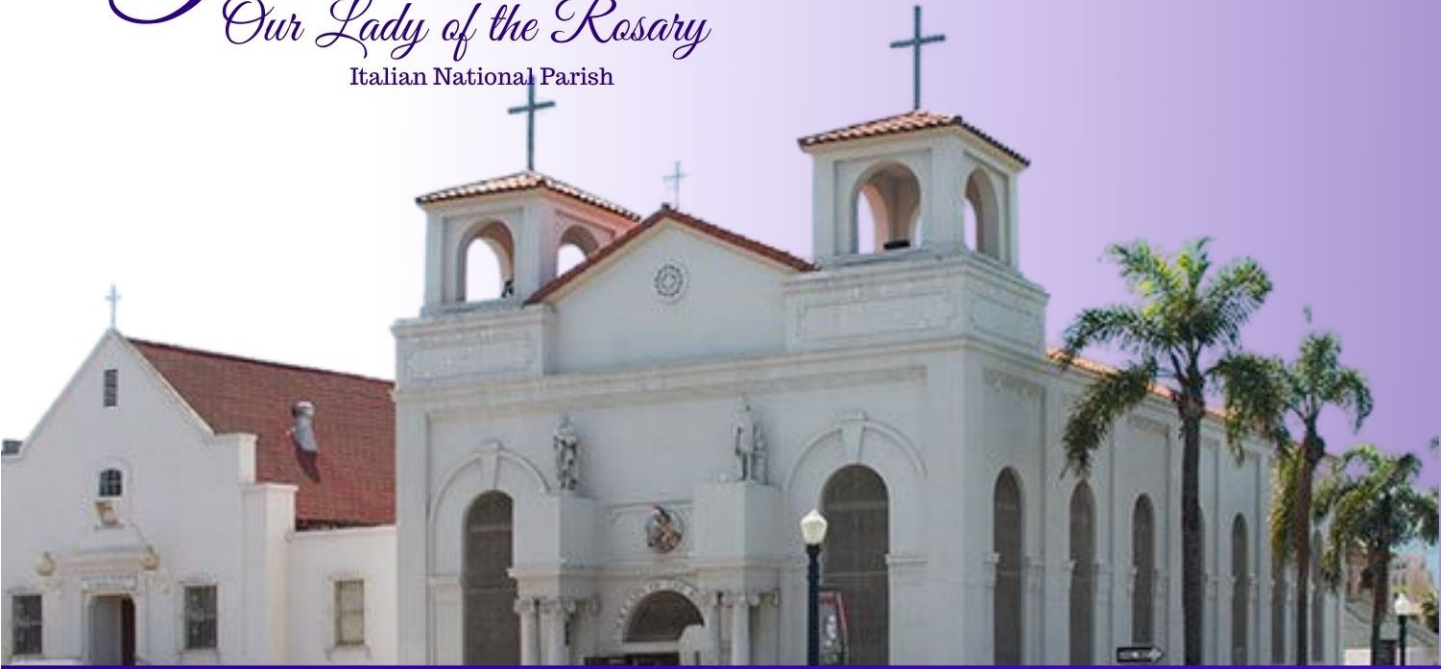

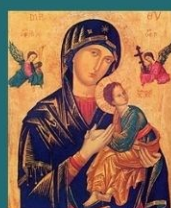

First Sunday of Lent

Gospel Summary

Each year, at the beginning of Lent, the lectionary has us hear the story of the devil tempting Jesus in the desert. This year we hear Luke's version. Following his baptism, Jesus went out into the desert for forty days during which time he ate nothing. Knowing that Jesus would be hungry, the devil tempted him to turn a stone into bread. When Jesus did not, the devil showed him all the kingdoms of the earth, promising Jesus all the glory and power of them if Jesus would worship the devil. Again Jesus refused. Finally, Satan took Jesus to the top of the temple in Jerusalem and told him to jump because God's angels would save him. Jesus refused each of the three temptations by quoting scripture from the book of Deuteronomy thus making clear his obedience to God.

Reflection for Families

Sometimes we think only of the divinity of Jesus and forget how difficult these temptations must have been for the human Jesus. We face far lesser temptations every day and some we resist while others we give in to. When we think of obedience like daily exercises, it becomes habit and we condition ourselves to obey God. Through our example and guidance, parents can help their children do the same thing. If the temptations are hard to resist, we know Jesus understands our difficulty because he went through a similar experience. He will be there for us when we ask for his help.

Bringing the Gospel Into Your Family

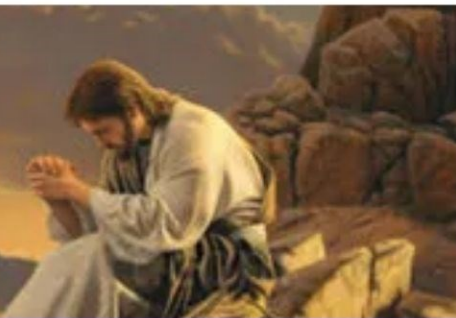
Now, at the beginning of this Lent, make a list of all the temptations each family member faces at home, at school, at work, in the neighborhood. Next to each temptation write down ways you will work to avoid them. Allow all family members to help one another with suggestions and make a time in each day of Lent to pray for each person as he/she works to resist the temptations he/she faces.

The Spirit led Jesus into the desert for forty days, and then the devil tempted him. Moses and the Israelites had been in the desert for forty years before being led to the land flowing with milk and honey. There were times when they called on God, certain that, as St. Paul writes to the Romans, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Sometimes we also spend time in the desert. It is literally not a desert many times, but a desert in which it seems difficult to perceive the presence of God, moments in which we face difficulty and are tempted to leave God's ways behind. On this First Sunday of Lent, Jesus shows us what to do in those moments: stand firm and trust in God.

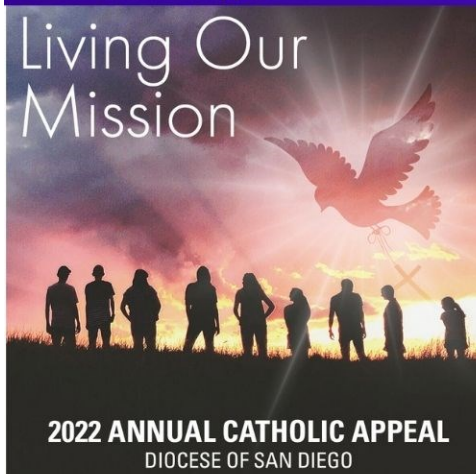

LENTEN COMPANIONS: THE ELECT

6 weeks to Easter:
We travel with the elect.

Lent is a journey, though not a journey of steps or miles. Lent is a spiritual journey that happens inside us. We start out in one place, and if we are faithful to the practices of Lent, we will arrive at a different place on Easter morning, a place that is closer to God.

It is good to have a companion on a journey, someone who can show us the way, keep us company, and help us if we are in trouble. Each week we will learn about someone with whom we can journey this Lent.

This week our companions will be the elect, people who have been chosen by God for baptism and have asked for baptism in the Catholic Church. In the book of Isaiah God tells Israel, "I have called you by name: you are mine. You are precious in my eyes" (Isaiah 43:1, 4). This is true of all of us as well as the elect.

The elect have been on a long spiritual journey, lasting a year or more. They have studied and learned what it means to be Catholic. Perhaps they've seen people like you acting as Jesus taught. That might have encouraged them to become part of our Catholic Christian family. At the Easter Vigil they will be baptized and confirmed and receive their First Communion.

Are there any elect in your parish? Perhaps their names are written in the parish bulletin. You can journey with them during Lent by praying for them by name. If there are no elect in your parish, you can pray for all the people around the world who are preparing for baptism into the Catholic Church.

When a child is baptized, the priest traces the sign of the cross on the child's forehead and says, "I claim you for Christ our Savior by the sign of his cross," and invites the parents and godparents to do the same.

Count the number of crosses you see in your church. Take notice of where they are and what they look like. Decorate this cross while you say a prayer for your companions, the elect.
