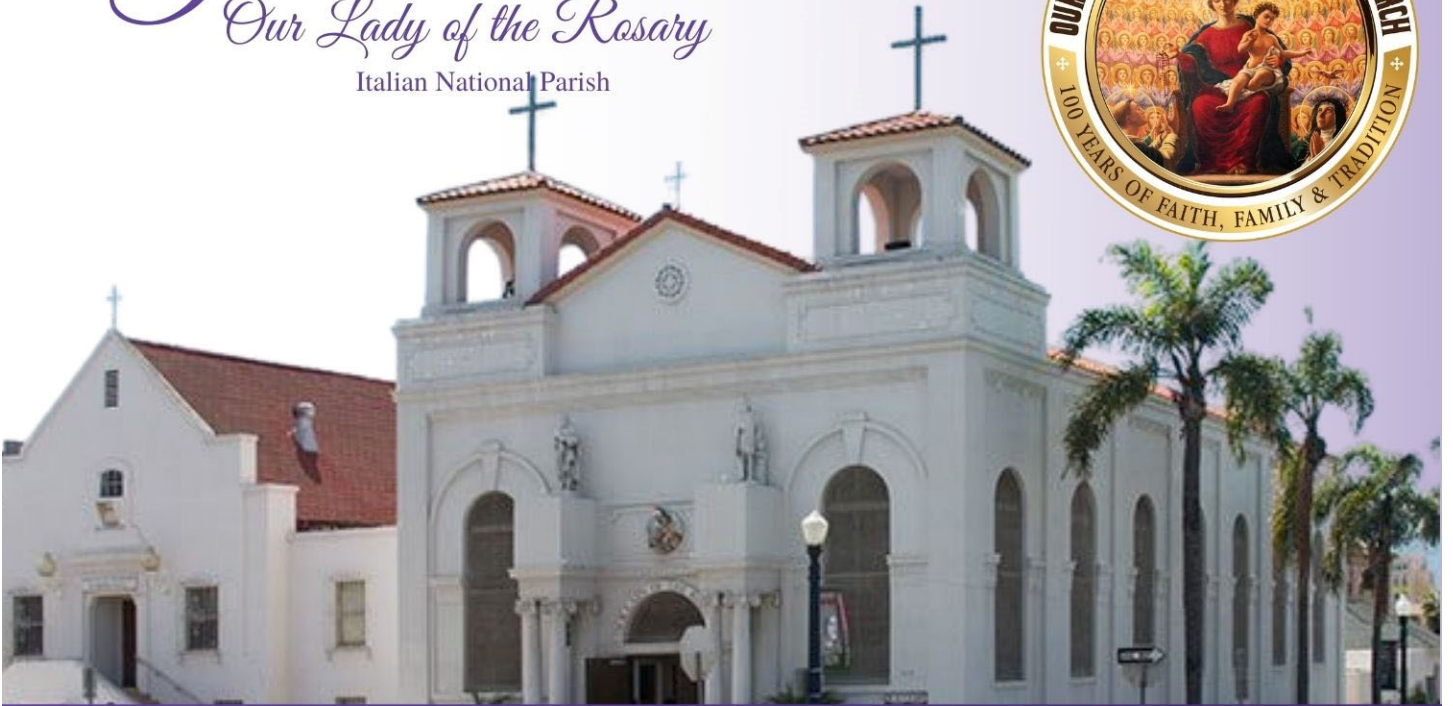
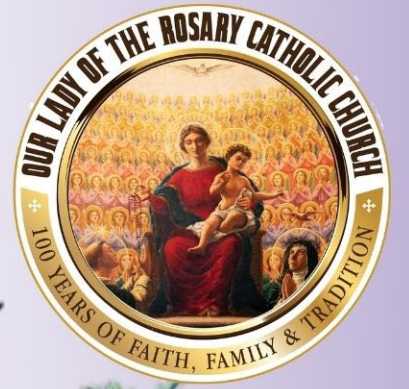


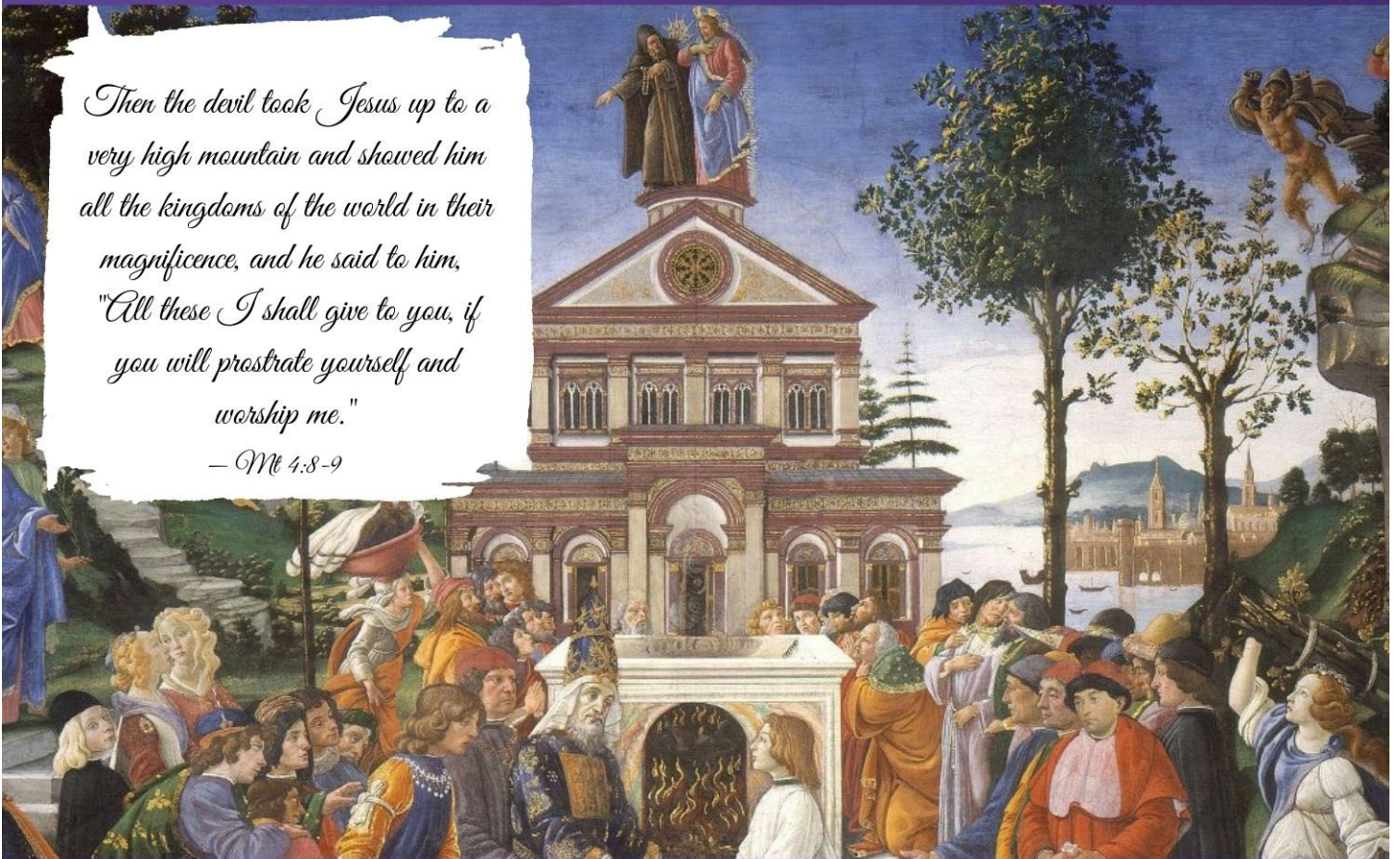

Gospel Summary

Following his baptism in the Jordan River, Jesus went out to the desert, alone for 40 days, to pray and understand God's will. Satan waited until Jesus emerged from the desert to tempt him. "Command these stones to become loaves of bread," was the first dare. Later the devil asked Jesus to jump from the top of the temple, asking him to use God's angels to save him. Finally, Satan offered Jesus the glory and power of all the world if he would but worship Satan. Jesus said: "Get away, Satan! It is written: 'You shall worship the Lord your God and only Him shall you serve.'"

Bringing the Gospel into your Family

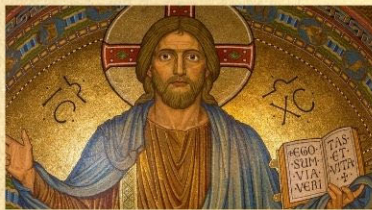

Lent - Solidarity with Catechumens

One of the liturgical reforms mandated at the Second Vatican Council was that the focus of the season of Lent should be restored as a time of preparation for—or renewal of—baptism. The bishops at the Council were aware of the fact that the origins of Lent as a distinctive liturgical season lay in the early centuries when the Church celebrated the sacraments of Christian initiation only once a year, at the Easter Vigil. In order to prepare those who were to receive those sacraments, a special period of preparation (eventually lasting forty days) gradually developed.

The introduction of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and the revision of the Lectionary after the Council have changed all of that. Now the Sunday scripture readings during Lent are very carefully selected with an eye to the journey of those preparing to be initiated at the Easter Vigil. Once again, the entire community is asked to undergo penance in solidarity with the candidates for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Thus, in order to appreciate fully the meaning of the readings during this season, the "filter" through which they must be heard is always the knowledge that we are helping to prepare our sisters and brothers in the catechumenate for their initiation at the Easter Vigil.

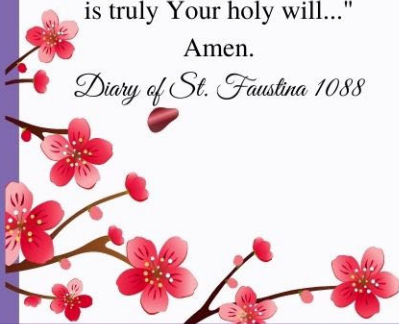

The remaining letters will spell out what the devil wanted Jesus to command the stones to become. You can read the story in your Bible at Matthew 4:1-11.

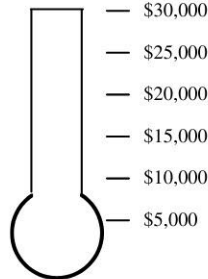

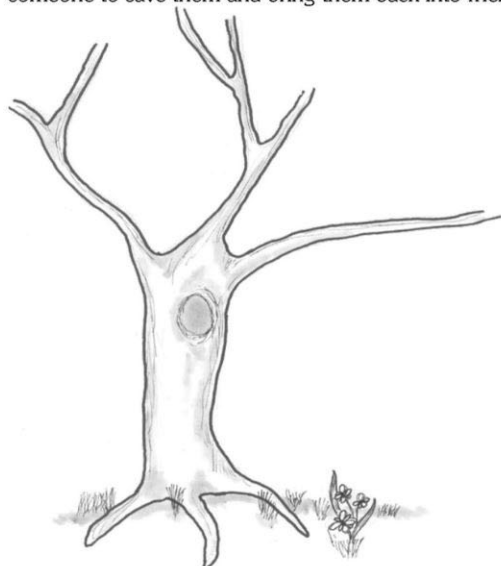

ADAM AND EVE


You may be familiar with the Gospel stories of Lent. Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we accompany Jesus into the desert, where he is tempted by Satan. On the second Sunday, in the account of the Transfiguration, Jesus is revealed in his glory before his passion. The stories of the woman at the well, the healing of the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus prepare us for the baptisms of the Easter Vigil with images of water, light, and new life. This year, let's take a closer look at the first readings, which give us some of our family history from the Old Testament. We will hear parts of these stories again at the Easter Vigil.

We begin with Adam and Eve in the second creation story (Genesis 2:7-9). Unlike Genesis 1, which describes the "days" of creation, this version tells us how God formed Adam from *adama*, the Hebrew word for ground, and created Eve, "the mother of all the living" (Genesis 3:20), to be his partner. God then placed them in a garden that had everything they needed, but they disobeyed God and had to leave paradise. God did not abandon them, but promised to send someone to save them and bring them back into friendship with God. That someone is Jesus.



At the Easter Vigil we will hear the story of creation to remind us that God loves us and gives us all we need. Complete this picture of a tree and make a beautiful garden of fruits and flowers around it. Draw Adam and Eve in the garden. Say a prayer thanking God for creating the world and all the people in it.
