

Second Sunday of Lent

Gospel Summary

The second Sunday of Lent always gives us an account of the transfiguration. Jesus asked Peter, James and John to go with him to the mountain top. While they were there, Jesus was transfigured and became dazzling white before them. Along with Jesus stood Moses and Elijah. The voice of God announced that Jesus was his son and that all should listen to him. The disciples were frightened, but Jesus calmed them. When Peter, James and John looked up, Jesus was the only one left . . . the one to whom we need to listen.

Reflection for Families

Children adapt to change. They love the excitement of something new. As parents, however, we'd like to slow down the changes we see - changes in our community, our jobs, government, and even the changes in our growing children. As it was for the disciples, it's hard sometimes for us to understand and accept things changing in front of our eyes. However, change and constant motion are part of the divine plan as we journey to God. Today, instead of digging in our heals to slow the change, try lightening your heart as a child and accept with joy, the changes you face.

Bringing the Gospel into your Family

Consider your community, family, relatives, and people at work or school. Who is struggling right now because of a recent change? How is this change darkening their world? Once you have identified the person (or people), think of one way as a family you can be a light to them. Our action is our response to listening to Jesus.

- I witnessed a kind of transfiguration when . . .

Our Fascinating Faith

The Scrutinies: The catechumens (now called "elect" during Lent) are preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil, they will celebrate the first of three scrutinies. These are rites integral to final Lenten preparations made by the elect, and they are celebrated on three successive Sundays, starting with the Third Sunday of Lent. The Church tells us that the scrutinies are meant to uncover and heal all that is weak and sinful in the lives of the elect. During the week leading up to each celebration, the elect engage in prayerful preparation involving deep reflection on their own lives and the new life to which they are called. The rites themselves use a special form of intercessions specifically directed to the lives of the elect, and include a prayer of exorcism. It is essential that these rites be celebrated in the midst of the community, so that the elect experience the support of the parish members on this profound journey of faith. But it is equally important that the parish members witness the growing faith of the elect so they may be inspired by it for their Lenten journey of reflection on their own baptism in preparation for Easter.








The doors open at 8:30 am to purchase homemade traditional St Joseph Table foods, breads and of course cookies.



ABRAHAM

This week we read about Abraham, our ancestor in faith. We just heard a small portion of a very long story about a man named Abram, whom God called from his home to become the father of many nations in lands that God would claim. God changed Abram's name to Abraham and made this promise: "I will bless you . . . and make your descendants as countless as the stars in the sky and the sands of the seashore" (Genesis 22:17). Christians, Jews, and Muslims all claim Abraham as an ancestor, fulfilling God's promise that "in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing" (Genesis 22:18).

At the Easter Vigil we will hear a part of the Abraham story, reminding us that, like Abraham, if we put our trust in God we will be richly blessed.
